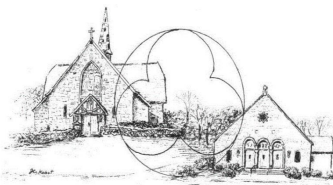

GOSPEL READING

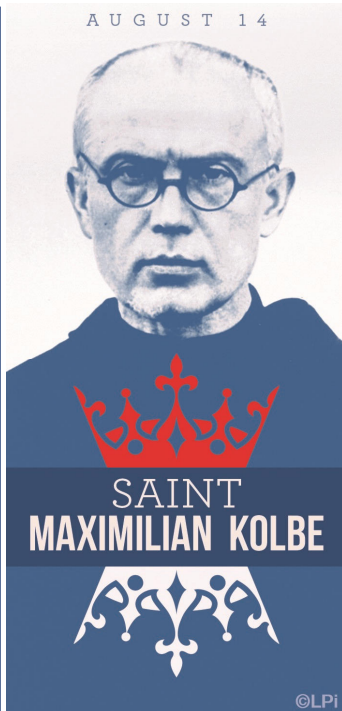

S. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE

Born: January 8, 1894
Zduńska, Poland
Died: August 14, 1941
Oswiecim, Poland

Maximilian Maria Kolbe was a Polish Catholic priest and Conventual Franciscan friar who volunteered to die in place of a Jewish stranger, a man with a family, in the concentration camp in Auschwitz, in German-occupied Poland during World War II.

Kolbe was beatified by Paul VI on October 17, 1971. On October 10, 1982, John Paul II canonized him, declaring him a martyr of charity and "The Patron Saint of Our Difficult Century."

Inspiration for the Week

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its Divine spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we really allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all of our relationships: with God, others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.

S. JANE FRANCES DE CHANTAL (1572—1641)

Jane Frances de Chantal was the foundress of the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary. The order accepted women who were rejected by other orders due to age or poor health. Compared with other cloistered orders that encouraged ascetic practices, the VHM was unusual in its public outreach. Jane is invoked as the patron of forgotten people, widows, and parents separated from their children.

Faith Formation registration for the 2021-2022 school year is now open. Parents can sign up their children for classes by completing the registration form available at the parish website:

<https://holytrinityquincy.com/>. Click on **Faith Formation** and select **2021-2022 Registration**. Please note that First Communion is a two-year program beginning in Grade 1. Confirmation is a two-year program beginning in Grade 9.

Subject to enrollment and teacher availability, classes will be held onsite (per guidance of state and local authorities) as follows:

Our Lady of Good Counsel

Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8

Sundays 9:15 - 10:15 a.m. OLGC hall, two times a month

Grades 9, 10

Sundays 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. OLGC hall, two times a month

Grades 6, 7, 8

Tuesdays 6:30 - 7:30 p.m. OLGC hall, two times a month

Most Blessed Sacrament

Grades 1, 2, 3

Sundays 9:30 - 10:30 a.m. Aquinas hall, two times a month

GRADE 1 CCD TEACHER NEEDED FOR MBS

Classes meet 9:30—10:30 AM two Sundays a month from October to May. All teaching materials provided. Only requirement is that the teacher must be a practicing Catholic and willing to commit to teaching on Sunday mornings on the scheduled dates.
