

Peace be with you! The world is in great need of the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ. When enough people turn to the Prince of Peace, there will be peace. How do we get there? What is the way? In John's gospel, Jesus tells us, "I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Pope St. John Paul II told us wisely, *He must become Our Way*, *Our Truth, and Our Life*. 

PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR

THE 800TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE APPROVAL OF THE RULE OF SAINT FRANCIS

In 1223, St. Francis created the first nativity scene in Greccio, Italy, to marvel at the mystery of the Incarnation. On October 4 this year, many Catholics gathered at the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the approval of the Rule of St. Francis. As part of the celebration, the Conference of the Franciscan Family, which oversaw the gathering, announced that they were asking Pope Francis to grant an indulgence for any Catholic who prayed in front of a Nativity scene at a Franciscan church. The Pope accepted the request.

This Christmas season, Catholics can receive a plenary indulgence by praying in front of a nativity scene located in a Franciscan church. The indulgence will be available from December 8, 2023, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, through February 2, 2024, the Feast of the Presentation of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple. Those wishing to receive the indulgence must pray in front of a nativity scene at a Franciscan church.

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church that removes the temporal punishment due to sin. To receive this indulgence, one must have a detachment from all sin, including venial; receive the Holy Eucharist and the sacrament of Confession within 20 days of praying in front of a nativity scene in a Franciscan church. In addition, those attempting to receive the indulgence must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
