

NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

As we begin the third week of Lent, it is an appropriate time to reflect upon how our Lenten journey is going. Are we growing in our faith? Are we making any extra effort to pray more? To go to Mass more? To make personal sacrifices? To fast more? To be more mindful of the poor? And to turn away from sin and live the gospel more fully? Confession should be a part of our Lenten practices. Confessions are available every Saturday at Most Blessed Sacrament Church 3-4pm and every Wednesday at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church 7-8pm.

I think St. Theresa of Calcutta is a great intercessor and role model for us. One of my favorite quotes of hers is "If you can't feed the world, feed one person." We can change the world one person at a time. One act of kindness or charity changes the world. One word of encouragement can change a person's day and even their life. We are called to be sowers of good seed so that we can bear great fruit, now and in eternity.

On a separate note, you may have noticed that at MBS, the tabernacle is front and center and the priests and deacons sit off to the side as it should be. However, at OLGC the priests and deacons are elevated front and center and Jesus and the tabernacle are off to the side. It is my hope that by Easter we will be have the tabernacle moved up front and center at OLGC and the presider chairs off to the side.

Finally, Nate Campbell will be starting his Eagle Scout project at OLGC fixing a step garden on the east side of the church. If you would like to contribute to support the cost of the materials for the project, there will be an opportunity on our website under e-giving to donate. More information about the project will be forthcoming in the bulletin.
