To all the parishioners. Greetings and best wishes from the Archdiocese of Nyeri, Kenya. Through the Office of the Propagation of the Faith of the Archdiocese of Boston and the generosity of your Pastor, Fr. Martin Dzengeleski, we have been invited to come to preach in your parish. We have a lot of needs in our Archdiocese related to evangelization and the church's ministry of healing the sick and feeding the hungry.

Archbishop Anthony Muheria has identified a very urgent need in the Archdiocese of Nyeri and beyond. The need has to do with mental health of many young people who have been affected by abuse of alcohol and drugs. There has been an outbreak of this menace recently where so many young people's lives have been compromised by substance abuse. Many have dropped out of school. Most of those are no longer attending church. There have been many cases of suicides and violence due to this menace. The Archbishop would like to open a rehabilitation center where those who are affected can be offered treatment and guidance. The archbishop also wants to develop means of fighting the menace such as outreach projects to the young people. Education in villages in form of small Christian community gatherings where seminars would be given to village elders, parents and businesspeople. Such would be expected to work with the church and the government to fight the evils of illicit brew which is mostly mixed with addicting substances that lead people to addictions and dependence.

Addiction to drugs and alcohol is frustrating the efforts in fighting HIV/AIDS. The same project will be incorporated to the long-standing project against HIV/ AIDS.

Money is required to put up structures for rehabilitation center and to support its viability including accommodations, food, medicine and personnel. A vehicle is needed to transport health workers and patients. More funds are required to buy educational materials and allowances for professionals even though we shall mostly rely on volunteers.

While our first commitment is evangelization, we realize that while offering the message of Our Lord Jesus Christ from the Gospel, we meet along the way those who are sick, needy and poor who still call to Son of David to have pity on them for a cure. It is for this reason that we come to your church asking that you help us with funds to accomplish this most urgent and important project. Our Archdiocese is always growing among those who are evangelized and of course in population. Currently it is estimated to have about 600,000 Catholics in a population of 1,600,000. Since 1982 it has been divided twice with the births of Muranga and Nyahururu Dioceses. The growth and progress in the Archdiocese of Nyeri would not have been possible without the help of compassionate people like you, who heed to her call at the time of need. **Thank you** for your generosity toward our pressing need at this time.—Fr. Gabriel Muteru

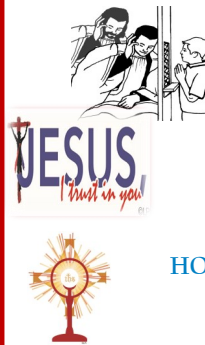

Next week our annual visit from the missions will take place. This year it is Fr. Gabriel Muteru representing the Kenyan mission. Thank you in advance for any support you can give them. I will take this opportunity to take a little time off. I will use the time to help my father with some yard work and visit a few friends.

A word of thanks to those who support our parish. Our numbers are very low, as you can see at the masses, but we are managing to pay our bills due to very generous parishioners. I remember when I was a child, my father was asked to help with an increase giving campaign in our parish, St. Clare's in Braintree, probably about 50 years ago. I still remember the theme of the campaign, Please give one hour of your pay to your church. They were asking that every parishioner of working age, work one hour per week for their parish. So whether it was \$5 or \$500 dollars, everyone was giving one hours work / pay to the parish. When you look at it that way it is not so much, one hour. I would like to promote a similar program here, though many of our people are retired and would have to use a different calculation.

It is great to be able to pay our bills, some parishes are unable to pay their bills and make their payroll. We have a bare minimum staff in order to stay sovent. Wouldn't it be nice if we could afford a parish secretary / office manager? Or Perhaps a youth minister / activities director? Or even a landscaper? We are surviving because we have some very dedicated volunteers who donate a lot of their time very generously.

If you have been thinking of volunteering, I could use help in the gardens at both churches. There is always weeding and watering to do. Send me an email with Volunteer in the heading: Fr.MartinHolyTrinityParish@gmail.com . I know I could do better at utilizing the people who have volunteered.

Maintaining the property is a priority for me, and we have accomplished a lot. We are blessed to have a rectory / office that can house three priests and an office with a meeting room. I have been very comfortable there and am grateful to the parish for this blessing. Some of the windows need to be replaced. Your generosity makes this possible, thank you.

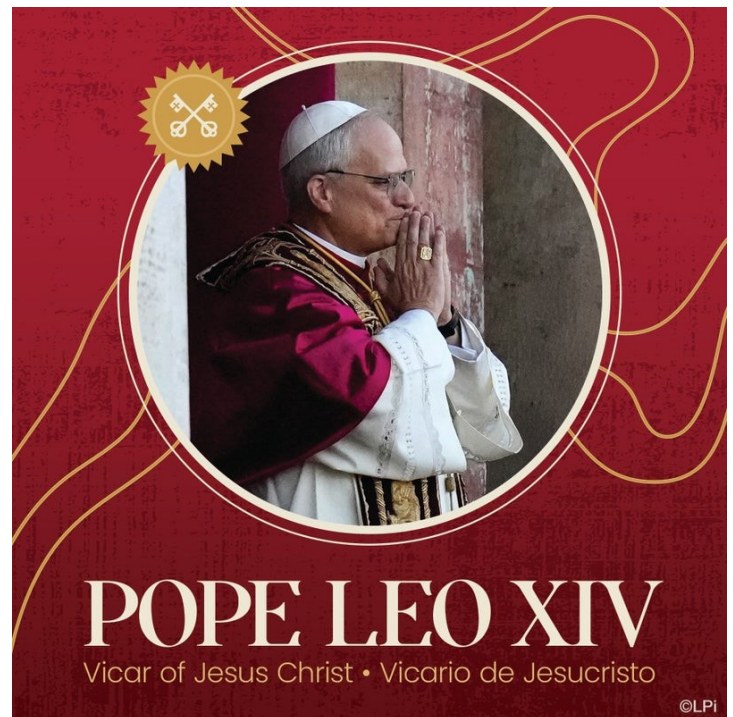
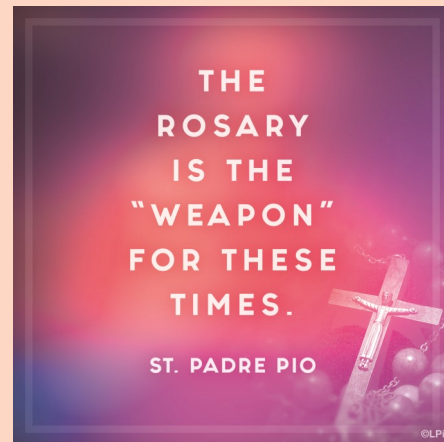
