



From the Pastor

Our gospel reading this weekend has two important themes: humility and charity. We all know that arrogant proud people are not as easy to get along with as are humble people. It is a virtue worth cultivating. In fact Jesus turns contemporary thinking upside down, saying: humble yourself and you will be exalted.
