



Note from the Pastor,

This weekend we come to the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of ordinary time. That is the time between liturgical seasons. We begin “ordinary” time with the beginning of Jesus’ public ministry. The thirty years prior to his baptism, are called the hidden years, when Jesus lived an ordinary life as part of a family obedient to his parents. At the age of thirty, the traditional age to be a teacher or Rabbi, Jesus came to John the Baptist in the desert and it was revealed to John by the Holy Spirit that Jesus was the one of whom he had been preparing the way as a voice calling out in the desert.

Jesus makes the waters of baptism holy by his baptism and starts his ministry by calling together his twelve apostles. We begin our Christian life at our baptism, when the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in us and we are made holy by the cleansing waters of baptism. We receive a permanent character or seal upon our souls, marking us for Christ, cleansing us of original sin and any personal sin should we be old enough to have sinned. Jesus knew that we would need to be cleansed of sin after baptism and so He also gave us the sacrament of reconciliation or penance, when he told his disciples, his first priests, whose sins you forgive, shall be forgiven them. It is not the priest who forgives sins, but Christ himself through the instrument of his priests. Why not cleanse yourselves of all sin and become a new creation through this powerful sacrament. We all need a spiritual bath to rid ourselves of the sin that accumulates on our souls bringing us down spiritually. Confession restores us and brings us closer to our Lord and the gift of eternal salvation. +

The Baptism of the Lord

“You are my beloved... with whom I am well pleased.”

At Jesus’ baptism, the Spirit of God rested upon him, affirming that he was the Chosen One and revealing that the path before him—the path foretold by Isaiah—would ultimately lead to the cross. At your baptism, you too were anointed with the Spirit, called and chosen to walk in the footsteps of Christ. This week, take time to reflect on the deep meaning of your baptism. Take comfort that the grace poured into your life that day—is the grace that will continue to strengthen, guide, and sustain you as you follow Christ’s way.
