

However, as space is limited, planning farther ahead makes it much more likely that preferred dates are available. Additional time also is needed to plan extra rites or blessings or to schedule special liturgical ministers.

LOW GLUTEN HOSTS

If you need a low-gluten host, please arrive for Mass a few minutes early to tell the sacristan, who will be wearing a name badge and who will be getting things ready for Mass in the narthex, sacristy or reception room. The sacristan will then have a low-gluten host taken up to the altar for you during the offertory procession.

Those receiving low-gluten hosts should be the first in line to receive Communion from Father on the west side of the center aisle. Since we now process from the front of the nave, you may sit in the front pew on that side of the center aisle and you will naturally be first in line. If you prefer to sit elsewhere, please accompany the usher who will guide the communicants on that side of the aisle and then go to the front of the line just before the parishioners who are in the first pew.




