





A SAFETY REMINDER

How to report an incident of sexual abuse of a minor.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse by a person working for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as a priest, deacon, sister, brother, lay officer, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:

Call the Office of the Vicar General: 800-942-2397 or the Office of Assistance Ministry: 800-533-7018 for the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

Compose, in writing, a detailed description of the facts/incidents of the abuse and send it, as soon as possible, to:

47901.

Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.


