

REFLECTIONS ON THE 27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Gospels over the last several weeks are from Matthew. It is no surprise that St. Matthew, a former tax or customs collector, writes about money or matters to do with money. It was his "first career" and something he knows well.

He also knows hearts well, and I am particularly grateful for his understanding. Of all the stories, incidents, and occasions with Our Lord, St. Matthew chose to write about parables that deal with money, labor, and justice. He had to know that these issues are never far from our hearts, and as such, they compete with Jesus inside our souls for attention.

Today's Gospel might give us the impression that the fruits we bear happen in the future. However, the fruit of the vine happens here and now within our liturgy.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you:

fruit of the vine and work of human hands, It will become our spiritual drink.

In our liturgy today and every time we celebrate the Eucharist, God gives us opportunity to focus our works for His glory. In this simple little prayer, we have a chance to realign ourselves and our labors for Jesus. He will take our earnest and sincere prayer, and He will do amazing deeds with it.

Propers:

Prescribed texts for that particular day, feast, or Sunday in the Liturgical Year

Music within the Mass: Entrance Chant (Introit); Psalm; Communion Antiphon.

Responses and Acclamations:

Responses typically spoken or sung during the Mass, regardless of season

Music within the Mass: Gospel Acclamation; Memorial Acclamation; Amen.


