



The Red Mass is a tradition in the Catholic Church which dates back to the 13th century. The first Red Mass is believed to have been celebrated in the Cathedral of Paris in 1245, and thereafter the tradition spread throughout Europe.

The word "red" was originally used to describe the Mass in 1310, because the justices of the English Supreme Court wore scarlet robes. Over time the "Red" Mass came to have a deeper theological meaning, with red symbolizing the "tongues of fire" that descended upon the Apostles at Pentecost bestowing the gifts of the Spirit.

LITURGY AND LIFE

Anyone driving the roads around the Indianapolis area this summer have experienced unseemly unprecedented road construction. Every other week, one section of interstate closes as another reopens. And then the cycle repeats. Getting lost is now much easier when encountering the detours. Don't get me wrong; for as much driving as I do, new road surfaces are much welcomed. I am grateful for the "map apps" on my mobile phone that continually search for the best way to my destination.

The Gospel today has three parables that Jesus tells the Pharisees and scribes. They complain that Jesus welcomes and eats with sinners. Each one is about someone searching for something precious that has been lost. The shepherd searching for the lost sheep, the widow searching for the lost coin, and the Prodigal Son searching for his lost way back to his father.

Parables are stories with many possible meanings. The early Christians would have understood that the Prodigal Son represents the Gentiles, and the older brother, the observant Jews. The father represents God the Father who shows abundant mercy to his wayward son and empathy to his faithful, albeit angry, son.

Faith is a precious gift from God that we sometimes lose in our pilgrimage through life. Perhaps there are those who were never taught the commandments that are searching for faith. Maybe some of us turned away from faith in God, lured by the ways of the world. Regardless, we have to do the searching to find our faith which shows us the way to the Father. And once faith is found, we hold onto it tightly by practicing our Catholic faith.

Last Sunday, the process we call the Rites of Christian Initiation resumed at Saint Alphonsus with a total of eight people in search of faith in God within the Catholic Church. These ancient rites celebrate key milestones in the faith journey of our newly found brothers and sisters. But they do not travel alone. All of us, the entire parish, walk with them. Not only will they learn from us, but we will learn from them as we journey together.

The "map app" God gives us is his Word and Sacrament. It is this grace that guides our navigation through life, searching to find our final destination - the New Jerusalem.

On **Sunday**, **Sept. 29**, Pat will present Confirmation and Gifts of the Holy Spirit, aimed


at youth ministry students and parents.
