St. Tarcisius (263-275) was a 12-year-old boy who lived in third century Rome. Although what is known of him is legend, taken from a poem written by Pope Damasus, he is still considered a Catholic martyr for protecting the Eucharist from desecration with his life.

According to legend, Tarcisius served as an acolyte. One of his duties was to visit Christians imprisoned for their beliefs, bringing them the Eucharist.

One day, as Tarcisius was on his way to the prison, carrying the consecrated Host from a secret underground Mass to those in need, he was confronted by a group of boys who demanded to know what he was carrying. Realizing the sacredness of his mission, Tarcisius refused to reveal the contents of his pouch, even in the face of the group's threats of violence. Subsequently, the boys beat him and stoned him to death as he protected the Body of Christ.

St. Tarcisius' sacrifice serves as a powerful reminder of the immense value of the Eucharist and how important it is to serve those who desire to receive Christ. His story also speaks to the value of the Church's youth. He is the patron saint of altar servers and first communicants.

In 2010, at the end of a general audience dedicated to altar servers, Pope Benedict XVI blessed a 16-foot statue of St. Tarcisius in St. Peter's Square. The event was attended by over 50,000 altar servers from around the world!

JANUARY: THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS

Everything about our divine Lord is holy, including His Name. It was the Archangel Gabriel who first spoke the name of Jesus to His mother, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus" (Luke 1:31). The Archangel was a messenger; the name of Jesus was given to Him by our Father in Heaven.

St. Peter was one of the first Apostles to speak with authority in the Holy Name of Jesus when he healed a crippled man saying, "I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk" (Acts 3:6). St. Paul also exalted the name of Jesus when he said, "...at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9–10). St. Paul preached with power in the name of Jesus so often that even some itinerant Jewish exorcists tried to imitate him by commanding demons, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul preaches" (Acts 19:13).

Throughout the history of the Church, Jesus' name has been invoked as an instrument of personal faith in the Son of God, especially to command demons or simply to pray to Jesus in a repetitive and personal way. The liturgical Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus has been celebrated for many centuries, especially within various religious orders. In the fifteenth century, St. Bernardine of Siena, a Franciscan friar, went on a preaching mission promoting devotion to the Most Holy Name. He encouraged people to revere Jesus' name by placing the first three Greek letters of His name on their doors: IHS. Today, this monogram of Jesus' name is commonly seen in churches on tabernacles, altars, and in stained glass windows. In the sixteenth century, St. Ignatius of Loyola had such a strong devotion to the Most Holy Name of Jesus that he adopted it as his seal as the general of his newly founded order of the Jesuits. The monogram remains the Jesuits' official seal today. Various promises of graces have been associated with this devotion, including: family peace, enlightenment, consolation, accompaniment, defense in spiritual battles, protection, and assistance at the hour of death.

There is power in the name of Jesus. Repeating His name prayerfully or speaking it aloud brings Him close and gives you strength, provided you recite His name in faith. The name of Jesus casts out fear, arouses trust, and unites your heart to His. Sadly, the Most Holy Name of Jesus is so holy that the evil one tempts people to invoke it as a curse when angry.

Any time you feel anxious or fearful, speak the name of Jesus. Know and believe that the divine name of our Lord brings Him close to you and bestows His grace in abundance.


PRAYER TO THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS





(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC "STEP INTO THE LIGHT"

How strange it is to think that if not for Herod's directions, the magi would not have known where to find Jesus. They were not Jews, they knew nothing of the old prophecies. It was Herod who convened the scholars. It was Herod who pointed the way — for ulterior motives, certainly, but nonetheless, this is the part he played. It was Herod who made the Epiphany possible.


"Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance," writes the prophet (Isaiah 60:3). A king may keep to the shadows, suspicious of the light — he may foolishly imagine he can snatch it from the sky to keep as his own possession, and, upon finding the light cannot be governed, grow to loathe it, and even seek to extinguish it once and for all.

But all his grand designs will come to nothing because there is no king so powerful that he can see in the dark. And even a man like Herod — a man so jealous that he sought to kill God — cannot prevent the breaking of day.

The Epiphany marks the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is a celebration of truth reaching places it was not expected to reach, of brightness illuminating corners of the world long ago consigned to shadow. It is a reminder that the battle has already been won, the night is over. All that remains is for us to decide: will we step into the light?

WINTER WEATHER CLOSURES

When the sheriff of Boone County or the Police Chief of the City of Zionsville declares a "Snow Emergency", weekend Masses at St. Alphonsus Liguori Catholic Church are cancelled, as are ALL other parochial events that weekend.

On the occasion of weather related events that close schools and/or roads, the Episcopal policy is the guide for the following:

A. Offices are closed when the civil government (Sheriff) announces emergency measures and road closures in the county. All employees, including custodial/ministry

positions, will not report to work until the civil emergency is lifted. All activities sponsored by the parish will be cancelled.

The respective professional ministers have the responsibility to inform attendees of the closure; do not take anything for granted - use due diligence.

B. When Zionsville Community Schools are closed, our offices remain open for ordinary business. As travel home for some may become difficult and driving experience differs, individual ministers will determine whether they should remain. Hourly employees will clock out.
