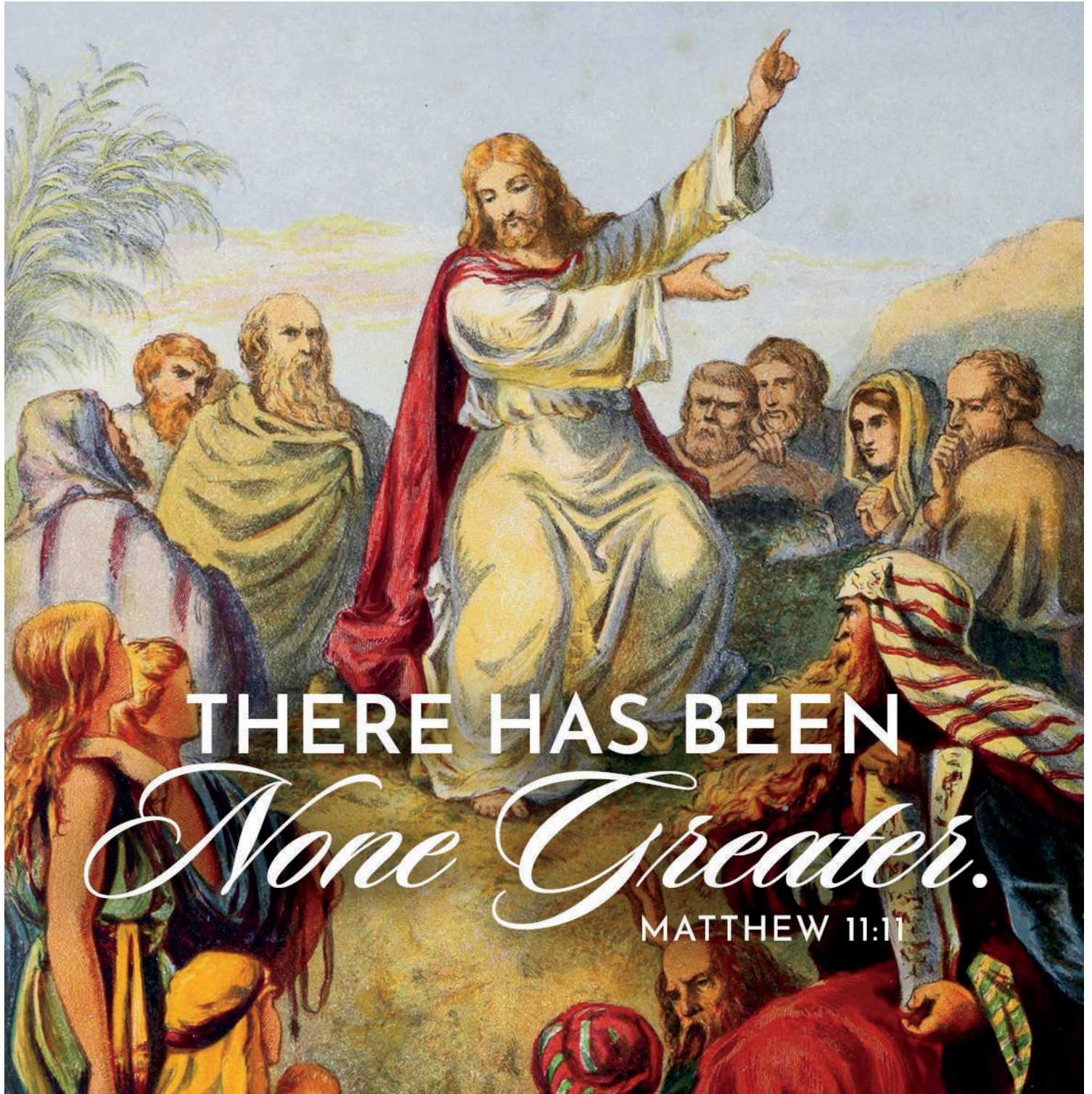

Clergy Corner

Faith and Culture!

In every mission land, the Gospel message is to take root in its natural culture, transforming it within, without necessarily replacing it, so that the people and their culture are seen as nothing but profoundly Christian. Faith, catechesis and evangelization in general, are called to bring the power of the Gospel into the very heart of the culture and cultural values.

For this reason, catechesis will seek to know these cultures and their value orientations, and their essential components. It will learn their most significant expressions and respect their values and riches.

For the Gospel to survive the vicissitudes of history, certain things must be emphasized in the encounter between faith and culture: 1) That the power of the Gospel everywhere transforms and regenerates cultural values and its riches; 2) That when the power of the Gospel enters a culture, it is not surprising that it rectifies many of

its elements. **There would be no catechesis if it were the Gospel that had to change when it encountered cultures.** To forget this will amount to “emptying the cross of Christ of its power,” says St. Paul [1 Cor.1:17].

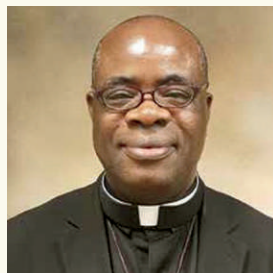
Vatican II gave us the counsel to “read the signs of the time.” This is not to be interpreted to mean: “see what is going on around you and become like that.”

No. The point is not to fall into the danger of accommodating those signs, but to read them in the light of the Gospel. When we read culture and its values through the Gospel lens, we find good things [values], but also lots of bad things.

Nota Bene: The culture is not the interpretative lens for the Church. It is rather Christ and His

Gospel values and principles and everything must be read through Him as the objective truth. The problem that produces benign Catholicism is attempting to read Christ from a standpoint outside of Himself.

Truth [Jn.14:6], is beyond culture, politics, scientism and any personal ideology.

St. John of the Cross (c1542 - 1591)

Feast Day: December 14

How beautiful the experience of love for God and neighbor, a fire deep within! How disheartening when love suddenly cools; and our souls grow dark, our prayer arid. How painful when misunderstanding, even rejection, comes our way, sometimes from those we least expect.

For all such “seasons of the soul,” an inspiring fellow-pilgrim is the poet and mystic, John of the Cross.

As a young Carmelite, John was recruited by Teresa of Avila for her Discalced (“barefoot,” evangelical poverty) Carmelite reform, striving to renew the Church from within after the Protestant Reformation had led countless religious away.

John suffered unspeakably harsh abuse, even imprisonment, from friars who rejected this reform. Yet during these times of deepest suffering, John composed spiritual masterpieces that still guide souls to God, their titles reflecting his own painful yet ultimately victorious journey: from *The Dark Night of the Soul*, through *The Ascent of Mount Carmel*, to his *Spiritual Canticle* and *The Living Flame of Love*.

John summarized his spirituality simply: **“Put love where there is no love, and you will find love.”**

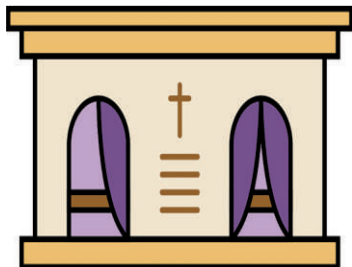

Stewardship Reflection



Good news, Christian stewards — we are gaining ground on our Advent mountain climb and it is time to take a moment to rejoice in the Good News that our Savior will come again in triumph one day. Today's readings on this Gaudete ("Rejoice") Sunday are filled with reminders of God's final victory over suffering and injustice, and encouragement to remain steadfast in our mission to live as faith-filled disciples.

Such a day almost seems too good to be true, especially when we look around at the dire circumstances we face in our world at present. But by faith, we know this day is coming. Lest we grow weary as we await the glorious day of Christ's return, St. James, in our second reading, offers wise counsel. "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord." "Make your hearts firm... Do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged."

This is excellent advice for us Christian stewards as we face the challenges of everyday life in our broken world, especially in the hectic days that precede Christmas when stress can make us and those around us less than our best selves. St. James reminds us that we can choose our response to both the great strains and the minor annoyances of life. In other words, we can be good stewards of our attitude, "making our hearts firm" by practicing patience with others and refusing to give in to the temptation to complain.

We can choose to see and rejoice in God's presence with us, no matter the circumstances surrounding us.

PARKING LOCATIONS

- * Sports Field Lot — across 950 E from the parish campus
- * Horse Barn Lot — directly north of the church building

New banners will clearly identify both lots.

HORSE BARN LOT DETAILS:

- *Parking on both sides of the gravel drive
 - *All vehicles park facing west
 - *Estimated capacity: 75–100 vehicles
- *A walkway now connects the horse barn lot to the main parking lot.

WEATHER CONSIDERATIONS

- *In heavy rain or snow, the horse barn lot may become inaccessible.
- *Expect to get wet if conditions are poor.
- *The Parking Team will direct traffic, as needed.

PARKING INSTRUCTIONS

- *Please follow all guidance from Parking Team members and officers.
 - *Volunteers will wear fluorescent vests and be strategically positioned for efficiency.
- Your patience and gratitude are appreciated!

Special Parking Notes

- *The lot behind Parish Hall/at the front of the All Souls Center is reserved for handicap parking only.
- *The entrance on 950 E (between Parish Office and Weitzel Hall) will be closed to traffic and used only for parking, as directed.
- *No parking on the north (back) side of the church for safety reasons.
- *No curbside parking unless instructed by the Parking Team.

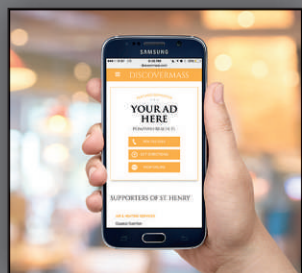

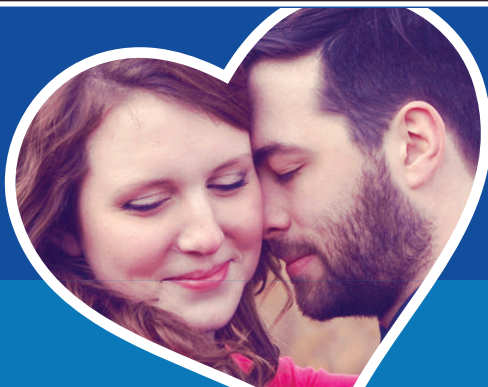
