



We as Catholic Christians are called to get to know Jesus and to love him in return, more and more. We are about to meet Him when God who



St. John of Kanty (1390 - 1473)

Feast Day: December 23

Also known as St. John Cantius, perhaps not many have heard of this saint. A native of Poland, as a young man John proved himself to be a bright student at the University of Krakow. He then went on to become a priest and professor but was later prevented from teaching by rivals and became a parish priest instead. Yet, difficulties found him there as well, in the form of personal fear and opposition by parishioners.

Those who took the time to get to know him were eventually won over by his humility and kindness. John eventually returned to Krakow to teach Scripture but led a sacrificial and austere life, keeping only the bare essentials and donating the rest to those in need. He slept little, ate little, and gave much.

St. John Kanty's life is a great example of focusing on the essential - Jesus - and pruning out the unnecessary. Lord, grant us the grace to be more humble, selfless, and kind.

Stewardship Reflection



As our Advent preparations end and Christmas fast approaches, it is fitting that today's readings demonstrate the intensity of the Father's perfect and passionate love for each of us, culminating in the gift of His own Son, Jesus Christ, on Christmas Day.

In response to such an overwhelming gift, what can we do except offer our lives as gift in return, embracing a stewardship way of life

with all the love and strength we have to give?

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, we find an unparalleled example of one who embraced this way of life in St. Joseph, as he obeys God's call to him through the message of an angel.

We never hear St. Joseph speak, but the Scriptures tell us he was always listening, attentive to the leading of the Holy Spirit for his family. It was Joseph who found the stable where the baby Jesus would be born. No doubt it was Joseph who cleaned it up and prepared it for Mary and Jesus since we know that Mary was about to give birth. Joseph protected the family, guarded them, and tended to their safety, their comfort, and their well-being at the expense of his own plans and preferences. Though we do not hear any words from St. Joseph his actions clearly show that he offered himself, his whole life, as a gift to his family through his strong guidance, protection, and service.

Let us imitate St. Joseph, then, as good stewards, giving our very lives to those around us in love and gratitude to God, who has given us everything we have, especially His own Son, Jesus Christ.

HORSE BARN LOT DETAILS:

*Parking on both sides of the gravel drive



Winter Weather Closures



When the sheriff of Boone County or the Police Chief of the City of Zionsville declares a "Snow Emergency," weekend Masses at St. Alphonsus Liguori Catholic Church are cancelled, as are ALL other parochial events that weekend.

On the occasion of weather-related events that close schools and/or roads, the episcopal policy is the guide for the following:

A. Offices are closed when the civil government (Sheriff) announces emergency measures and road closures in the county. All employees, including custodial/ministry positions, will not report to work until the civil emergency is lifted. All activities sponsored by the parish will be cancelled.

The respective professional ministers have the responsibility to inform attendees of the closure; do not take anything for granted - use due diligence.

B. When Zionsville Community Schools are closed, our offices remain open for ordinary business. As travel home for some may become difficult and driving experience differs, individual ministers will determine whether they should remain. Hourly employees will clock out.


