Clergy Corner

The Memorare

During the season of Advent we began praying the Memorare at the end of Mass. This is a powerful prayer of intercession that I hope parishioners will come to appreciate as we pray and learn it over the next couple of months. It is my hope to introduce parishioners to traditional prayers of the Church by interchanging various prayers throughout the year at the end of Mass.

The Memorare originated in the 15th Century and was popularized in France by Fr. Claude Bernard in the 17th Century. Francis de Sales credits this prayer with saving him from despair while ministering in Calvinist strongholds of France and Switzerland.


In 1846, Pope Pius IX imparted a partial indulgence to the praying of the Memorare.

When I was at Saint Maria Goretti, a priest gave a parish mission and relayed powerful and miraculous

events that he experienced while praying the Memorare with Saint Teresa of Calcutta. She advised that, in an emergency, one ought to devoutly pray the Memorare nine times. Once the prayer is granted, she advised praying the Memorare nine times in gratitude. This is sometimes called the *Flying Novena*. This devotion is one that I have adopted in my own spiritual life. May this beautiful prayer draw us all more deeply into confidence in God's mercy and love.

St. Thomas Becket (1118 - 1170)

Feast Day: December 29

To anyone who imagines conflict between religion and politics to be a modern phenomenon, history witnesses otherwise. Martyred under Henry VIII in 1535, Thomas More declared, "*I die the King's good servant, but God's first!*" Thomas Becket could have said the same four centuries earlier.

As Henry II's closest friend and trusted chancellor, Becket, the King presumed, could be counted on, if made Archbishop, to deliver the Church to royal control. But Becket experienced a profound conversion, confirmed by the ordination liturgy's rich symbolism of the bishop as Good Shepherd and the Church as Bride of Christ. Renouncing secular responsibilities, distributing his wealth to the poor, Thomas became the Church's uncompromising champion.

Faced with this "new" Becket, the King's previous friendship turned into a ferocious, almost irrational hatred. Becket was slain before the altar of Canterbury Cathedral by royal agents, neither the first nor last good shepherd to lay down his life as the price of freedom for Christ's Church and justice for Christ's sheep.

Stewardship Reflection: 12/28/2025



As we continue our celebration of the Christmas season, the feast of the Holy Family invites us to reflect on the gift and calling of family life. The Church calls the family the "domestic church," the place where our faith takes root — and where the stewardship virtue of hospitality begins.

Why is hospitality vital to family life? Because our homes should be a place of love, welcome, and restoration. We can't expect to grow in prayer, service, or faith if our home atmosphere is disconnected or tense. Though no family is perfect, we must intentionally create homes where everyone feels loved and valued.

Our readings offer practical wisdom. In the Book of Sirach, we hear about the blessings that come when children respect their parents — and when adult children lovingly care for their aging parents. Respect and tenderness build a home filled with unity and peace.

St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians offers even more insight. He reminds us that each family member is "God's chosen one," and urges us to "put on" compassion, kindness, humility, and patience — even when we may not feel like it. These small, daily acts of love foster true hospitality at home, which then extends to the wider community.

The Holy Family, too, knew hardship. As the Gospel reminds us, they faced danger, displacement, and uncertainty. Yet Mary and Joseph remained faithful, trusting in God's plan. They are powerful intercessors for our own families today.

On this feast, may we recommit to making our homes places of love and welcome. Let's honor God through the way we treat each other at home — with patience, forgiveness, and care.




