

ARE YOU MISSING CHRISTMAS?

Catholics!*

My Christmas decorations and lights stayed up until last weekend, and I was itching for someone to ask, "Don't you know Christmas is over?" to which I would've replied, "Oh yeah? Says who?" But I have really nice neighbors (or they just think I'm a bit of a slacker)! The Catholic Church established December 25 as the day to celebrate the Birth of Jesus. I don't hear a lot of people arguing about that, so, why not listen to that same Catholic Church, and celebrate Christmas until the Baptism of the Lord? I hope your Christmas Season was wonderful!

As Ordinary Time begins, Lent is just around the corner, starting with Ash Wednesday on February 18.

Until then, if you're longing for the joy of Christmas, you can find it any day in Eucharistic Adoration. During the Christmas Season we celebrate that Jesus came to us. He still does, in the Mass and in the Eucharist, which is consecrated at the Mass, wherein during Eucharistic Adoration, we can spread out the wonder of the Mass between Masses.

If you haven't been to our beautiful Adoration Chapel recently, then you are missing something. We wouldn't dare miss Christmas, so why miss Jesus when He waits patiently for us in the Adoration Chapel?

If you're unsure what to do, just enter the chapel, bless yourself with holy water, genuflect, take a seat, or kneel. Be still and listen to what your heart tells you to share with Jesus - thoughts of gratitude, your pains, and anxieties - whatever you would tell your best and most trusted friend. It's that easy.

Without Jesus, there is no Christmas. And without Eucharistic Adoration, we miss a substantial gift that He offers to us. The spirit of Christmas giving lives on.

St. Agnes (291 - 304)

Feast Day: January 21

St. Agnes was a young Roman girl who lived during the late third century, a time when being Christian was life-threatening. Though she was only about twelve or thirteen years old, Agnes was known for her deep faith, purity of heart, and courage. When a powerful Roman official sought her hand in marriage, she refused, saying she already belonged to Christ.

Agnes was arrested and threatened with death unless she renounced her faith. She calmly refused. According to tradition, she was subjected to public humiliation and suffering, yet God protected her. In the end, Agnes gave her life rather than deny Christ. Her name, which means "pure" and sounds like the Latin word for lamb, reflects both her innocence and her complete offering to God.

St. Agnes became one of the most beloved early martyrs of the Church. Today she is the patron saint of young girls, chastity, and those seeking to live faithfully and courageously in a difficult world.





Stewardship Reflection

Today's readings provide clear and inspiring reminders of the most fundamental aspect of our identity — that of servants of our most high and holy God, His modern-day disciples, and stewards.



John the Baptist recognized the holiness of Jesus and the response due to Him when he encountered Christ in person on the day they met at the Jordan River. His response, which we read in our Gospel passage from St. John was, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world... He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'"

What a powerful description of our Lord and the place He should rightfully have in each of our lives. He is truly our Savior, the only one who can free us from our sinfulness. We are utterly and completely dependent on His power, love, and mercy. Therefore, He truly does "rank ahead" of us; he deserves to be first, above all other priorities and plans in our lives. Let us examine our daily lives and encourage our children to do the same.

Does the way I spend my time reflect that God comes first? Do prayer and weekly Mass, regular confession, and time with my family "rank ahead" of everything else on my calendar? Do I use my talents, skills, and energy to serve my family, parish, and community in thanksgiving and recognition that God's kingdom ranks ahead of any other goals or ambitions? Do I spend my money and use my material possessions to glorify God?

Challenge questions, to be sure. But questions worthy of our high calling as Christian stewards offered a glorious mission in service of our Lord and His kingdom. What will our response be?

Job Opening Baptism Coordinator

St. Alphonsus Liguori Parish has a part-time Baptism Coordinator position available - up to 10 hours per week with some duties able to be completed remotely.

The Coordinator accompanies families in the preparation process to have their child(ren) received into the Church through the Sacrament of Baptism.

Communication with families, overseeing the preparation class, scheduling, collecting required documents, and setting up for the sacrament are expectations of the position.

The ideal candidate is organized, detail oriented, self-motivated, flexible, and enjoys working with parents seeking a sacramental life for their children.

Previous experience (paid or unpaid) with parish ministry is required and training will be provided.

Winter Weather Closures

When the sheriff of Boone County or the Police Chief of the City of Zionsville declares a "Snow Emergency," weekend Masses at St. Alphonsus Liguori Catholic Church are cancelled, as are ALL other parochial events that weekend.

On the occasion of weather-related events that close schools and/or roads, the episcopal policy is the guide for the following:

A. Offices are closed when the civil government (Sheriff) announces emergency measures and road closures in the county. All employees, including

custodial/ministry positions, will not report to work until the civil emergency is lifted. All activities sponsored by the parish will be cancelled.

B. The respective professional ministers have the responsibility to inform attendees of the closure; do not take anything for granted - use due diligence.

C. When Zionsville Community Schools are closed, our offices remain open for ordinary business. As travel home for some may become difficult and driving experience differs, individual ministers will determine whether they should remain. Hourly employees will clock out.

Protecting God's Children

As a community of faith, we are committed to safeguard our children and youth.

Thereafter, an investigation will be undertaken by or on behalf of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana.

If you or someone you know has been a victim of child sexual abuse in the past or present day by someone working in a parish or school for the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana (such as religious sister or brother, lay employee, lay volunteer, etc.) you are requested to report the incident in the following manner:




