

Clergy Corner

The Snare of the Devil!

Subtly Satan said to his followers, "We can't keep Christians from going to Church [Mass]. We can't keep them from intimate relationships with their savior. Once they gain that connection with Jesus, our power over them is broken. Let them continue going to their Masses, let them have their covered dish dinner [referring to the Eucharistic meal]. But let me propose what we can do to ensnare them."

Satan's proposal:


"Steal their time so they don't have time to develop an ongoing relationship with Jesus. Distract them from gaining hold of their Savior and maintaining that vital connection throughout the day." One of his followers asked him, "How can we achieve these?"

Satan listed these snares:

- Keep them busy in the non-essentials of life and create innumerable schemes to occupy their minds.
- Persuade moms to go to work for long hours and dads to work 6-7 days each week, 10-12 hours a day, to afford their empty lifestyles.
- Keep parents from spending time with their children; as families soon fragment, their homes will offer no escape from the treasure of work.
- Keep the TV, VCR, CDs, PCs on constantly in their homes, and see to it that every store and restaurant in the world, plays non-Biblical music constantly. That will fragment the families.
- Keep them busy, busy, busy, so that they return from their recreation exhausted and unable to pray.

All these snares will jam their minds and break the union with Christ.

Please note: God continues to search for us, but the devil tries always to prevent us from going out to meet Him. Christ continues to endear us. Waiting in His presence keeps us connected to Him. We must make our family and homes a domestic Church like the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. St. Agatha (c. 231 - 251)

Feast Day: February 5

"Of noble birth and great beauty," so the ancient accounts describe Saint Agatha, martyred during an early persecution for refusing a powerful Roman's offer of marriage, since she had consecrated her virginity to Christ. An early preacher, Saint Methodius, reflects instead on her name, noting that, in Greek, Agatha means "good," goodness being something we can all strive for, nobly born or common, blessed with beauty—or not!

So brutal were the tortures that violated her youthful innocence, Agatha, like Agnes and several other women martyrs, was honored from time immemorial by having her name inscribed in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I).

Long invoked as protector against earthquakes—Mount Etna erupted as she was being tortured—recent attention has focused on the particularly cruel torture decreed for Agatha, the cutting off of her breasts. This has inspired cancer survivors to promote Saint Agatha as patron and intercessor for women courageously facing breast cancer, for their families and...for the dedicated researchers who seek a cure.

- Sunday after 10:30 am Mass



Stewardship Reflection

The Gospel Reading for today is what is popularly called the Sermon on the Mount. Many think it is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. To be sure it tells us how we are to live our lives, the attitudes we are to have. We must remember that those who were waiting and hoping for the Messiah expected a military leader, one who would lead them in battle against their oppressors.



In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of who He is. He begins what we call the Beatitudes (the word means "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense we are all "poor in spirit." Without the guidance and strength provided us by the Lord there is no way we can escape this poverty of spirit, of spirituality, if you will.

That is why we often say that living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ translates into being a steward of our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. Those who followed Jesus and became the earliest Christians, the first members of the Church, were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. As stated, Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed.
