Clergy Corner

I love nature. I say this even though we are early in Lent and it's only the beginning of March, so nature is not so pretty out there right now. We have a way to go before the earth springs forth new life, but it is coming! I love nature to the extent that I prefer to plant trees and other plant life in my yard that occur here naturally. For example, I had to cut down a dead paper birch tree that a landscaper planted. That species is not indigenous to central Indiana, and it did not survive.

We can see how God, in His infinite wisdom, has a natural order of things in all areas of our existence. One that is of utmost importance is the realm of physical intimacy. The natural result of engaging in the marital embrace is the bonding that is realized and the possibility of new life. When we experiment with what is natural, that's when we get into trouble. Jesus goes so far as to say, "Everyone who looks at a woman with lust has

already committed adultery with her in his heart" (Mt 5:28). By the way, lust is one of the seven deadly sins. Ouch!

Following the laws of nature shows wisdom. Observing how our bodies are designed, male and female, we understand what God's intent was and is. And Jesus adds clarity to how we should respect our bodies and what they are capable of. This is why it was God's intention that the marital embrace be reserved for couples who are in the state of matrimony, so that if it is His will that a life is conceived, the child can be nurtured in a loving, committed relationship. It is the natural, beautiful way God intended for us to use the gift of our sexuality. It is orderly, and our God is a God of order.

This is what St. John Paul II entitled the Theology of the Body. If we all followed these laws of nature, our world would be more at peace. And peace is very, very natural...



St. Katharine Drexel (1858-1955)

FEAST DAY: MARCH 3



Born into Philadelphia society, Katharine was an infant when she lost her mother. Her father remarried, and the couple taught their daughters that their wealth was a "gift on loan" to be shared with the poor, whom they fed and cared for in their home. Invited by priest-friends to witness firsthand the destitution on Native American reservations, Katharine renounced a \$20 million-dollar fortune and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, adoring Christ in the Eucharist and ministering to Christ suffering in victims of racial discrimination. Her Sisters established more than 60 schools nationwide, including Xavier University, New Orleans, the first dedicated to professional education for African Americans. In 2000, John Paul II canonized "Mother Drexel," praising her "excellent example of practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, long the distinguishing mark of American Catholics."



Archbishop Fulton Sheen to Be Beatified


