



Clergy Corner: Holy Week and the Paschal Mystery

Preceding Holy Week (Passover Week) was the miracle of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. This caused envy among the Scribes and the Pharisees. “The whole world has gone after Him” (Jn 12:19), yet Jesus still resolutely determined to go to Jerusalem for the Passover. He knew what awaited Him, but He didn’t hesitate. It is this triumphant entry into Jerusalem that we commemorate on **Palm Sunday**. (Mt 21 :1-11; Mk 11: 1-11; Lk 19:28-40; Jn 12: 12-19).


Holy Week activities begin with the Palm Sunday Liturgy where we read the story of the Lord’s Passion as we accompany Him in His Passion and Death and share fully in His Resurrection. Jesus’ “resolve and determination” challenge us to reflect on what our major life decisions and resolutions are in following Jesus. These may include how to live our vocations more fully, how to approach our life of prayer, how to approach our relationship with God and with others, etc. Lent is an ideal time to make these resolutions and reflect upon the ultimate purpose of life.

Within Holy Week, we have the three holiest days in the Church’s liturgical calendar called the **Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday**. Events leading up to Holy Thursday, are the Cleansing of the Temple (Mk 11: 15-19), the seven woes rebuke of the Scribes and Pharisees (Mt 23:13-36), confrontations (Mk 12: 13-34), the plot to betray, and Passover preparations (Mt 26:14-19). Holy Week was a mix of emotions.

Holy Thursday (Jn 13: 1-30; Mt 26:17-30)

This Last Supper liturgy offers three things:

- 1) Jesus washes the feet of the disciples, symbolizing His humility and act of purification of their souls to receive the first Eucharist, so they are in a state of grace before communion.
- 2) The mystery of evil: Judas betrayed Jesus.
- 3) The Institution of the Most Holy Eucharist: Jesus’ act of love as He incarnates Himself in the bread and wine where He resides sacramentally with the entire substance of His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. So we worship and adore His Real Presence in the Eucharist.



Good Friday: The Crucifixion

Jesus’ crucifixion offers us three things on which to focus:

- 1) Tearing of the veil in the temple: This demonstrates God the Father’s presence at the death of His Son on the Cross. We must tear our hearts of sorrow in the presence of sin. We can now enter with Christ, the High Priest, into the Holy of Holies.
- 2) His pierced Heart: The veil of His sacred flesh was also pierced, and water and blood gushed forth. This symbolizes the “grace” and “mercy” of His saving sacrifice, which the Church interprets as the sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist: the channels of His grace in our world. This is the reason we call it “Good Friday” instead of “evil” or “death Friday.” During Holy Week, the Church administers baptism to catechumens and the Eucharist to candidates and the newly baptized.
- 3) Confession of faith: The centurion who guarded the body of Jesus said, “He is truly the Son of God.” This is understood as “a gift of divine light, a gift of faith.” It is the faith that the catechumens and candidates have appropriated.

Holy Saturday Vigil Mass

This is the mother of all vigils in the Catholic Christian faith when the Church commemorates the fact that Life triumphed over death. As a result, Christ is able to say: “I am the Resurrection and the Life” (Jn 11:25).







Easter Mass Parking Details



Because Easter Masses are some of the busiest of the year, here are some helpful hints for parking:

- Please arrive early and be patient. Parking will be difficult due to our parish’s growth.
- Overflow Handicap Parking: Sixteen additional spaces will be available in the parking lot adjacent to the All Souls Center, which is southwest of the main entrance to the church.
- Fire Lanes: **No parking** directly behind the northside of the church in the fire lanes. **THIS IS A SAFETY CONCERN** in the event of a fire.
- Sports Field Parking Lot: If you park here, please use caution crossing the street before and after Mass.
- Primary overflow regular parking is in the **Medical Building Parking Lot** to the east of the church grounds. Please use the sidewalk on Oak Street to walk to the church.
- Additional overflow parking, weather permitting, will be the **Grass Lot** north of the church. Please follow directions from parking volunteers.






