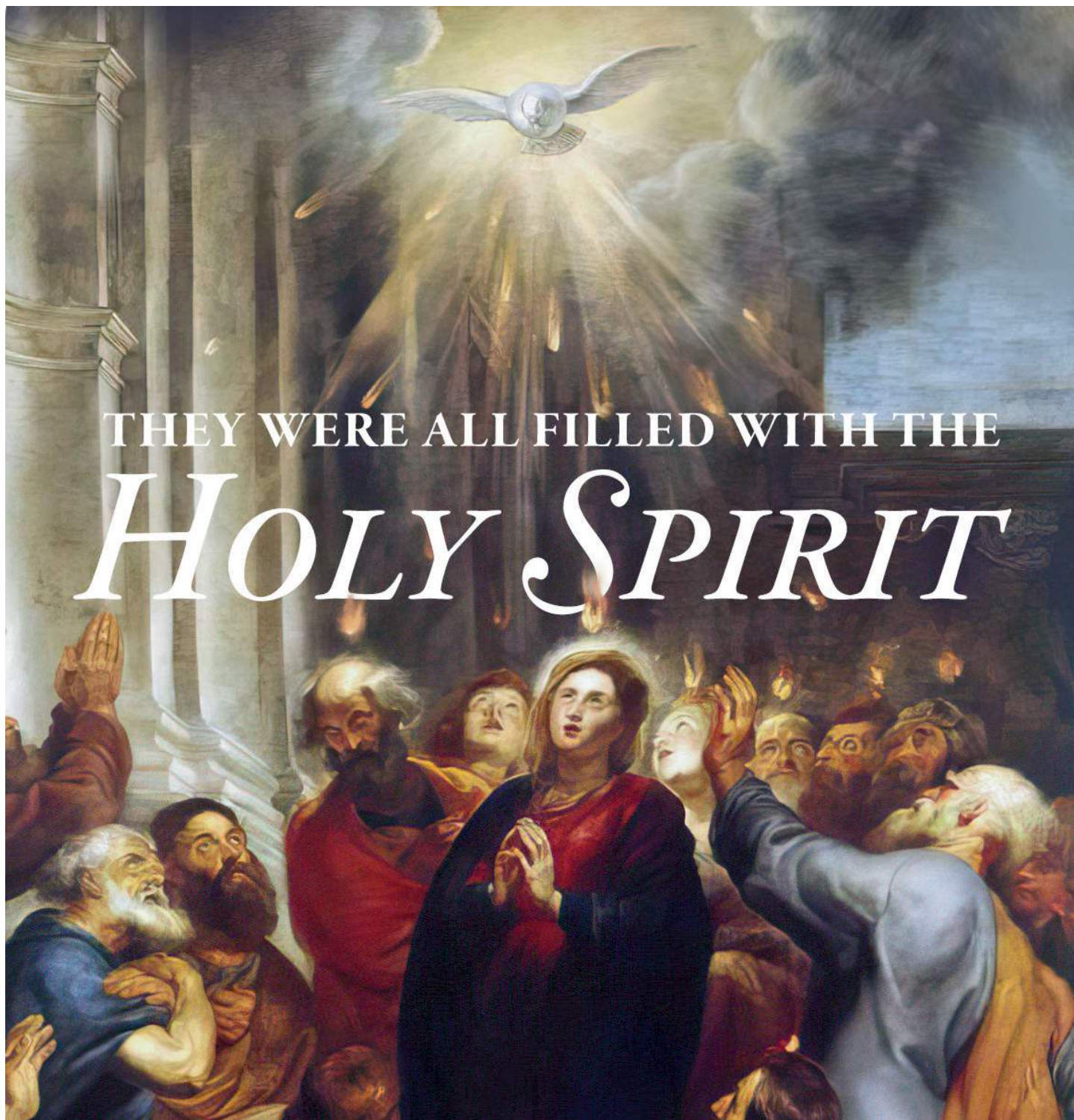

St. Philip Neri

FEAST DAY: MAY 26

Known as the "Apostle of Rome," Philip Neri was a priest who lived between 1515-1595. Neri was responsible for helping to reform and re-evangelize Rome, the Eternal City. He founded his own oratory outside of the city, which Doctor of the Church St. John Henry Newman would join in the 19th Century.

Neri, like Padre Pio, had the ability to "read people's hearts" in the confessional, which resulted in crowds flocking to him to hear their confession.

He had many mystical experiences, including on the eve of **Pentecost** in 1544. Then, a ball of fire entered his mouth, sending him into ecstasy where he exclaimed, "Enough, enough, Lord! I can bear no more!" The fire left a lump on his chest, which sometimes seemed to burn. He often fell into ecstasy while celebrating Mass. Learn more about St. Philip Neri at

Clergy Corner: Mass on a Rock

I recently returned from a pilgrimage to Ireland led by our former Pastor Fr. O'Keeffe. I was accompanied by a number of other members of this parish, along with members of other parishes in our diocese where Fr. O'Keeffe has been assigned. It was an amazing pilgrimage on so many levels: historical, spiritual, natural beauty, cultural, etc.

The experience which was most moving was "Mass on a Rock." It sounds odd, but a little more than 100 years ago, celebrating Mass was illegal during the Penal Law period, so priests and the faithful, undaunted, would find rocks or small boulders deep in wooded areas to serve as altars and spaces of worship, turning these areas into holy ground. Some of the faithful would hide in the trees during the Mass for fear of being caught and executed.

For our experience of this, we walked from a tiny parking area down a beautiful, wooded path in an opening in the woods to a Mass Rock that had been used during those dark times. Fr. O'Keeffe brought a special altar cloth for the occasion which had a relic sown into it along with the usual sacred vessels, unconsecrated hosts and wine. There were no pews, true to earlier times, so we all stood on the forest floor for the entire Mass.



Just imagine on this beautiful day in this sacred setting, the birds chirping, the sound of the brook on the edge of this sacred space, hearing the words of consecration as the Creator becomes truly present in His awesome creation. Just imagine the risk the faithful took to worship the Lord and to receive Him. What love and devotion!

This was a period in Church history that has been repeated on some level around the world, and there are people today who still risk their lives to receive Jesus during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. On this Pentecost Sunday, when we recall the power of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church, and in this country where on this Memorial Day we celebrate freedom that was not free, let us praise God for all He has done for us and pray for all who make our Catholic lives possible.

Living Generously Reflection

Gratitude adds another important layer to the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. It shapes why and how those acts are done. **If generosity is what moves you to give, gratitude is what keeps that giving grounded and sincere.**

Corporal Works of Mercy (gratitude in what you give)

When you feed the hungry or help someone in need, gratitude reminds you that what you have isn't something to take for granted.

Instead of thinking, "I'm helping because I have more," gratitude shifts the mindset to:

- Recognizing your own blessings (food, shelter, security)
- Realizing those blessings could just as easily be lacking
- Giving with humility, not superiority

In the spirit of teachings like the Gospel of Matthew, gratitude keeps these acts from becoming prideful. You're not just giving; you're sharing what you've been fortunate to receive.

Spiritual Works of Mercy (gratitude in how you treat others)

Gratitude also affects how you relate to people internally:

- You're more patient, because you appreciate the patience others have shown you
- You forgive more readily, because you're grateful for forgiveness you've received
- You listen and comfort others, because you value the times someone did that for you

This kind of gratitude makes spiritual works feel authentic rather than forced, softening your approach and building empathy.

The deeper role of gratitude:

- Keeps generosity from turning into ego or obligation
- Builds humility: you recognize you're not above others
- Deepens compassion by helping you see shared human vulnerability
- Turns mercy into a response to blessings, not just a rule to follow

- Gratitude says, "I remember what I've been given."

The peony is widely known as the **Pentecost Rose** due to the fact that peonies burst forth into explosive, flame-like blooms in late spring, perfectly aligning with the **Feast of Pentecost**. Like the explosion of God's love through His sending of the Holy Spirit, the peony teems with color and vibrant blossoms.



While they are frequently pink, we chose orange for our narthex Pentecost display to align with the color of fire, one of the symbols of the Holy Spirit.

Peonies are the perfect flower for May, the month of Mary. Place them on your home altar or Marian shrine. Perhaps now, every time you see a peony, you will think of the Holy Spirit and thank God for sending Him down upon us!

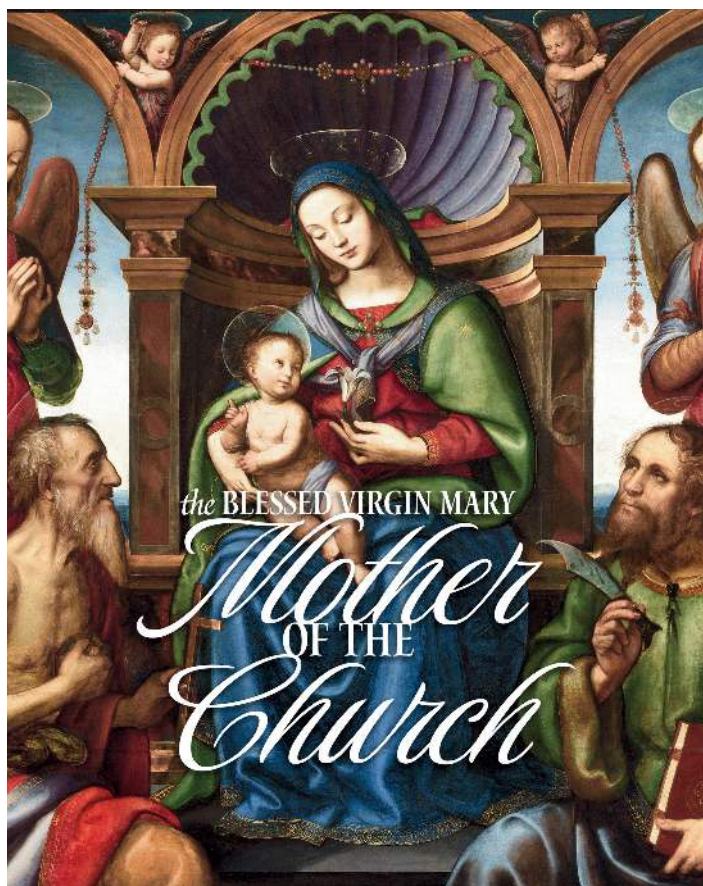

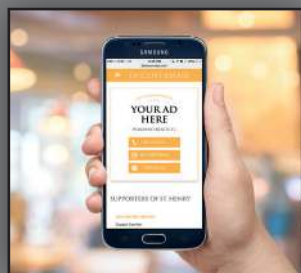

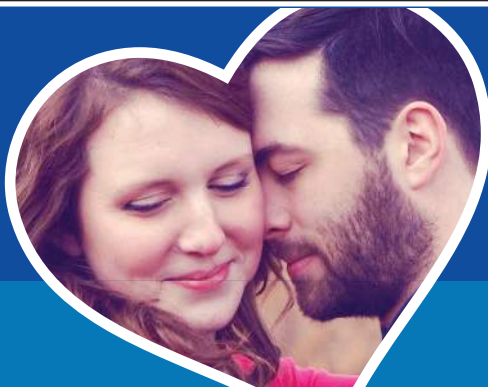
