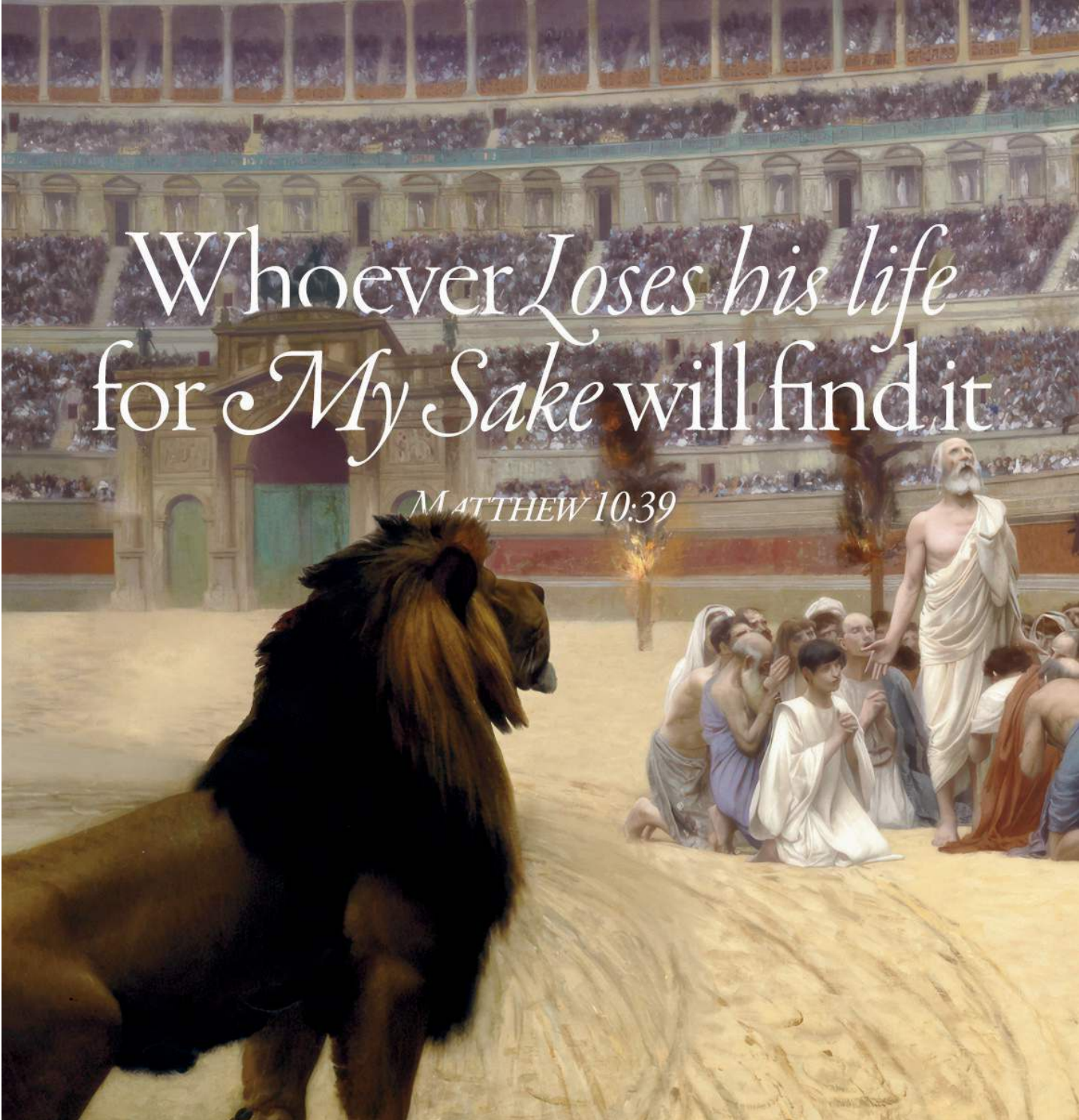

St. Irenaeus of Lyon Father of the Church

FEAST DAY: JUNE 28
SECOND CENTURY

Born in Asia, St. Irenaeus of Lyon is known as a Father of the Church. He was the Bishop of Lyon and knew St. Polycarp, who was a disciple of John, the Apostle.

His most famous work is titled "Against Heresies," which he wrote condemning the heresy of Gnosticism. As he refutes the heresy, he explains the origin of John's Gospel and confirms early Christian belief in the Eucharist, as well as the primacy of the Roman Church.

St. Irenaeus also explains which of the Gospels are canonical and details who wrote each one. He writes that Luke was a companion to Paul and that Mark was a disciple of Peter.

Editor's Corner: The Paradoxes of Christianity



I recently decided to read GK Chesterton's "Orthodoxy," a book I've often heard about but one I've been a bit afraid to tackle. But I'm glad I did! While Chesterton can be a difficult read, he is both profound and witty.

"Orthodoxy" is famous for Chesterton's explanation of the many paradoxes of Christianity. For example, God is both three (the Trinity) and one; God is all-powerful yet experienced human weakness in Christ; it is in our weakness that we are made strong (St. Paul), etc. Christianity does not teach that we should try to find the "mean" between any of these two extremes, but rather that we learn to hold both extremes at the same time in tension.

I heard someone explain that Jesus, who is the "cornerstone" (think of the keystone piece in an architectural arch), is a good example of this. He holds two sides together in "tension," keeping the whole thing from falling apart. Heresy (teaching that contradicts the doctrine of the Church) is often holding too tightly to one extreme without acknowledging the other.



In this week's Gospel, we hear "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." How can that be? It seems to be a paradox. Regarding this verse, Chesterton relates it to courage, which he says is "a strong desire to live taking the form of a readiness to die." The martyrs are a good example of such courage. It's both a total loving of life and, at the same time, a complete willingness to let it go. It's only in being willing to give up your life that you often save it.

He uses the example of a soldier on a battlefield surrounded by enemies on all sides. The only way for the soldier to save his life is to risk it by pushing through the enemies around him. Cowardice is clinging to life so much that that you're too afraid to risk it, which, in the soldier's case, will likely result in death; foolhardiness is not valuing your life enough and charging ahead with surety of death.

What Christianity offers as the answer, instead, is loving your life so much that you're willing to risk it: to die for the sake of living. Two extremes held together in tension just like the cornerstone.

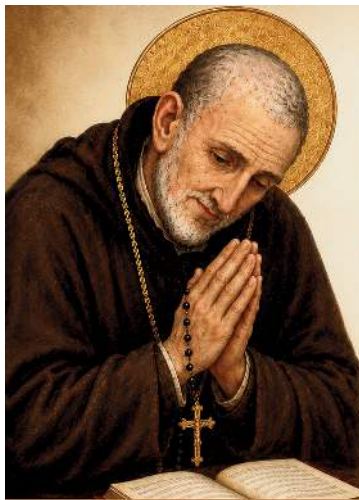


EMILY MEINER, ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ADULT AND YOUNG ADULT FORMATION

The Church is currently celebrating "Ordinary Time" within the liturgical calendar. This period lasts about **six months** after Easter and resumes between Christmas and Lent.

The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time take us through the **life of Christ**. This is the time of **conversion**. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a **time for growth and maturation**, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the **Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**.

Marriage

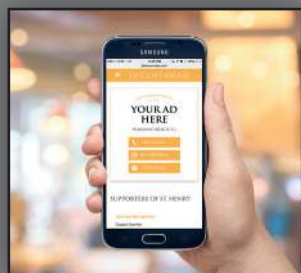

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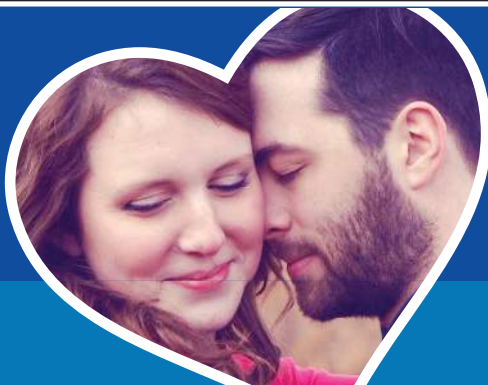
