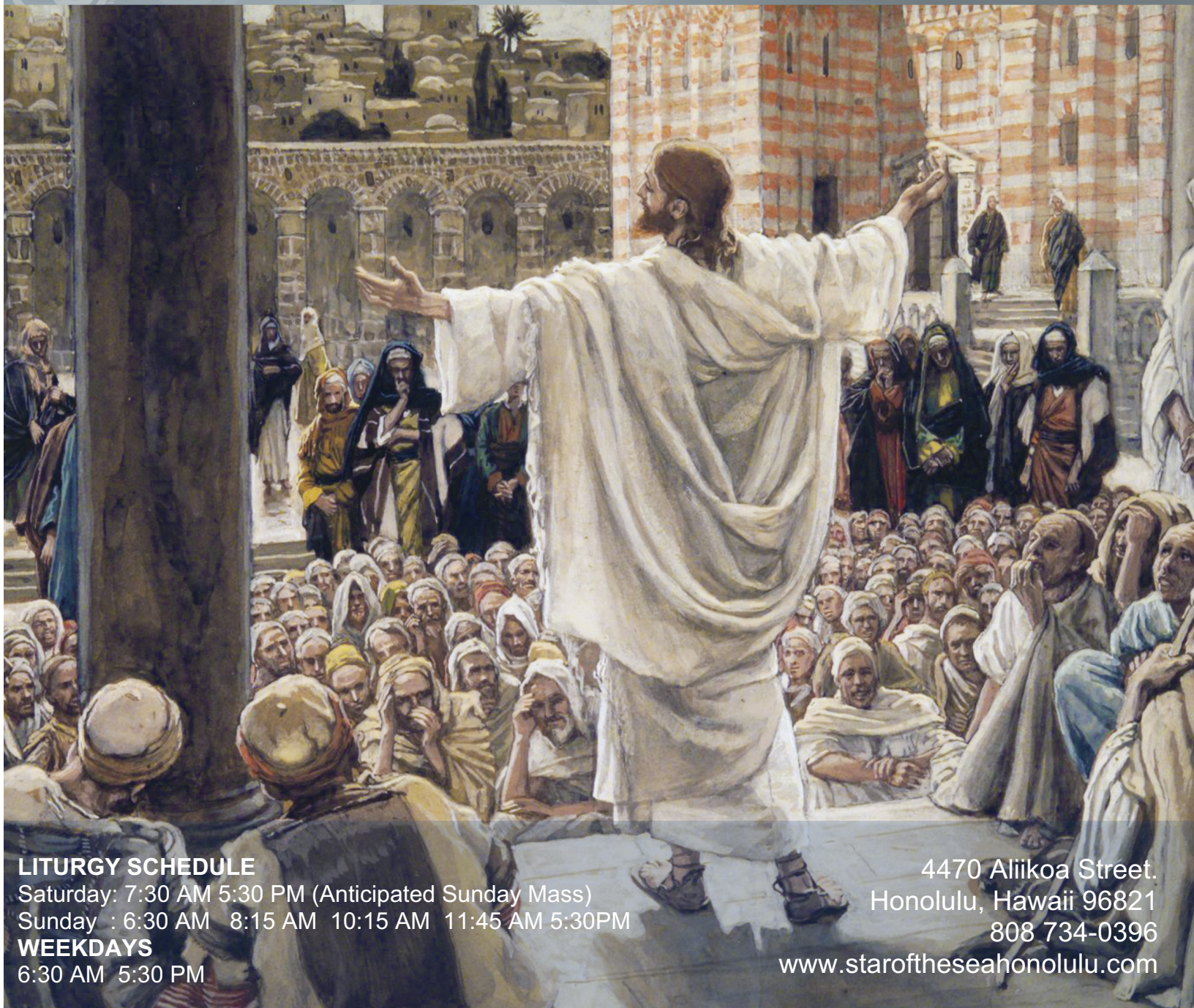

### GOSPEL REFLECTION

#### 20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Fire is a multifaceted symbol in both the Jewish and Christian traditions. Fire is a biblical image for purification and judgment, as well as of the Holy Spirit who descended in the form of fiery tongues. When Jesus says that He came to cast fire upon the earth, more than one symbolic meaning may be inferred. He may be longing for the fire of the Holy Spirit to be ignited in His disciples and also be longing for the fires that refine and purify the people.

*“Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth?” (Luke 12:51)*

So is Jesus a source of peace? Or is He a source of division? Jesus knows that not everyone will embrace His message and the peace that comes with it. He also knows that divisions will arise because of this. On a grand scale, we have seen this in religious conflicts around the globe. And on a more intimate scale, we see this in many families. On the one hand are those who have accepted Jesus and the blessings of His salvation. On the other hand are those who have yet to embrace the salvation that Jesus came to bring. At times, the differences can be so strong as to cause conflict and separation.

Divisions may be inevitable, but they don't have to be permanent. That's where you come in. How will you respond when these divisions manifest themselves at home? With compassion, prayer, and understanding? Or with defensiveness, arguments, and condemnation? Jesus is the Prince of Peace because He came to bring peace to our divided hearts. And as our own divided hearts are healed, we learn how to love as He loves and how to forgive as He forgives. Only Jesus' love and forgiveness can bring unity.

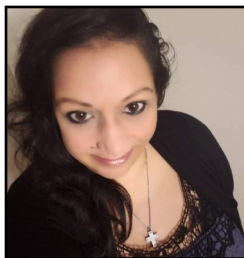

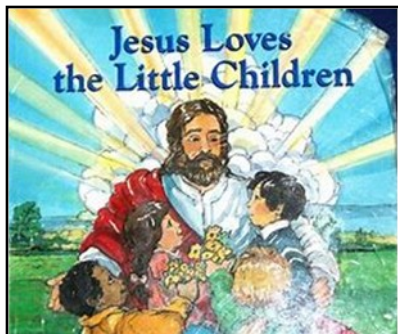

## Mary, Star of the Sea Early Learning Center



Mary, Star of the Sea Early Learning Center welcomes 190 students, and 50 teachers and staff for the 2019-2020 school year! Classes begin on Monday, August 19, 2019 for ages two through kindergarten. The Montessori method of teaching supports a 21<sup>st</sup> century modern educational approach that encourages teachers to view teaching and learning as a dynamic learning process. It focuses not only on academic education, but on spiritual, social and emotional development that fosters a loving, caring, respectful and nurturing environment.

At the ELC, the 3-6 year old mixed age grouping is uniquely Montessori, and creates a family-like atmosphere where older students can serve as mentors and role models for younger students. Younger students can also observe and learn from the older students through their interactions with each other and the Montessori learning materials. Each student has an individualized learning plan which includes specific academic and developmentally appropriate skills for their age-group and for the individual student. Children can progress accordingly to their development and abilities, as well as be appropriately challenged to try new tasks.

Instead of focusing primarily on drills, rote lectures, handouts and worksheets, Montessori teaching offers guidance to the child to develop his/her internal desire for self-motivation and through hands-on interaction with the learning environment. The classrooms are meticulously ordered and organized as learning centers so the child is able to independently interact with the materials (called "jobs") after they have been given an individual or small group lesson/demonstration on how to use the materials. Since young children are often at different stages in their development, the mixed age group concept also provides opportunities for mentoring and "scaffolding" (learning process that takes place through the students' interaction with their peers and teachers). In this learning community teachers can create a learning environment that maximizes the student's ability to interact with others through collaboration, discussion and feedback. ELC classroom tours are conducted weekly on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00 AM-9:30 AM. Please call our office at 808-734-3840 to schedule a tour. The next scheduled tours will resume after September 10<sup>th</sup>.
