From Bishop Nickless

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR A

Readings: Ezekiel 18:25-28; Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 (Response: "Remember your mercies, O Lord."); Philippians 2:1-11; Matthew 21:28-32.

Ever since we have returned to public Masses, we have been directed not to sing hymns and parts of the Mass. This is done because we have learned that singing pushes our breathe and droplets therein farther than talking. (I wonder if that is true for how many of us Catholics sing! LOL) This directive is sad for both of us Frs. Tims, for we love to sing. Since we live in the same household, we are able to sing for morning and evening prayer and Masses that we live-stream from our house, the rectory. When Mary Lou Grabner launched into a rousing rendition of one of my favorite hymns, "How Can I Keep From Singing", at last Sunday's Mass in St. Bernard Church, it took all my will power and care about our safety to 'keep from singing'!

Singing was already one of the characteristic features of early Christianity. Pliny the Younger, a governor of two Roman provinces on the southern shore of the Black Sea in the early first century reported that Christians would gather and sing songs to Christ as if he were "a god". While we will still not sing this weekend, we can be grateful that St. Paul shares with us a very early "Hymn of Christ". Most biblical scholars think that the hymn (vv. 6-11) wasn't Paul's own composition, but rather he used it as he encourages the Philippians—and you and me—to have the same self-effacing attitude of Christ. Christ is the subject of every verb in the first part of the hymn (vv. 6-8); God is the subject of every verb in the second part (vv. 9-11). In this hymn Paul also finds his favorite compare and contrast, that is, of Jesus Christ with the first human, Adam. BTW, the Hebrew word *adam*, means "human"; later the human is pulled apart and built up into *ish* and *ishah*, "man" and "woman" (Genesis 2).

So, Christ, like *adam*, "was in the form of God"; all of us humans are created in the image/likeness/form of God. The first *adam*—both the man and the woman—wanted to be like God (they didn't realize that they already were!), and disobeyed the prohibition of eating from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 3), but Christ did not grasp after that. "Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave", that is, of one who is totally obedient and accepting his "human likeness". He was even "obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

Because Christ willing emptied himself, humbled himself, by both "taking on the form of a slave" and accepting death, even on a cross, "God greatly exalted him" by bestowing on him "the name", that is, "Lord". There were two ways that the Jewish people avoided saying God's name, even when reading the Scriptures. When the name of God was in the text or in a prayer, they would say either "the name" or "Lord". Because of Jesus' total faithfulness, God "bestowed on him *the name* which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is *Lord*, to the glory of God the Father" (emphasis added) — May we all say "AMEN!"

What a relief this is for all of us! We don't have to grasp at being like God, but rather, it is in our being the human person that

God created each of us to be that we most reflect God, in whose image/likeness/form we have been wonderfully created. It is being that person that we truly have the attitude of Christ. It is in being that person that we best give glory to God. AND, on the flip side, every way we acknowledge the dignity and worth of each and every human person, we also show forth Christ's attitude and give glory to God. This does not mean we agree with everything someone does—when we sin, we don't even agree with what we ourselves are doing! Nevertheless, every human person has dignity and worth, regardless of the following: unborn or born; young or old; healthy or infirm; a Christian, of some other faith or even an unbeliever; rich or poor; of any skin color ("race"); ethnicity; documented or undocumented; female or male; sexual orientation; incarcerated or never arrested; political party, etc., etc. May we have "the attitude of Christ" so as to reflect "the glory of God the Father."
