**FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**Readings:** Isaiah 66:10-14c; Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20 (R: “Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.”); Galatians 6:14-18; Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Today's oracle of Isaiah encourages rejoicing by exiles who have returned from Babylon to Jerusalem and their land. Jerusalem is imaged as their mother. In the time of Moses, the Israelites were told that the promised land would be flowing with milk and honey, which appears to part of the abundant milk for the nurslings in Isaiah's oracle. In the latter part of the oracle, the LORD presents himself as a mother to the people: “... as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; in Jerusalem you shall find your comfort.” The love, nourishment and protection of the LORD in this oracle can give us great comfort and solace.

The Psalmist extends the rejoicing to “all the earth”; our response (based on Ps 66:1) connects us with that rejoicing: “Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.” The Psalm and its response are quite in line with the mission of God's people: “I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth” (Isaiah 49:6b; see, Luke 2:32a). This is also the mission of the Church given by the risen Lord, just before his ascension: “...you will receive power when the holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8; see, too, 13:47).

Jesus takes this mission seriously in his ministry which he extends to non-Israelites, i.e., Gentiles. In addition, he sends out The Twelve to extend his ministry (Mark 6:7-13; Matthew 10:1, 9–14; and Luke 9:1-6). As we hear in today's Gospel passage, the evangelist Luke also has a second story about Jesus sending disciples on a mission. Now he sends “seventy-two others” out in pairs. This is both related to the urgency of the time, for Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem (see last week's

reflection) and the importance of extending Jesus's ministry and the preaching of “The kingdom of God is at hand for you.” These sendings foreshadow the even broader mission of the Church after Pentecost (see Acts quotation above), which is a continuation of the mission to be “a light to all the nations”. The mission of the People of God during Isaiah's time, during Jesus' time, and now, post-Pentecost, during the age of the Church, is the same: “Let all the earth cry out to God with joy!”

This is not only the calling and mission of prophets and apostles. The sending of the 72 as well as the stories in Acts of the Apostles show that this is the calling and mission of all members of the People in God. The evangelist Luke presents the crowds around Jesus as if they are in the concentric circles: the innermost group of the apostles and the women who minister to Jesus and the apostles (see 8:1-3), then a larger group of followers/disciples, and then those who are merely interested or even hostile to Jesus. The “seventy-two others” comes from that second, larger circle of followers/disciples. Thus, Jesus's command to the 72, “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way...”, is addressed to all who have come to believe in him, follow him, and learn from him. Too often (IMHO) the Catholic Church has used this passage as an exhortation for the vocations of religious life and/or priesthood. While they are not excluded, it seems clear that the focus is really on the call for each and every believer to be about spreading the good news that “The kingdom of God is at hand for you.” That is to say, to proclaim that God's living, loving presence is at hand, here and now, as well as in and through the faithful who are living the mission of our Lord Jesus of Christ and all the people of God.

The living, loving presence of God is at hand whenever one meets “a peaceful person”, receives hospitality, is fairly compensated for her/his labor, brings healing and forgiveness, etc., etc. Not everyone will be open to what God has to offer in and through his people. When that happens, one isn't to give up, but to move on from that place in a signifying way: “Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, ‘The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.’” This shows that the two missionaries are no longer associated with the unbelievers who are hostile to the good news of the Lord Jesus Christ. They are part of that outer circle of rather toxic persons! But, “chin up” there are other towns and villages to go to, for the mission is to “the ends of the earth.”

Any difficulty and suffering that we have because we are fulfilling our calling, to be part of Christ's mission, is our sharing in the cross of Christ. With Paul, let each of us say, “May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.” The “circumcision” (members of Judaism) and “uncircumcision” (Gentiles) are irrelevant to the scope of the salvation won by Jesus Christ through the cross, death and resurrection. Rather, all peoples are to be “a new creation”; the Lord created in order to redeem creation: “Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.”
