

From Our Pastor

THE ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL - WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER!

Next weekend, you'll be asked to make a pledge for the coming year to the Annual Catholic Appeal which helps to fund many of the services provided for us by the Archdiocese as well as programs that assist the neediest of our brothers and sisters in parishes throughout Cook and Lake counties.

For the past two years, we were given a "pass" on promoting the Appeal during weekend Masses—two years ago because we were just beginning the *To Teach Who Christ Is* capital campaign and then again last year when the impending closure of our school made the promotion of the Appeal seem like not such a good idea. But even without the in-pew appeal in church, many generous parishioners gave directly last year and contributed over 70% of the goal set for us by the Archdiocese.

But this year, we are once again being asked to request your help during the homily time at all the Masses next weekend. Those of you who have contributed in the past have already received a direct mail pledge request, but next weekend everyone will be asked to consider helping in some way, large or small, with this appeal, begun many years ago by Cardinal Bernardin.

When Cardinal Bernardin inaugurated this program back in the 1990's, his intention was to emphasize the truth I've included in the title of this article: *we're all in this together*. Cardinal Bernardin was painfully aware of something that, in many cases, still exists today; it's called parochialism, the feeling among some Catholics (and some pastors!) that a parish is a law unto itself, an island with no connection to, or responsibility for, any other parish. But the simple fact is that we are part of something bigger—both the Church of the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Universal Church. Many second collections throughout the year—Peter's Pence and Mission Sunday being two examples—remind us of these connections. The Annual Catholic Appeal focuses on our connection to the Archdiocese and our responsibility to support one another in this "local Church."

The pledges or gifts you make to this appeal benefit our parish in many ways. For one thing, every dollar contributed over and above our archdiocesan goal remains here. But we also benefit from the services provided by offices of the Archdiocese, including one known as Facilities and Construction which is providing us with guidance and oversight as we begin two of our planned capital projects—the creation of handicapped accessible meeting space and the refurbishment of the washrooms in the school.


2018 Catholic Appeal: “Come, Follow Me”

5 THINGS YOU CAN DO RIGHT NOW TO WARD OFF THE FLU by Jaimie Oh

It's that time of year again: We're bracing ourselves for the flu peak, and many physicians are anticipating the worst flu season in a long time.

Influenza, commonly called the flu, is a seasonal disease that usually begins in the fall and often peaks around January. Pharmaceutical companies develop a flu vaccine every year, but the challenging aspect of the flu is that the disease is always changing.

In fact, some reports suggest this year's flu vaccine appears to be only around 10 percent effective, which is why we can expect a more severe flu season.

While the flu is a tricky disease, we have a good enough understanding of it to minimize our risk of catching and spreading it. Here are five things you can do right now to ward off the influenza virus:

- **Get vaccinated!** Even though this year's vaccine may not be as effective as hoped, it still holds protective power compared to not being vaccinated at all. In addition, even if the vaccine doesn't prevent you from getting sick, it still may make your symptoms milder. And it's not too late to get the shot!
- **Wash your hands.** A person sick with the flu can spread the disease through droplets, which are released into the air any time that person sneezes or coughs. These droplets can stay on our skin, clothes or everyday surfaces, so keep those hands clean! Washing with alcohol foams or gels or using soap and water are both effective to prevent spreading the virus.
- **Keep your germs to yourself.** Another tricky feature of the flu virus is that you can be infected but not show any symptoms for 4-5 days. Keep your droplets, or germs, to yourself by sneezing or coughing into your elbow.
- **Feeling sick? Stay home.** Watch for the classic symptoms of the flu: fever of 100.5 degrees or more, chills, body aches, cough and sore throat. Encourage sick coworkers or friends to stay home to prevent the spread of the virus.
- **See a health care professional.** If your symptoms worsen significantly within the first 48 hours, or if you are at high risk for complications, see your doctor. Those at high risk include adults 65 years of age and older, pregnant women and women up to two weeks postpartum, residents of nursing homes or other long-term care facilities, American Indians and Alaskan Natives, children younger than 5 years of age and those with serious chronic diseases. There are treatments available that can speed up the recovery process.

GOSPEL READING

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus heals a man with an unclean spirit and his fame spreads throughout Galilee.

FAMILY CONNECTION

The people who heard Jesus teach and saw him heal in today's Gospel were said to have been astonished and amazed by the authority of his teaching. So compelling were Jesus' words and actions that the news about him could not be contained; it spread quickly throughout all of Galilee. Two thousand years later, the news about Jesus continues to spread. We are called to participate in sharing the Good News of Jesus with others in our words and in our deeds.

Gather as a family and try to name some amazing things, events, or people. In today's Gospel we hear that the people were astonished and amazed by their experience of Jesus. Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:21-28. What did the people who saw and heard Jesus find so amazing? (In Jesus, the people heard and saw the power and authority of God at work.) People should see in our lives the power and authority of God at work. Can you name any modern examples of people in whom you have seen the power and authority of God at work? Conclude in prayer together that we will experience wonder at the work of God in our world today. Pray together the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. And kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth. Lord, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



So, if you want to be able to carry the Body of our Lord to the sick in their homes or to hospitals or nursing homes, please contact the Parish Office to register for these trainings, and mark these evenings in your calendar.


