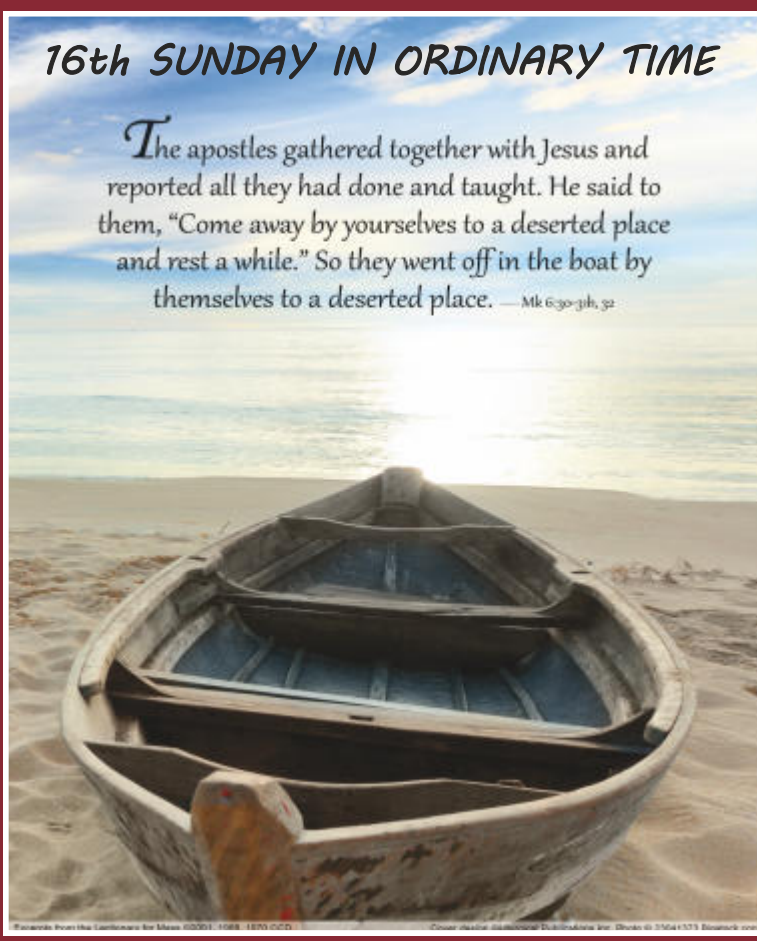

From Our Pastor

AN INVITATION TO YOUNG ADULTS

A couple of months ago, I extended an invitation to young adults in the parish (or in the area) to stop by for an open-ended conversation about your relationship with the Church. This invitation was the result of a discussion among members of our Parish Pastoral Council as well as a discussion with a couple of young adults I see on a regular basis on weekends. The invitation occurred in May which, as a mother pointed out to me later, was probably not the ideal time since her college-age son and most others were not yet home for the summer. That might be at least one reason why no one showed up on the two days I offered to be available.

So, before the summer is over, I'd like to extend that invitation one more time—on **Thursday, August 2nd, at 7:00p.m.** here at the rectory. We have a nice, comfortable living room that is hardly ever used, and it would provide a relaxed environment for a casual conversation about the role of the Church in the lives of young Catholics. The questions I'd like to ask you are:

- Why do you go/not go to Church? What inspires you or turns you off?
- What would you like to see the Church do to make young adults (20 and 30-somethings) feel more welcome?
- What opportunities could the parish provide to help you feel more connected?
- How would you suggest we reach out to young adults in our community?
- What other questions/concerns/suggestions would you have?

Those are my questions, but I'd actually be more interested in any questions you might have for me and especially your suggestions for reaching out more effectively to your demographic.

So if you're in that age group (even pushing 40!), whether you're in college, single or married (with or without children), it would be tremendously helpful to hear about your experiences of Church and faith in this busy, crazy world. If you have any questions ahead of that date or would be able to let me know that you plan to stop by, feel free to call me at 708-798-0622, ext. 2, or e-mail me at rkyfes@posjhomewood.org. It would also be nice to know who and how many might show up on August 2nd, but that's not absolutely necessary. And one more thing: this will be a completely non-judgmental conversation. I just want to know what you're thinking and feeling about the role of the Church in a 21st century world and in your own lives.

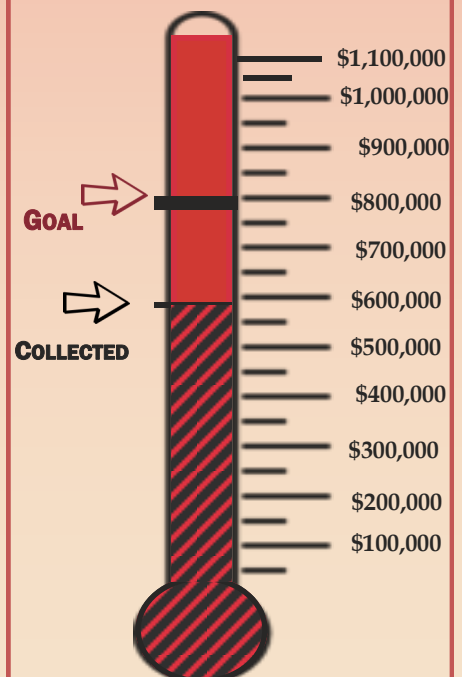

Sunday Connection

Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Sunday, July 22, 2018

Gospel Reading: Mark 6:30-34

Jesus invites his disciples to rest after their ministry, and Jesus is moved with pity for the crowds who pursue them.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In this today's Gospel, we read the report of the return of the Twelve, who were sent by Jesus to preach repentance, heal the sick, and drive out demons. When the Twelve return to Jesus, he invites them to come away from the crowds and rest. But the crowds will not give them peace. As the Twelve have shared in Jesus' ministry, they now appear to share in his popularity. The crowds continue to approach them, and Mark reports that the disciples don't even have time to eat. In an effort to get away, Jesus and his disciples board a boat in hopes of finding a deserted place. But the crowds notice this and arrive ahead of them. The crowds are so persistent that Jesus and his disciples cannot find a place to be alone. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus is moved with pity and begins to teach the crowds.

Our Gospel for today stops here, but Mark's report of the unyielding demands of the crowd continues in the verses that follow. If we were to continue reading from Mark's Gospel, we would hear Jesus instruct his disciples to feed the crowd in the familiar miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. The work of Jesus and his disciples appears to be a round-the-clock job. In the next few weeks, we will hear the story of Jesus' feeding of the multitude, but our Lectionary will turn to the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John to report and reflect on this story.

In today's Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent." Jesus chose twelve men from among his disciples whom he sent to share in his ministry of preaching and healing. The first report of this is found in the third chapter of Mark's Gospel, where the Twelve are also called apostles and the names of this select group are listed.

We who are Jesus' disciples today have also been sent to share the Gospel with others. Perhaps our commitment to following Jesus as his disciple leaves us feeling tired and overwhelmed. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm the importance of times of rest and renewal. Jesus wanted his disciples to come away and spend time alone with him. This is what we seek and find in our life of prayer and in our celebration of the Eucharist.

Beyond the school he was active in the parish, serving as a lector, and most recently as a catechist, co-teaching 6th grade with his wife, Alicia.



Rob was always eager to share his love of the faith and would often say how much he enjoyed teaching. Even when he was struggling with his health he would show up on Sunday mornings, he said it made him happy and that it was so important to him. He was so passionate about religious education that he offered to do more—he spent a summer working with Deacon Maddock to develop a curriculum for parents, he offered to assist children in grades 3-7 making their First Reconciliation and First Communion. Rob organized a pancake breakfast for the start of the 2017-2018 religious education year because he wanted the children and their families to feel more connected to the parish.

The religious education program and all of St. Joseph Parish were so fortunate to have known him. He will be dearly missed.

The crib is placed in the Northwest corner of Saint Joseph Church, and it will be a repository for the on-going collection of disposable diapers. 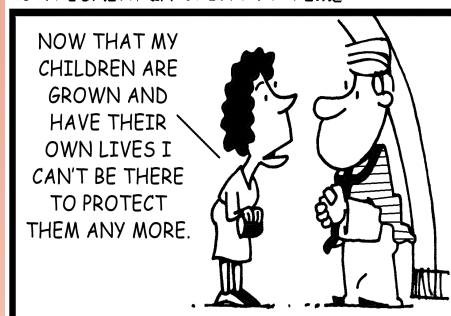

1. ADD FLAVOR

Adding fruit can help improve the taste and help you drink more water than usual.

2. GET A TRACKING APP

The general recommendation for women is about 2.7 liters of total water each day and is an average of approximately 3.7 liters of total water daily for men.



3. GRAB A SPARKLING WATER

Having sparkling water is a great alternative to drinking sugary beverages.

4. ALLOW THIRST TO BE YOUR GUIDE

Research has indicated the majority of healthy people adequately meet their daily hydration needs by drinking water when they feel thirsty.



5. EAT WATER-ENRICHED FOOD

Many foods, such as raw fruits and vegetables, have high water contents. After all, 20 percent of daily water intake comes from food.

6. MARK UP YOUR BOTTLE

Put little tabs on your water bottle and set goals for yourself so you'll know how much you should drink throughout the day.

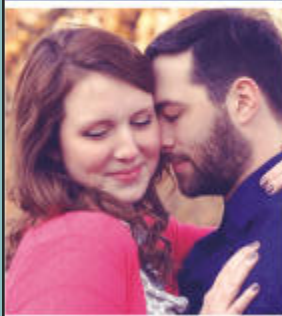
