

- 2 : the conducting, supervising, or managing of something especially: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care


We are still in the final grasp of a hot and sunny meteorological summer, but September brings a wake-up call. By this time, visiting relatives have gone home, schools are in session, swimming pools are closing, and another season of the NFL on FOX has commenced. But what does all this mean for us as Christian Stewards?

As we journey through September, parishes begin to teem with plans and signs of new vitality. The parish is where the church lives, and stewards are the life blood of a successful parish. In the parish, we find community and support, liturgy and ritual, sacrament and healing. In the parish, we find a way to give and to receive. On a practical level, fall is the time when parish planning gears up for the season ahead. Now is the time for us – all of us – to prayerfully consider our individual involvement in the life of our parish. How might we serve – and be served? The Christian steward knows participation in the parish is a win-win situation, feeding us as we feed others.

Where to begin? Stewardship Directories, which detail each of our parish ministries and activities, were distributed with this bulletin. Take time to read through it. What calls to you? Respond to your deep desire. Maybe you are the party planner who would love to serve on the social committee. Or perhaps you have a heart for helping the bereaved. Are you called to proclaim the word of God as a Lector, or perhaps bring the Eucharist (Communion) to the homebound? Perhaps you like to teach? Consider the role of Catechist in the Religious Education program teaching others about our faith. Possibly you see a ministry missing and would like to propose it. Speak up! This is your opportunity to revitalize the stewardship efforts in our parish.

Next weekend our parish will conduct its annual Stewardship Appeal at all masses. Each of us will be given an opportunity to make a commitment of time and talent to our parish through a simple in-pew pledge process. Do not take this invitation for granted. Christian Stewardship is a win-win opportunity in which we learn to welcome the stranger, bring out the best in one another, and encourage discipleship all while experiencing the community and support of others just like you.

Now is the perfect time to reflect on where – not "if" –you are called. This is your opportunity to decompress from a busy and fun summer, and to pray about where your own road to discipleship leads you next. If not now, when? If not you, who?

GOSPEL READING

Luke 15:1-32

Jesus responds to those who criticize him for keeping company with the unworthy.

FAMILY CONNECTION

Read or retell in your own words, the three stories from the Gospel. Ask your children to recall games they play that involve losing or hiding something and then finding it. (Hide and Go Seek, Ghost in the Graveyard, Button, Button, Who's Got the Button?) Talk about how exciting it is to find the person or thing being looked for.

Ask your children if they have any memories of losing something special or being lost themselves. Share the stories as well as the fears or feelings. Then tell them that just as you would go to any length to find and bring them home if they were lost, so too would God. That is what Jesus is telling us in the three stories. No matter what we do, no matter how wrong we are, God, our loving father, is always anxious to forgive us and welcome us back home.



WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT VAPING by Neda Bencun



While the long-term health effects of e-cigarettes continues to be studied, recent cases of severe lung illness associated with vaping have prompted an investigation by the Centers for Disease Control.

The CDC has identified 94 cases of severe lung illness associated with vaping in 14 states since June 2019, including Illinois and Indiana, with 30 cases exclusively in Wisconsin. While the investigations are ongoing, it's important to understand vaping and health concerns that affect a large population of adolescents.

E-cigarettes are electronic devices that heat a liquid and produce an aerosol. Most of them contain nicotine, which is highly addictive, and a single pod can have as much as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes. Teens may not realize that nicotine is deeply addictive. Through the years, vaping has become popular among adolescents and can raise the risk of a teens smoking regular cigarettes.

"E-cigarettes produce harmful chemicals that can cause lung and heart disease," said Dr. Axel Joob, a thoracic surgeon at Advocate Lutheran General Hospital. "A plausible explanation is that the toxic chemicals are causing a severe, inflammatory response in the teens' lungs. This could lead to a condition known as acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS) which has been associated with inhaling toxic fumes. Although vaping isn't new, the recent cases in teens have sparked an urgency for parents to talk to their kids about the dangers of vaping."

Reported cases of admitted patients identified symptoms of shortness of breath, fatigue, chest pain, cough, nausea and weight loss. Some have been severe enough to require hospitalization for weeks and all are reported in patients who have vaped.

"The health risks for teens smoking e-cigarettes is higher than in adults because their brain and lungs are still developing well until age 25," said Dr. Joob.

A recent study found that non-smokers who vaped a non-nicotine containing e-cigarette had less oxygen flowing through their blood. The results indicate that vaping, even one time, can impair blood vessel function. While further studies are needed to prove vaping can cause heart and lung issues, these changes are indicators of long-term risk for cardiovascular and lung disease.

* This article was published on August 23, 2019. As of September 6, 2019, there have been 5 deaths nation-wide – including cases from Illinois and Indiana. More than 450 possible cases are being investigated in 33 states. Federal health officials and medical experts are advising immediate cessation of vaping in any age group.




FIRST DAY OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION
