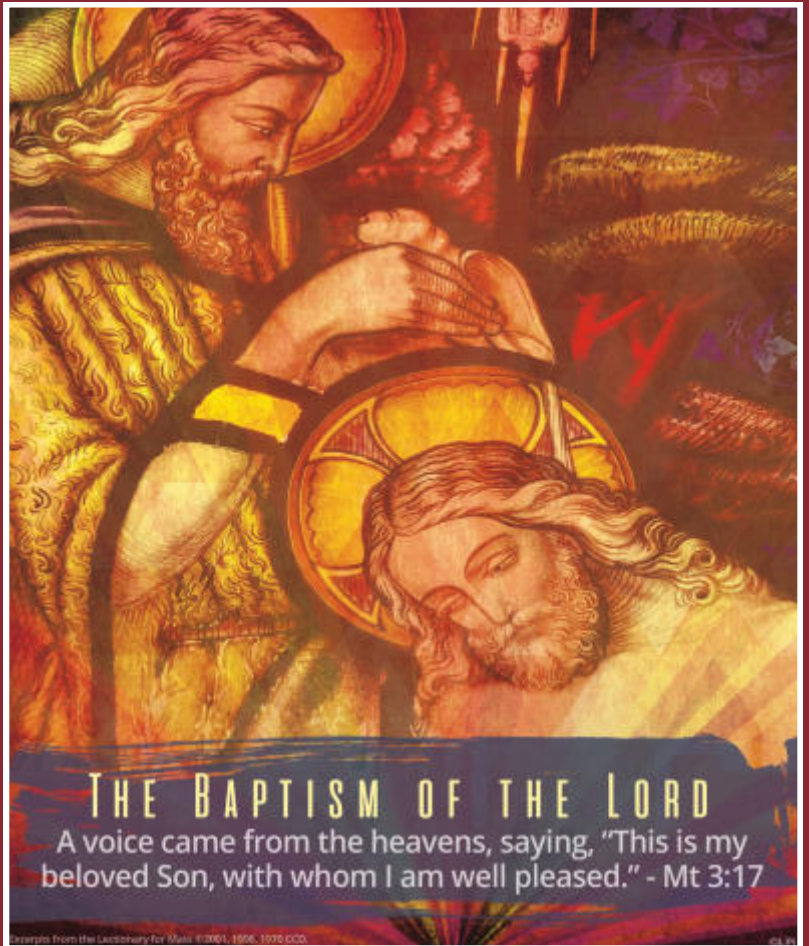

From Our Pastor

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD – AND OURS

This feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a good time to think about what baptism really means for each of us. That meaning begins with several important biblical images and continues with the evolving understanding of Baptism in the Church through the centuries.

The origins of baptismal imagery go back to the Old Testament, with three pivotal moments of creation and re-creation. The first image is found in the very first words of Genesis where “a mighty wind swept over the waters.” That mighty wind is the Spirit of God, bringing new life from the primeval waters. The second moment is the story of the flood a bit further on in Genesis which is recalled during the blessing of water in the Sacrament of Baptism as “an end of sin and a new beginning of goodness.” The third Old Testament image is found in the Exodus from Egypt through the waters of the Red Sea (really the muddy part of that body of water known as the Reed Sea). The waters of Baptism are meant to free us from our “slavery to sin” as the Israelites were freed from literal slavery in Egypt.

The New Testament origins of Baptism are more explicit, beginning with the preaching of John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus himself by John in the three synoptic Gospels. But interestingly, there is no account of the baptism of Jesus in the Gospel of John. Instead, the evangelist describes what John the Baptist does as a “baptism of repentance” while Jesus will baptize “with the Holy Spirit.” And St. Paul, in his letter to the Church in Rome, establishes the core understanding of our Sacrament that shaped its development through the centuries; it’s contained in a passage that is proclaimed each year at the Easter Vigil: “Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.”

Our contemporary version of this sacrament usually minimizes that dying part, with water merely dribbled over the forehead of the person—usually the infant—being baptized. But for centuries, when infants were only baptized along with the “conversion” of an entire family, adults were completely immersed in a baptismal pool, with their heads pushed below the water three times to vividly convey the fact that they were dying to an old life to be reborn in the name of “the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.” In the decades after Vatican II, newly built or renovated churches often restored the baptismal pool and make use of it for baptisms at the Easter Vigil.

Although whole families were often baptized together in Apostolic times, the understanding of Baptism was hotly debated in the following seven centuries. Near the beginning of the third century, Tertullian, one of the “Fathers of the Church”, wrote:

“All who understand what a burden baptism is will have more fear of obtaining it than of postponement...It is far wiser to let them (infants) be made Christians when they have become competent to know Christ.” I can’t count the number of times I’ve wished that Tertullian’s view had shaped the Church’s approach to Baptism when parents who so obviously have no connection to the Church and will be unlikely to “teach their child in the ways of faith” simply go through the motions of having their child baptized.

But unfortunately, St. Augustine’s 4th century distorted view of human nature as being “steeped in sin from conception” won the theological day and led to the popularization of a “limbo” where unbaptized infants would spend eternity, happy but deprived of the vision of God. It’s so important to understand that “limbo” was **never** a teaching of the Church but rather a popular fantasy that took hold of people’s imaginations through the centuries. And a misunderstanding of the meaning of “original sin” plays a part in all of this as well. “Original sin” isn’t some black blotch on our souls (the way I envisioned it as a child) that is scrubbed away in baptismal waters. Rather it is that ancient, diabolical temptation to think that we can make it on our own in this world, that we don’t need God or each other. The Sacrament of Baptism “washes away” that “original sin” of pride and self-sufficiency by bringing us into a profound relationship with the triune God and with the Church.

The bottom line is this: Baptism is a gift from God which the Church celebrates as an infusion of divine life and an entrance into a believing community which will support, encourage and challenge the baptized person throughout their life on this earth. But as Tertullian so eloquently put it over 1700 years ago, Baptism is also a “burden” because it obligates the baptized person to live “a faithful life” in the community of the Church. That’s why it’s so important that the parents of an infant who is to be baptized are already living **their** lives faithfully in the community of the Church. May today’s feast encourage all of us who have been given this gift and this burden to remain faithful to the promises made for us—or by us—on our own baptismal day.

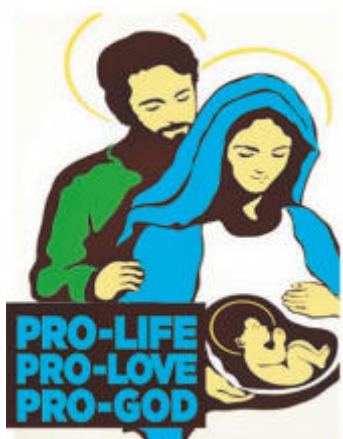

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

JANUARY 12, 2020

GOSPEL: Matthew 3:13-17

The Spirit of God comes upon Jesus as he is baptized by John.

FAMILY CONNECTION

At Jesus' baptism, God affirms his Son's mission for salvation. God announces his pleasure with Jesus and, in Matthew's Gospel, announces to all that, "This is my beloved Son" (Matthew 3:17). With this affirmation, Jesus is able to resist the temptations described next in Matthew's Gospel and to begin his public ministry. As family members, we can support one another in our Christian living by affirming the importance of each person in our eyes and in God's. Confident that through our Baptism we too were made children of God, we can resist temptation and share in Christ's mission.

Gather as a family to read today's Gospel, Matthew 3:13-17. Recall that God's message about Jesus was meant for us, "This is my beloved Son." It was also an affirmation for Jesus about his role in God's plan.

Place each family member's name on a slip of paper and put the names in a bowl. Invite each person in the family to choose another family member's name and to prepare a message for that person, affirming their importance in God's eyes and in your family life. Pray together that your family will continue to support one another in your baptismal promises to be disciples of Jesus and then invite each person to read aloud the message they prepared. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.

CAN YOU DRINK ALCOHOL WITH THAT? *By Brittany Jensen*

Whether an alcoholic beverage is part of your nightly routine, a weekend night out or simply a special occasion occurrence, with almost half of the U.S. population using at least one prescription drug, it's important to consider the dangers of mixing alcohol with medications.

How much is too much?

To keep your risk of dangerous drug interactions low, stay within *both* the single-day AND weekly limits.

- **Men:** No more than four drinks on any day AND no more than 14 drinks per week
- **Women:** No more than three drinks on any day AND no more than seven drinks per week
- **If you're over 65, regardless of gender:** No more than three drinks on any day AND no more than seven drinks per week.

Drinking patterns above these limits may put you at risk for developing alcohol-related problems. Women, in general, have a higher risk for problems than men.

This is important: Many medical conditions can be made worse by drinking. Some medications can increase the dangerous effects of alcohol.

What kinds of dangers are we talking about?

Some of the dangers of mixing alcohol with medications include:

- Drowsiness, dizziness, difficulty concentrating
- Increased risk for overdose
- Rapid heartbeat or sudden changes in blood pressure – other heart problems including heart attack
- Slowed or difficulty breathing
- Liver damage, stomach bleeding, stroke
- Nausea and vomiting

Given these dangers, what does the average person need to know?

- **Medicines can have many ingredients.** It's important to know what your medications contain to determine whether or not they may interact with alcohol. Always check the label for all the ingredients.
- **Some medicines already contain alcohol.** Up to 10% alcohol is possible. Cough syrup and laxatives are examples of medications that can contain alcohol.
- **Older people may be at a higher risk.** As you age, the body's ability to break down alcohol slows. This means the alcohol can stay in the body longer. Older people are also more likely to be on one or more medications that can interact with alcohol.
- **Timing is important.** Some medications may stay in the body for hours to days – or even longer! You might see harmful effects by combining alcohol and medications even if you don't take the medications at the same exact time.

Medications that can be purchased over the counter (without a prescription) may be harmful when combined with alcohol. And some herbal remedies may also be harmful when combined with alcohol. Some examples include:

- **Kava Kava:** May lead to liver damage, drowsiness
- **St. John's Wort:** Can cause drowsiness, dizziness, increased risk for overdose, increased feelings of depression or hopelessness
- **Chamomile, valerian or lavender:** May cause increased drowsiness

It's important to discuss with your pharmacist or other health care provider whether the medications you're taking may interact harmfully with alcohol. Whenever you have questions or concerns about prescriptions or over-the-counter medications, ask your local pharmacist.

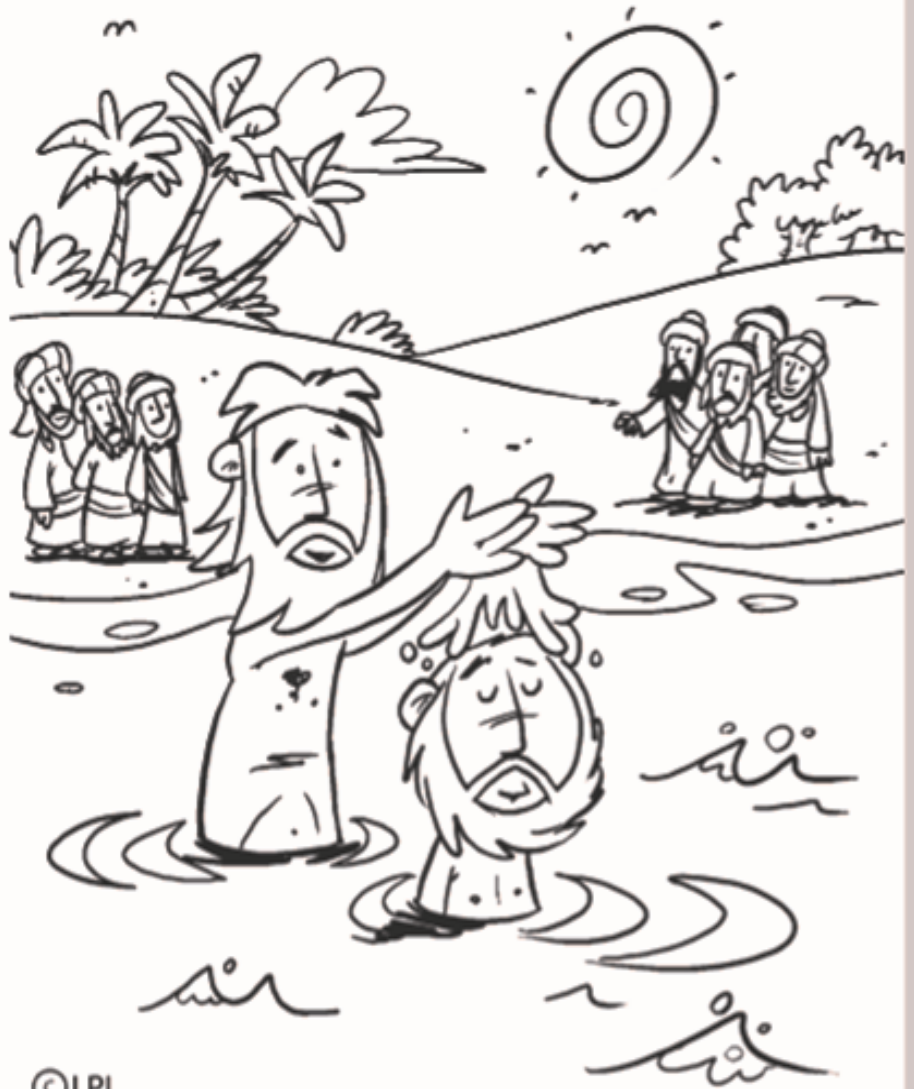

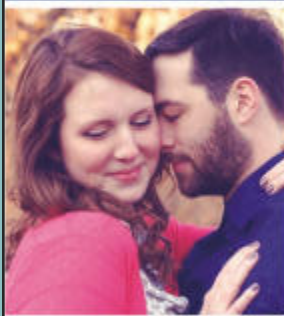
