

From Our Pastor

DOLLARS AND SENSE

No, that's not a typo in the title. I say "sense" because it's not always easy to make sense of the financial report which you will find in today's bulletin. The first thing of which to make "sense" is the idea of a fiscal year. Most of us live by calendar years, but governments and businesses—including the Church—operate on different calendars. The "fiscal year" for us runs from July 1 to June 30; so the report you see today is for Fiscal 2019 which ended on June 30 of last year. Normally this report would have been in the Christmas bulletin, giving it access to a wider group, but there was a bit of a delay in getting that done.

So let's make some very simple sense of what you will find there. The first and very challenging fact is that, although "ordinary" income—mostly collections—increased by 0.4% from the previous fiscal year, ordinary expenses—payroll, insurance, benefits, repairs, maintenance, utilities—increased by 10.4%. That simply and scarily means that our bottom line was down by 10%. And even though the school closed over two years ago, we are still feeling the residual effects of having had to pay teacher unemployment costs and benefits in the months after the closing, along with unpaid bills from the final year of the school's existence, but with no tuition income to offset those expenses. And our Religious Education program continued to present challenges as well with decreased enrollment and far too many parents failing to pay the nominal tuition which is the least they can do to support an excellent service provided to their children.

To be sure, our *To Teach Who Christ Is* funds allowed us to pay for the renovation of the school washrooms and the creation of our new, larger and handicapped accessible meeting space in the school—the *Tolton Room*. Those funds were still "restricted" in the last fiscal year but should be available in the current year should any "extraordinary" problems arise. Those funds will also soon pay for the new church sound system whose installation has been slightly delayed by additional concerns with our existing equipment. But it's never good to depend on "extraordinary" income to cover ordinary expenses, which is why it's vitally important to increase our Sunday and Holy Day collections to meet those basic needs.

Last fiscal year's deficit of nearly \$37,000 isn't earth-shaking, but it shouldn't continue. We're fortunate to have had many new families and individuals become members in the past eighteen months, some new to the area, some coming over from other parishes. But we've also lost a considerable number of members—some who passed away, others who moved because of job relocation or retirement—and a number of them were extremely generous givers, of both their time and their treasure. That makes it all the more important for all of you, who value what this wonderful parish provides, to do all you can to generously support our church community in the months and years to come. It just makes sense.

3ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JANUARY 26, 2020

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 4:12-23 Jesus begins to preach in Galilee and calls his first disciples.

FAMILY CONNECTION

Today's Gospel tells us little about the background of these fishermen, their work, and their families. We are simply told that James and John left their father, Zebedee, in the boat and followed Jesus. Some details about the families of these first followers of Jesus are found later in Matthew's Gospel. however. In Matthew 8:14-15 for example, Jesus goes to the home of Peter and heals his mother-in-law of a fever. Matthew 20:20-28 relates how the mother of the sons of Zebedee (James and John) approaches Jesus with the request that her sons be given places of honor in Jesus' kingdom. These brief references suggest that the first disciples' separation from their families may not have been as complete as the verses in today's Gospel might lead us to believe. Matthew points out the separation because he wants to show that Christian discipleship can require a change in our lives and even our family relationships. Perhaps the message for us today is to balance the radical call to be a follower of Jesus with the challenge to be "fishers of men" even within our own families. Creating this balance may require that we change some of the priorities of our own family life. As a family, detail the activities of a typical day. Discuss together what priorities are reflected in this daily schedule. How does your family respond when your daily plans are interrupted or must be changed? Together read today's Gospel. Reflect together on the example of the first disciples who dropped everything to follow Jesus. Ask: Does our family schedule give evidence that we put God first in our family life? What might we do to better reflect that God is our priority? Pray together that your family will always give evidence that God comes first in your family life. Pray today's Psalm or the Lord's Prayer.

TAKE A DEEP BREATH by Jennifer Benson

As a parent, you are always trying to keep your children safe, but have you thought much about their lungs? Dr. Shimoni Dharia, a pediatric pulmonologist at Advocate Children's Hospital, offers guidance on key products or environments for your child to avoid as their lungs develop and extra precautions for children with asthma.

Smoking

Having your child around environments where people are smoking tobacco or marijuana is harmful for their lungs. Vaping, though not burning, still creates a vapor that includes nicotine and other chemicals that children should be kept away from as scientists keep working to examine the health effects. "Though smoking-related health issues have been dropping because of a multi-faceted approach to encourage people to stop smoking, the rise of vaping, especially among teens, is a concern," Dr. Dharia says.

Extreme cold

When the bitter cold weather hits, it's best to stay inside because below-zero temperatures can cause bronchial spasm, which causes difficulty breathing. If kids need to go out for a brief time, use a scarf. In winter, the air can get quite dry. A humidifier can be helpful, but make sure to have a meter to regulate the humidity and avoid mold growth. In extreme heat, asthmatics need to be in an air-conditioned environment and consider using dehumidifiers. But if there is no extreme weather, get them outside to exercise and strengthen their lungs and heart.

Strong smells

Fragrances, aerosol scent sprays, cleaning agents and essential oils can smell nice, and most don't affect children. However, they need to be used in a well-ventilated room where the smell is not overpowering. Indoor swimming pools with high chlorine levels also can cause issues for asthmatics.

Indoor fireplaces

Winter is a prime time for crackling fires to curl up with your kids, but keep in mind a few things to do beforehand. Make sure the chimney is clean and maintained to provide adequate ventilation so that smoke and ash particles stay out of your house's air. Check your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and put in new batteries every time the time changes.

Allergens

Particularly for children with asthma, allergens like dust, pets, pollen or environmental factors can trigger an asthma attack. Be aware of these triggers and minimize their impact as best you can so they are not in those environments for very long.

Air pollution

Though a problem in the U.S., air pollution has become an even bigger problem globally in areas of the world where air pollution and its causes have not been as regulated or limited. Particle pollution can cause long-term damage for children's lungs. If your child has a disease or asthma, it's best to avoid those areas. If it is not possible to avoid those places, have them wear a mask, spend less time outside and make sure there are air purifiers in their sleeping quarters.

Lung & respiratory diseases

One of the main ways to protect your child's growing lungs is to have them receive the flu vaccine if they are 6 months or older. Vaccinating your child can prevent complications from diseases with long-term effects, such as diphtheria, measles, pneumonia and bronchitis, or at least decrease the severity of the symptoms. Children should receive the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccine before they are one year old. This virus affects patients with lung disease, heart disease, muscular disease and preemies more severely than healthier children or adults. Talk to your child's doctor about what is best. "Increasing awareness about the influenza vaccine will help parents protect their child's lungs," Dr. Dharia says. "Look at third world countries where parents are with their children, waiting in lines to receive this vaccine, because their children are dying from preventable diseases. If they had only had access and low-costs to the flu vaccine."







Growing with the Gospel

Matthew 4:12-23 ■ 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Gospel Mt 4:12-23

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen. From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him. He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.
