

#### THE PARISH OF SAINT JOSEPH

Father Armand Martin (I) was the first priest to serve St. Joseph's. Father Martin was at St. Joseph's from 1912-1914 and during this time he also served congregants at St. Anne Church (pictured), which at the time was located at 172<sup>nd</sup> Street and Loomis Avenue in East Hazel Crest. That church was built under the direction of Father Martin in 1911. Father Martin became pastor of St. John Church in Glenwood in 1914. After that, Father John Doran was appointed pastor of St. Joseph's and St. Anne Church. St. Anne then became a mission of St. Joseph's, an arrangement that lasted until 1949, when it too was elevated to the status of a parish.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Were you Baptized but never Confirmed? Is your spouse or a family member Baptized in another Christian faith but wishes to become Catholic? Do you know someone who has expressed a desire to become Catholic? Would you like to know more about your faith?

### Consider the <u>R</u>ite of <u>C</u>hristian <u>I</u>nitiation of <u>A</u>dults.

Our parish welcomes new members into the Catholic Church through a process of education, faith sharing and rituals known as the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)*. It is a process rather than an ordinary educational program. One may take as much as time as he or she needs in the initiation process before becoming ready for full initiation through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The process is open to all people who are discerning their personal experience of faith and to learning more about the Catholic Church. The process can be applied to the following three (3) groups:

- ✓ Unbaptized persons (catechumens), who are looking to grow in awareness of God's call to conversion, as well as ways to respond to that call.
- ✓ Persons baptized in another Christian Church (candidates) wishing to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- ✓ **Baptized Catholics who are uncatechized** (not given religious instruction in the Catholic faith), who wish to prepare to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist.

The goal of the RCIA process is "Full communion," which means complete and active participation in the Eucharist and in the life of the Catholic faith community. 

# A & E COMMITTEE SEEKS HELP INSTALLING CHRISTMAS ANGELS


Our Christmas angels were in quarantine last year, but this coming Christmas season 2021 they look forward to once again hanging from the arches of St, Joseph's.

To make that happen, though, the A & E Committee needs some special assistance:

- 1. Someone with a truck to pick up scaffolding which is used to hang the angels.
- 2. Someone -- or 2 people -- to assemble the scaffolding.
- 3. Three strong people to lift/hang the 70-80 pound angels from the floor to the four arches.
- 4. Someone to do Steps 1-3 in reverse when it's time to take the angels down.

In the past the angels have been installed about a week to ten days before Christmas and taken down in mid-January.

### **Religious Education**

#### Mary, Light of Learning

Do you ever wonder how the daily Scripture readings are chosen? These readings, taken from what is known as the common lectionary, are organized by the Liturgical Calendar in a three year cycle. So if you listen to, read, or attend Mass daily you would have heard the entire good news of the Bible in that time. This approach follows the arc of Christ's life in the Annunciation, Nativity, Presentation in the Temple, Epiphany, Baptism, Public ministry, Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension, and Descent of the Holy Spirit as our Advocate. Through the Lectionary we are reminded of these events in their seasonal liturgical celebrations. In the ordinary time outside of these seasons, we memorialize the lives of saints as well. This narrative portrays the life of the Holy Family with Mary, the Mother of God, at its center. We learn from them the *Joyful* memories of the Holy Family and the Infant Jesus, the *Luminous* acts of His public ministry, the agony and *Sorrow* of her son's passion and death and the *Glorious* accomplishment of Christ's Resurrection, Ascension, and the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

We honor in the liturgical calendar for this month of September the Blessed Virgin Mary more than at any other time of year. The Maternity BVM is celebrated on September 8; the Holy Name of Mary is remembered on September 12; and our Lady of Sorrows is venerated on September 15. Saturdays throughout the year, when there is no other feast or commemoration of a saint, are otherwise devoted to Mary. All four Saturdays this year, this month, are designated as the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The scriptural readings on these days recount many of the events in Jesus's life as Mary's child. As they are venerated in the *Mysteries of the Rosary*, this might be a good time to pray the Rosary.

The accounts of the Holy Family—Jesus, Mary and Joseph—are presented mostly in the gospel of Luke. They describe the fulfillment of the various religious rituals that a devout Jewish family would follow. Mary would present her child, Jesus, in accordance with the religious rules. The family travels to Jerusalem for the Passover. They always return to their home in Nazareth, Galilee. In Luke 2: 39, which is the story of Jesus' Presentation in the Temple & Prophecy of Simeon, we are informed that "when they had fulfilled all of the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee in their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom and the favor of God was upon him." A few years later, when the family was on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, we hear of the agonizing Loss of Jesus in the Temple. As a parent, can you imagine the anxieties and fears over such a loss? Can you imagine their relief when they found him back in Jerusalem preaching to the priests in the temple? Luke 2: 41-52 reports that "everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and answers." His mother, Mary, treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and Man." Later, the adult Jesus returns to his home in Galilee as part of his Teaching Ministry. Friends and family ask "...Where did this man get such wisdom and what mighty deeds are done by him? Is he not the carpenter's son and is not his mother Mary?" Despite their amazement, he was furiously driven from his home in Nazareth, as related in Matt 13:55, Mark 6: 3 and Luke 4: 23.

Every commemoration of Mary is a celebration of the events of our salvation in which she is the mother of Christ our savior. What good mother doesn't worry about her child's education? Isn't every mother her child's first and best teacher? Isn't she most likely to check that homework and other assignments are completed? Isn't she likely to be the parent to arrange for special tutoring and participation in other special activities? Isn't she, like the example of Mary before her, the one to scrupulously arrange for instruction of her children in her faith? Isn't every mother's unfailing and never-ending concern that her child "grow in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and Man?"

St Joseph, for whom our parish is named, is the protector of the Holy Family. He is the quintessential role model for all fathers for all time. Isn't Mary the heart of her holy family? Isn't every mother—like Mary—the Light of Learning for her family?

God of our fathers and mothers, today we mark Catechetical Sunday, the day we recommit ourselves to teaching and forming disciples to continue your work in this world.

In the beginning, you created man to please you and offer you companionship. We turned away from you without knowing the great love you had for us. Help us to recapture that understanding of your love for us and for creation. Give us wisdom to hand on to the next generation that love you freely give us.

We ask all that is good to come upon our catechetical leaders and the people whom they lead to the faith.

We ask all this in the name of the primary teacher of the faith,

Jesus the Christ.

### SEPTEMBER 19<sup>th</sup>, CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated the *third Sunday in September as Catechetical Sunday.* Those whom the community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

### Why do we have a special day set aside to commission Catechists?

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life . . . her inner growth and correspondence with God's plan depend essentially on catechesis" This ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity, which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others. 
### RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY UPCOMING EVENTS SEPTEMBER thru NOVEMBER 2021

September 23 - October 31, 2021 -40 Days for Life Campaign takes place along the public way in front of Planned Parenthood's Flossmoor facility located at 19831 Governor's Highway, Flossmoor, IL. This abortion clinic opened in 2017 and performs abortions two or three days a week. It is critical now more than ever that we stand together united in prayer. In Illinois, almost 40,000 baby's lives are lost to abortion each year. We have the tremendous opportunity to come together in prayer for expectant mothers to choose life and to pray for those deceived by lies. There is power in prayer. We must be prayer warriors for those little ones who cannot speak for themselves. Please join with us in this nationwide, peaceful, prayerful effort to save lives. We have participated for many years in this peaceful, prayerful support for the Culture of Life, holding signs provided to us with various messages in support of Life. Let us pray...


Good and gracious God, you blew into our nostrils the breath of life. You are the One to whom we owe our very existence.

### Saint of the Day

# St. Matthew's Feast Day September 21

Matthew must have been surprised when Jesus walked up to him and said, "Follow me." He probably fell off the stool in his customs booth! Matthew, also known as Levi, was a tax collector in the town of Capernaum. Most tax collectors were hated by the Jews because they worked for the Romans, who had conquered the land. A tax collector could use his position honestly or dishonestly. The temptation to use the position to become rich was great. Now do you think the choice of Matthew was surprising?

Yet Jesus chose a tax collector to follow him, to learn from him, and to go out and spread the Good News to others. The call from Jesus was more powerful than the call of wealth. Matthew left his work as tax collector. He invited Jesus to a din-



ner where other tax collectors (publicans) and sinners were gathered. The Pharisees were upset when they saw this, and they said to the disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus heard them and replied, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, `I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous, but sinners." (Matthew 9:9–13.)

We know nothing other than that about Matthew from the Scriptures, but we do know that Matthew preached the Good News of Christ, and at least part of the Gospel attributed to him was first written for the Jewish converts in Palestine. There is some uncertainty about where Matthew preached and where and how he died. Some say Matthew went to Persia; some say Syria and Greece, while others say Ethiopia. Yet we can learn much from Matthew. He was a man who knew quite well the power of money. He knew the comfort it could ensure, the recreation it could buy, the luxury it could provide. But he was wise enough to know what it could not do. Money could never give him that sense of peace deep inside. It could never befriend him when he was lonely or give him the strength and courage to go on when all else seemed lost. Money could never buy him forgiveness or love. 
