



From Our Associate Pastor

My Dear and Precious Friends,

As we celebrate this Solemn Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, it is with a very heavy heart that I write to you today to announce my early retirement due to my failing health. On May 18th, I celebrated the 40th Anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood. Our church was filled with



parishioners, family and friends for the celebration of my Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving, at which time I promised I was "not done yet." Two days later, the Vicar for Priests and our Archdiocesan Nurse Practitioner met with me to tell me that they believed the time had come for me to retire early so that I could take better care of myself. I love my priesthood, and it breaks my heart to know that even though I was not ready to retire, people thought it was time for me to turn the page and enter this new chapter of my life. Over the past three years I have fallen deeply in love with our new parish family. Many people have thanked me for being such a powerful example for them as they struggle with their own disabilities. I have assured Father Edmond that he may continue to schedule me as much as he needs to for Masses and the celebration of other Sacraments. I continue to be blessed with the help of our parish ministers and sacristans, and especially our Acolyte Jim Cameron and most especially on weekends when my dear friend and care giver Deacon Gary Michael can assist me in getting to and from church and on the altar for Mass. I thank God on my knees for the gift of my dear friend Gary Michael who visits with me every day and helps me take care of myself and my home. Thanking God for all of this love and good help in my life, I hope to continue my priestly ministry as best I can for many years to come because, as I said at my anniversary Mass, "I'm not done yet!"

Because of my inability to safely navigate stairs, I have never lived or kept an office at our parish rectory. I will be continuing to live and work from my private home in Worth. It is a 20 to 30 minute drive to and from our parish so, like many of you, I must commute in order to "get to work." That work is by God's grace my vocation, the love of my life. Please pray for me that I will continue to have the strength and grace that I need to, as Saint Paul wrote to



Timothy, "run the good race." In my retirement, I plan on expanding my online ministry, including a return to "Father Ralph's Neighborhood." New episodes will begin to drop in July, so I hope that you will subscribe to my YouTube channel so that you will not miss any of my episodes. I am also always available to talk to you over the phone. I remember the telephone being my mother's life line to her family and friends, and I would be overjoyed if you would keep my number on "speed dial": (773) 203-2330. While I have a box filled with your loving good wishes from my Anniversary Mass which I read over and over again, I look forward to reading your emails, cards, and letters, and to talking with you when you call. Until then, may the Grace and Peace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God our Father, and the Communion of their Most Holy Spirit be with you all! May the Lord send his angels to watch over you and all those you love! And always remember how very precious you are to me and how very much I love you!




ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)



Religious Education for All Ages

Solemnity of Sts Peter & Paul

This weekend's liturgy is interesting in a manner of speaking. It is recognized as the *vigil*, on a Sunday, of the solemnity of the feast of Sts Peter & Paul on the following Monday. It has the nature of preparation for the actual feast. A solemnity is a feast day of the highest rank. It honors a mystery of our Faith, like the Trinity; an event in the life of Jesus, Mary or Joseph; or an important saint. If I am not mistaken the only saints recognized in this way are John the Baptist and Peter & Paul. A solemnity can replace the celebration of Sunday's liturgy



in the liturgical calendar outside of Advent, Lent & Eastertime. The prayers and readings for the Liturgy of the Word are different for the vigil and the feast. The actual feast of these two pillars of the Apostolic Age remembers their martyrdom in Rome. They were executed by orders of the Roman emperor Nero. He was celebrating the tenth year of his reign, an anniversary which historians noted "featured much bloodshed, as usual." Nero was also conducting a bit of urban renewal to clear slums for one of his beautification projects, Christians would be an easy target to blame for the deliberately set conflagration. It would be a reasonable excuse to purge this religious sect that was gaining traction in the city. This day is a public holiday in Rome as P&P are venerated as patron saints of the city. St Irenaeus credits this pair with founding the Church in Rome. Big deal this is indeed.

As you know, Simon bar Jonah's name was changed by Jesus. Cephas is the Aramaic word for stone and its Greek and Latin counterpart is Petra or Peter. He was the rock, the cornerstone upon which Jesus built the Church. He founded the church in Antioch before moving westward to the imperial capital of Rome. Antioch at that time was the third largest city in the Roman empire after Rome and Alexandria, Egypt. It was a regional capital, hub of trade routes and the cradle of early Christianity. The name 'Christian' was first applied to followers of Christ's 'Way' in Antioch.

While their post-Resurrection lives were intertwined, they did not know each other beforehand. Simon Peter was among the first disciples called by Jesus. Saul/Paul was, by his own description, a "Pharisee's Pharisee." He was enthusiastically persecuting early Christians. Paul had his personal encounter with the risen Christ on his way to Damascus about 34 AD. This was the city to which Christians had fled after the martyrdom of Stephen. Paul was a witness to and participant in this murder. Would you easily accept the authenticity of Paul's change of heart after such behavior?

The events in today's second reading from the first chapter of the letter to the Galatians record Paul's conversion, his sojourn to Arabia, his return to and then flight from Damascus and then a trip to Jerusalem to meet with Cephus (Simon Peter). This is the first account of how their paths crossed. Peter and Paul each had a different apostolate. This is a fancy word for the mission of an Apostle. It is now used to describe general evangelizing efforts. Peter was an original Apostle ministering to those raised in Judaic traditions. Paul, by his own account, was the Apostle to the Gentiles, the rest of the world.

The timelines of their early interactions are inconsistent and the details are sketchy. Allusions to their meetings nearly 14 years after the first are reported in Acts 15 & chapter 2 of Paul's Letter to the Galatians. Sometime in the years 47 to 50 AD Peter traveled to Antioch to visit Paul. This was the "Incident at Antioch." The simmering issue was the matter of whether Jewish law pertained to Gentile converts. The Law of Moses specified certain dietary practices, Sabbath prohibitions and circumcision. Although a requirement of the Abrahamic covenant, circumcision was regarded as barbaric by the mores of the Greco-Roman world. In Galatians 2-11 Paul harshly "opposes Peter to his face because he is wrong." It sounds like they needed arbitration or mediation. Paul and his travel buddy Barnabas then traveled to Jerusalem to discuss this matter with the full council of Jerusalem, the 'pillars of the Church.' They were Peter, James the Just and John. This controversy was resolved with the relaxation of the requirements of Jewish law for Gentile converts. Everybody affirmed that salvation comes from our Lord and Savior, Jesus.

Paul returned to Antioch before embarking on his second missionary journey. In our time, the remarkable frequency and extent of his travels would earn him an upgrade to luxury accommodations. Unbeknownst to them, the countdown had begun on their reunion. The author of the Letter 2 Peter 3:16 describes Paul's letters as 'scripture.' This reference is rare praise and affirmation of Paul's influence. Scholars debate whether the illiterate Peter was the actual author; they also disagree if this letter was written before the deaths of P&P. In any event, by the early 60s AD both were converging on their final earthly destination. They had been 'summoned' to Rome to eventually 'testify' on behalf of Christ. Jesus before His Ascension, chronicled in Acts 1: 8, promised to confer the "power of the Spirit" upon them so that they would be "witnesses for Me in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth. " The word for 'witness' in the Greek text of this book is 'martyros.' A martyr's testimony is evidence of the good news of the Gospel given with his or hers--- life's blood.


