From Our Pastor

THE CROSS AS OUR ONLY BOAST!

Dear parish family,

The first reading portrays Jerusalem as a nursing mother, comforting and restoring the health of its citizens, leading to a rebirth where prosperity flows like the bountiful milk she provides. Where people see death and destruction, the Lord sees rebirth and rejoicing.

The cross manifests a similar contradiction. The cross was symbol of shame and death, yet through the death of Jesus has become the centerpiece of Christian glory. St Paul reflects on this paradox in his first Epistle to the Corinthian church, written merely 20 years after the crucifixion of Jesus (1Co 1:21-25)

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demands signs and Greeks desires wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Today's second reading begins with a bold declaration from St Paul:

"May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

In a world that glorifies power, prestige, and personal achievement, Paul flips the script. The cross has become the means of our salvation. Paul rejects religious pride, especially the kind that boasts in external rituals. To boast in the cross is to embrace humility, to acknowledge that we are saved not by our works, but by the Christ's sacrifice. This is a radical reorientation of values. The world's priorities – status, wealth, self-glory- no longer hold sway. It's not a withdrawal from the world, but about living in it with a transformed heart.

The scripture readings for this Sunday remind us that we all share in the ministry and mission of Jesus. As we share our faith with others, we become missionary disciples of God's love for the world. We are called to be missionaries to everyone around us.

As members of God's family, we need one another and must work so that the Kingdom of God lives not only in our hearts but in our world.

As Jesus chooses the 72 disciples to go ahead of him in preparing the way of the Lord, we are also called to continue this world of witnessing and proclaiming God's love, healing and freedom to all whom we meet. Communicating the reality of the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven is our mission objective as followers and disciples of Jesus. This is not an easy task for there will be rejection, hostility, and pain but also filled with joy and hope. God's comfort always leads us in this mission and we never travel alone for God is with us. "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." (Luke 10:1-12)

We are called to gather the people, the greatest and the least to hear God's word and to share at His table of welcome where we all come with our hopes and dreams that can make this world a better place for all people. As we celebrate the birthday of our nation, the lesson of working together and finding a place at the table for the greatest and least among us is made clearer.

Religious Education for All Ages

Neither a doubter nor a skeptic be

Summertime and the living is easy. An effortless time for celebrations. You may have missed Indian Christians' Day on the Indian subcontinent on July 3. This great holiday honors the liturgical feast of St Thomas the Apostle. He is in the shadow of the dazzling solemnity of those two great pillars of our faith, Peter & Paul. Tom is underrated for all his accomplishments and frequent flyer miles.

Contrary to popular belief, 'Thomas' does not mean "doubting or skeptic" but 'twin' in Aramaic. He is oft referred to as Didymus, which is the Greek version of this word. Whose twin was he? Thomas is featured in the many of the 13 texts of the Nag Hammadi Library. This is a collection of early Christian and heretic Gnostic manuscripts bound in papyrus in the Egyptian town of the same name at the big curve of the upper Nile. They were found sealed in ceramic jars in 1945 by a local farmer. Archaeologists are now leaning to the idea that they may have belonged to a nearby monastery founded by one of the original Desert Fathers, Pachomius. They were buried after St Athanasius condemned the use of non-canonical books when he was on his anti-heretical rage in 367 AD. These manuscripts likely were part



of the library's reference section. The most prominent of these texts is the "Gospel of Thomas." It is not a narrative account of the life of Jesus. Nearly 80% of this text comprises quotations and parables that appear in the four canonical gospels. This document, along with the other manuscripts, suggest that Thomas may have been the twin of one of Jesus' cousins. Or not.

Thomas was certainly the Apostle who was scattered farthest across the globe. His first missionary stop was Edessa in what is now northeast Turkey in the late 30s AD. Early church historians, such as Eusebius in the 330s AD, describe the mission of Thomas and Bartholomew to northeast Persia and northwest India in the 40s AD. Thomas fled a threatened attack in the company of a Jewish merchant to the Malabar coast of southwestern India in ~ 50 AD. Although Malabar was the center of his efforts, Thomas is reputed to have visited Indonesia and China from here. Scholars have even studied a group of tribes in landlocked Paraguay and Peru who claimed that the Apostle Tome preached to them. It is safe to say that the 'Churches of the East,' such as the Syriac, Persian, Assyrian, Chaldean and Syro-Malabar, traditionally owe their historical foundation to Thomas. Many priests from the Syro-Malabar Rite now serve in parishes in our rural heartland. According to Syrian Christian tradition, Thomas was killed in a dispute near Chennai in ~70 AD. Tom was buried on the spot. The local king was upset that Thomas had converted his family. Can you imagine the surprise in the early 1500s when Portuguese explorers found a cemetery and chapel with signs of the Nasrani "St Thomas cross" at the carefully tended tomb of St Thomas? Marco Polo is said to have visited Tom's grave in the late 1200s on his travels. On this site the Portuguese built the Cathedral of San Tome in 1523. According to Indian tradition by decree of an early Christian king of India some of Tom's relics began their return journey to the Middle East. A chapel was built in Edessa over the interment. Some of the relics eventually continued onward to Patmos at the Monastery of St John and Ortona on Italy's west coast. Tom was a well-traveled guy by any measure.

The prominence of an Apostle is often given by the number of quotations in Gospel. Thomas appears late in John 11:16 after Lazarus' death. The apostolic entourage was en route to the defining events of Holy Week. The Apostles did not want to go to Jerusalem but Tom insisted "let us go so that we die with Him." A few chapters later Tom asks Jesus, "Lord, we do not know where you go, so how can we know the way?" After the crucifixion and Resurrection (John 20: 24 on), Thomas earns his 'doubting' sobriquet.

"Unless I see the [wounds], I will not believe." The Risen Christ scolds Tom "because you see me you believe, but blessed are they who have not seen but believe." Jesus honors us and our faith.

A popular story attributed to Joseph of Arimathea places Thomas, transported from India, to the tomb of Mary. While not present at her death, he was the only Apostle to witness her Assumption into heaven. In an inversion of his 'doubting Thomas story' the other Apostles were understandably skeptical of his account. Their disbelief was shattered when Tom produced her belt ('girdle') that had fallen upon her ascent. Such chronicles preserved in the Nag Hammadi library were rendered apocryphal if not heretical by Pope Gelasius in the late 400s. Nevertheless one cannot doubt the influence of Thomas.




