BITTERS

Most cooks know how to skillfully blend the basic taste sensations to create bitterness, rage, food that is delightfully pleasing as well as nourishing. The tongue is the seat of most human taste receptors that determine the flavors of food. Primary sensations are sweet, sour, bitter, salty, and savory (umami). Aristotle ~ 320 BC described only sweetness or bitterness. How tastes change! Sensations of taste can gauge different foods' nutritional value. Bitterness is characterized by a sharp, unpleasant and disagreeable flavor. Dark, leafy greens, coffee and chocolate are examples. It serves as a natural warning against potentially toxic substances generally found on the leaves of inedible plants. A heightened sensitivity to bitterness would theoreti-

Get rid of all anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Ephesians 4:31 (NLT)

cally give one an advantage in avoiding potential poisons. For you omnivores out there, consider this. A vegetarian diet exposes one to leaves, unripe fruits and bark that have comparatively high levels of toxins as compared to meat. Ethanol in alcoholic beverages is bitter as are hops in beer and gentian in bitters. The gin & tonic in a 'G&T' moderates the bitterness of the quinine in the tonic.

Bitters are an alcoholic concoction of aromatic botanicals for known for their bitter flavor. They were developed originally as medicines for a variety of ailments but are sold now as digestive aids. Popular brands, such as Angostura, Peychaud's, Compari, cygnar, Jagermeister, and Fernat, find their find use as cocktail flavorings to balance sour and sweet tastes. Bitterness is often confused with the effect of alkalinity. The opposite of acidity is slightly bitter. It can reduce stomach acidity and mitigate heartburn. Do you have a packet of TUMS in your pocket? Some alkaline water is actually touted for its hydration properties. My image of alkalinity is a pile of bleached bones of cattle carcasses strewn alongside alkali flats. For pilgrims on the trail to Oregon or Mormon Deseret or California, the availability of water was often a life-limiting resource. There is absolutely nothing life-sustaining about bitterness.

The OT is full of what psychologists describe as the ravages of bitterness. It is understandable that people allow their inner life to be consumed by pain, grief, oppression, and anger. There is genuine distress that arises from a sense of being ignored. Even to have the efforts of one's life invalidated can result in real suffering. Is it not human to bear a grudge? Can a cherished animosity simmer for years before boiling over? Was Job embittered by his unwarranted trials? Was Joseph angry at his treatment by his own brothers? Did Esau ever get over the deception that robbed him of his birthright? Were his parents, Jacob & Rebecca, ever resigned when he turned away from God and His covenant when he chose to marry Hittite women? Their faith in God transformed their reaction to their unpalatable circumstances.

Real and literal bitterness accompanied the Israelite exodus from Egyptian bondage. For these weary pilgrims, their first oasis on their path was the "bitter" waters of Marah. All forms of this Hebrew word convey bitterness. Inevitable grumbling ensued. Even their life of slavery was preferable to aimless wandering in the harsh desert. With God's instruction, Moses cast wood into th0se bitter springs thereby 'sweetening' them for consumption. Doesn't this form of water treatment foreshadow the saving power of the Cross? It illustrated a test of faith. Salvation from Egyptian captivity does not exempt the redeemed from trials. Solutions to our problems still come from God. After all God had made a solemn covenant with His Chosen. "If you will listen carefully to the voice of the Lord, I will put none of the afflictions on you that I put on the Egyptians. For I am the Lord who heals you."

A good shepherd knows that his flock thrives on goodness. Life can be harsh struggling to contend with inclement weather, scarce water and sparse pastures. The essence of his pastoral care knows that the living springs of sweet water sustain those entrusted to his watchfulness. He knows where the sources of good water for his thirsty flock are and which to avoid. His solicitous concern can transform the grumblings of a stomach poisoned by bitterness into a joyfully healthy heart saved from the pain of its distress. The poor flock relies on their shepherd to deliver them to such healing. There is an implicit trust that demands that the shepherd protect his flock from such trials.

'Wormwood' is the name of the central tempter in CS Lewis' "Screwtape Letters." Wormwood, a bitter herb, is the dark star in Rev 8:11 that poisoned water with bitterness. Our faith must be strong and our resolve firm to be protected from all anxiety and delivered from the evil of such tests. May our obedience to God be unwavering so that we do not succumb to such toxic rancor. Michael Cap ©2025




