MAKING BETTER CHOICES

Summer invites us to slow down and savor life. With most children out of school, families often venture out, finding joy and renewal through travel. Vacations can offer a much-needed escape from the pressure of routines and responsibilities. While planning a trip takes effort, spontaneous adventures can be just as meaningful and refreshing. We naturally seek new experiences and ways to nourish our mental wellness.

But that balance can easily shift. In our desire to care for others, we often overlook our own well-being. This isn't a critique of anyone's intentions—it's a reminder that setting boundaries and honoring personal care isn't selfish. It's essential.

We live in complex times, surrounded by constant activity and uncertainty. It's easy to take on more than we can carry, forgetting to prioritize what fuels us. That's why summer—or any seasonal transition—can be a powerful invitation to reset, revisit our goals, and gently realign. Caring for others starts with caring for ourselves. By practicing self-compassion—offering ourselves the same kindness, understanding, and grace we give to others—we create space for compassion to flow inward before it can flow outward.

Dr. Kristin Neff beautifully defines self-compassion as “doing a U-turn and giving yourself the same compassion you'd naturally show a friend when you're struggling or feeling badly about yourself.” That means offering ourselves kindness, understanding, and patience. It's pausing to evaluate where we are emotionally and spiritually, and embracing the space to reflect, recharge, and reconnect with what brings us joy.

Often, in our busyness, we drift from our spiritual anchor—we drift from God. Yet reconnection doesn't require anything grand. It might come through nature walks, attending Mass, joining a prayer group, praying with family, or carving out time for retreat. These practices restore us, grounding our hearts and nourishing our souls.

This weekend's Gospel from Luke 10:38–42 offers a gentle but profound reminder. As Martha becomes consumed with serving, Jesus tells her that Mary “has chosen the better part” by listening to His word. It's not a dismissal of Martha's efforts, but an invitation to remember the deeper call. Service, planning, and preparation matter—but so does spiritual attentiveness. When we choose to pause and listen, we open ourselves to the presence of God.

Making better choices begins with compassion—for ourselves and others. True renewal comes when we align our decisions with joy, spiritual connection, and emotional health. So ask yourself: What's missing in your life that is quietly asking for attention? How can you nurture yourself more fully? And what will help you nourish your spiritual life?

Change is rarely easy. Letting go often involves grief and courage. But life moves quickly. Summer invites us outside—into the sun, into rest, into grace. Let this season be the time you choose kindness toward yourself, renewal for your spirit, and openness to where God is gently calling you.

Religious Education for All Ages

Sacramentum

Cultural appropriation is both common and good. It best captures the spirit of the proverb “*imitation is the most sincere form of flattery.*” Our word sacrament is an example. Its word ‘sacrament’ was lifted from the Latin word ‘*sacramentum.*’ In the Roman world, ‘*sacramentum*’ was a special oath. Its root, ‘*sacra,*’ refers to the promise of all oaths in those days. It means a solemn pledge ‘to the gods.’ ‘*Sacra*’ is the source of our word ‘*sacred.*’ Its suffix, ‘*ment,*’ referred to the fulfillment of the promise with purposeful dedication and consecration. It had two applications.

The first was the solemn oath of a Roman soldier pledging his faithful duty to the emperor’s service. In a legal setting, contracts were bound by the pledge of both parties to honor the agreement. In both cases the bond to guarantee compliance was the ‘*sacramentum.*’ For the soldier his bond was his life. In a court of law, some sort of monetary surety was substituted for the *sacramentum*. To this day disputants post such a bond to ensure compliance with the judicial decision. Alleged criminals, however, no longer have to post a cash bond after their arrest to guarantee their appearance in court for their trial of their offense.

Sacraments are, of course, the visible sign of God’s grace working within us. They are not symbols at all but the actual channel through which His grace is poured into us. They are essential to our spiritual life. Just like the necessities of our physical life, sacraments support our spiritual journey. They are grouped into analogous categories that reflect our initiation into the spiritual life of Christ, our healing after trials, and vocational guidance. We are initiated into spiritual life with the sacraments of Baptism, the Eucharist and Confirmation. Just as a newborn is bathed after birth, we are welcomed with Baptism’s cleansing. The stain of our original sin is washed away. How long can you survive without food? Not very. The Eucharist is our spiritual nourishment. A healthy life requires proper nutrition that requires good food. You are what you eat. The body and blood of Christ allow us to flourish in grace and imitation of Him. Confirmation completes this initiation. We expect our faith to gain from the increase in our knowledge, understanding, proper counsel, wisdom, piety, reverence for God’s awesomeness and courage. We look forward to the enhancement of these gifts to blossom into the *fruit of the Holy Spirit*. After our initiation, we are obliged to serve as witnesses, to testify, to our faith amid the temptations and subtle oppression of our secular world.

Is our physical body always free of ailments and disease? Of course not. So too our soul suffers from afflictions. Sin is our conscious turning away from God and what we know are right and proper and good. We can make ourselves physically ill when we try to justify immoral behavior. The sacrament of reconciliation restores us to communion with God and one another. Did your mom repeatedly insist that you wash your filthy hands before meals? You wouldn’t want to contaminate your nourishment would you? Frequent washing is a cleansing barrier to the sinister pathogens that await to infect us. This sacrament of confession is our spiritual hygiene to keep our soul healthy. Sometimes prevention is not enough. Healing often requires good medicine to restore our vitality. The sacrament of anointing of the sick provides us with the spiritual balm in such moments. The holy chrism is an emollient that soothes our soul. Its active ingredient, the holy chrism, is formulated from olive oil, balsam and myrrh. The Romans used olive oil as an all-purpose salve to heal wounds and enhance one’s health. Anointing of the sick prepares us for recovery. We can, with its saving grace, be restored to life. Or it can ease our soul into its eternal reward.

What life is truly complete without some sort of guidance? Aren’t we looking for direction on how we fit into our community? Aptitude tests can discern our strengths and abilities and preferences for what we do in life. The benefit of good counseling can guide us along our path. The remaining two sacraments, holy orders & matrimony, preserve and infuse our Church. In response to a vocational call, some are called to be ministers preserving the Apostolic succession of the priesthood. On the other hand, some of us are called to form a family loyal to our faith.

There remains an element of an oath in our sacraments. If we were initiated as infants, our parents or sponsors likely voiced our baptismal vows. Confirmation as a young adult allows us to consciously pledge our oath to be ‘soldiers of Christ.’ At the Easter vigil and during Eastertime we are given the opportunity to renew our baptismal vows. How faithful are you to your promises?

Legend tells us that St. Peter asked Jesus this question on the outskirts of Rome. And we know where Jesus went in response to His Father's will.

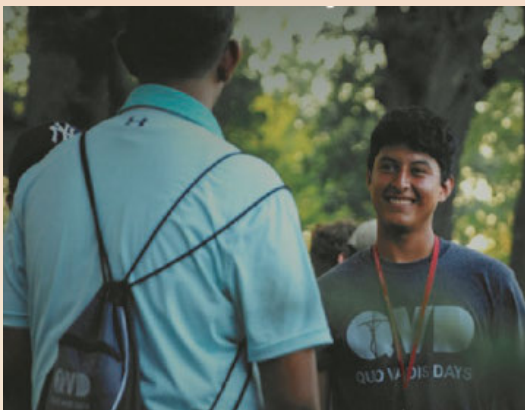
