

Religious Education for All Ages

A little dab will do ya

Do you have a clue to the key to everlasting life? What do we have to ingest at the very least to ensure a long one? The essentials, according to medical doctors and nutritionists, are wheat, grapes and olives. These are foodstuffs that have supplied the essence of nutrition since prehistoric times. In the 'Cradle of Civilization' in the Ancient Near East (ANE), they were the staple of agriculture. Essential nourishment has always been as simple as sampling the fruits of the vine, the olive tree and a cereal grass.



In the bible grapes and wheat have been long prized for their reliable sustenance. Olive is the underrated one of those three core plant foods in the Mediterranean diet. Eternally a symbol of longevity, the olive offers demonstrable benefits of reduced risk of all-causes mortality, stroke and cardiovascular events. More of the olive is consumed in its liquid form as an oil pressed from the crushed fruit. The olive is actually a multi-purpose star. It can be a primary food; secondary condiment; the primary ingredient in cosmetics, pharmaceuticals and soaps; and an easily flammable fuel. It is chock full of anti-oxidants & anti-microbials.

In historical accounts, olives are almost always mentioned only in the context of its oil. So what was its practical use? Oil for lamps for illumination. For ancient Greek athletes and Roman gladiators, olive oil was a healing emollient. Its anti-oxidants were actually a rudimentary antibiotic for those pesky sword wounds. In the ANE scented oils were a customary element of personal hygiene and a gesture of welcome. Oil softened the skin in the hot, dry climate. Perfumed oil was applied to the face after washing to refresh. To soothe and show special honor and respect to guests, such oil was applied to their feet. Jesus and His Apostles noted the lavish devotion of the unnamed repentant woman who anointed His feet. In John's gospel Mary of Bethany anointed the Lord with perfume and wiped his feet with her hair. Those possessed by demons were anointed after their exorcism. The sick were anointed. Perfumed ointments were especially reserved for the dead. That was the assignment of the women at the empty tomb.

In the OT, oil is mentioned, according to Strong's Concordance, nearly 70 times. In this context oil is always associated with the verb 'anoint.' This word comes to us from its Latin root. The interlinear Bible describes its equivalent cousins in Hebrew and Greek with the same, unwavering meaning. 'Anoint' simply means 'to rub with oil.' 'Smear' would be a better action word. This implied that something was wiped or stroked with a hand. The pressed oil of olives is fluid enough but surely messy to smear. It leaves a mark.

The first instance of 'anoint with oil' occurs in early in the bible in Genesis 28. Jacob, fleeing the wrath of his brother Esau, falls asleep on a stone near a place where his grandfather Abram stayed on his way. This is the scene of Jacob's dream of his ladder stretching between Heaven & Earth. God, reigning at the top, promises the land of Canaan to Jacob. When he awakes, Jacob 'anoints the stone with oil.' One chapter later we learn that Jacob names this location 'Beth-El' which means 'place or house of God.' This name and this ritual signify that it is a sacred space that Jacob has consecrated to God. A few chapters later when Jacob returns through Beth-El with his big family, he gets the official news that he has been renamed Israel. Who was he to argue as Israel means 'wrestles with God?' Jacob had previously spent an entire night contending with Him.

This inaugurated the tradition that involves the deliberate application of special oil to set apart a place, person or object for sacred service. It is a permanent marking of that which was divinely chosen to belong exclusively to the Lord. Anointing made these things most holy. It established a pattern to consecrate priests and sanctuary and holy vessels. Exodus 30: 22 -33 provides the divinely prescribed recipe for this particular mix: myrrh, cinnamon, calamus, cassia and alive oil. The stories of objects consecrated in this way are given in Exodus. Prophets are often routinely—but not always— anointed, Their stories are chronicled in such passages as1 Kings 19:16 Isaiah 61:1 Kings 9:8, Hosea 8:3 & 1 Sam 16:3; Psalm 89:21 & Chronicles 29:22. Israel's monarchy was founded on anointing: Samuel to Saul then David to Solomon. Oil poured on the head was a tangible sign of God's choice and a consecration of that person to God and His service.

'Messiah' is the name that arises from the action to be 'anointed.' Jesus is the anointed one, the messiah. Christ is the Greek version of this title. It signifies JC as priest, king prophet and the promised redeemer.

Our sacraments preserve this tradition. Chrism leaves an indelible mark of God's grace to bless and strengthen candidates for the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and ordination of priests & bishops. A visit to the sick brings the healing application of extreme unction.




