VANITY OF VANITIES! ALL THINGS ARE VANITY!

Today's Scripture is certainly counter-cultural. It is counter-cultural because it tells us so clearly that the true quality of life in the world is not to be found in money and material possessions.

Today's first reading says that concern for material possessions is vanity. Utter futility. In the second reading, St Paul says: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. And in the Gospel, Jesus says, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

We must enter into the serious considerations to which these Scriptures call us. It is a question of attitude; it is a question of our priorities, a question of what is most important to us, a question of what we are ultimately concerned about, of what principally determines our way of looking at things and our way of acting.

This is not a condemnation of wealth but a new way of relating to possessions. Too often this Gospel might make us defensive as if we are doing something wrong if we seek a well-paying job and have a good home and save enough money for the children's education and one's own retirement. But this is not so. Physically we know that we need adequate food, drink, and shelter. The question is: what attitude do we have toward possessions?

The rich man has a problem that would be the envy of any farmer: a harvest greater than he can handle. Immediately he decides to hoard the entire harvest so that he can "rest, eat, drink, be merry" for many years (Luke 12:19) Note that he repeatedly says, "I shall," assuming that he is in control of the situation. He seems to have ignored the adjective that describes his harvest. As Jesus says, it is a bountiful harvest. A bounty is something that is given generously and received undeservedly. Why did it not occur to him to give generously himself, to share it with others who did not deserve it? What's more, the bountiful harvest was produced by the land, the sun, and the rain. What made him feel entitled to take it all for himself? To share generously from our bounty is to become rich in imitation of God.

You may have heard this story before, but it's worth repeating. An American tourist, traveling to Europe, paid a visit to a famous wise and holy Rabbi who lived there. The American was surprised when he saw how simple the man lived-in a single room with only books and a table and chair. "Rabbi! Where is your furniture?" asked the tourist. "Where is yours?" the rabbi asked. The American tourist answered, "My furniture? I'm only passing through here." The wise rabbi responded: "So am I!"

We are living in a very self-centered society. As Christians can we be an opposing force to this individualistic mentality? Can we work to change the actual situation in society? How can I be a more generous person?

Mrs. Reilly

A parishioner at St. John Neumann recently retired after 45 years of service in the Catholic schools.

Mariann Reilly of Homewood finished her career at Old St. Mary's School in Chicago. Before that, she taught at the former St. Joseph's School from 1980 until it closed in 2017.

"My 37 years at St. Joe's is filled with wonderful memories of the hundreds of students whose lives I touched, the parents who became life-long friends and the faculty who supported me throughout my career," Mrs. Reilly said.

While teaching at St. Joseph's School, Mrs. Reilly founded the pre-school program that operated for 23 years. She started out teaching first grade and also taught third grade.

Mrs. Reilly, who originally taught under the name Mariann Fajman, is a product of Catholic education. She graduated from St. Joseph's School in 1972 and Marian Catholic High School in 1976. Mrs. Reilly holds a degree from Quincy College (now Quincy University), a Franciscan institution.

She was honored as Alumna of the Year at St. Joseph School in 2012.

Mrs. Reilly was part of a long family tradition at St. Joseph's School. Her grandparents, Harry and Florence Thomas, enrolled their children in the school when it opened in 1925. Since then, a family member either attended or worked at the school every year except 1951. Mrs. Reilly's two daughters are St. Joseph School graduates.

THE VANITY OF VANITIES

The book of Ecclesiastes, the source of our first reading this week, is an interesting one. It has been classified as 'Wisdom Literature' in the collection of 'Writings' in the Old Testament. Its title is equally fascinating. "*Ecclesiastes*" is a Greek word whose root actually means "assembly." Recall that the Greek word '*ekklesia*' is used in the New Testament to describe a church, assembly or congregation. How is an assembly associated with wisdom? The opening verse offers a clue however obtusely complex it is. The person called "*Qohelet*" [Q] describes himself as "son of David." Doesn't the famously 'wise' King Solomon fit that description? 'Qohelet' is more of a title than a name. Its root is the Hebrew word 'qaha' which indeed does mean 'assembly.' The Hebrew word 'qahal' is used more often in the context of demanding that the congregation listen intently to what the 'Qohelet' is saying. Thus the 'Qohelet' might be one who assembles students or listeners much as a teacher might. On the other hand, the 'Qohelet' might be the clever one assembling those wise aphorisms. Biblical scholars tell us that 'Ecclesiastes' is the Latin translation of the Greek transliteration of the Hebrew word '*qahal*.' They wrote what they heard. It is not unreasonable to question this explanation as the general tone of this book '*Ecclesiastes*' is both skeptical and ironic. So why shouldn't we? The book highlights contradictions and challenges notions of absolute certainties.



Dang, one might think 'Ecclesiastes' is the product of a post-modern author like Thomas Pynchon rather than our sagacious Solomon who lived ~ 3000 years ago. There is no doubt that the knowledgeable Q aims to provoke dialogue and reflection in his readers. He recognizes the limits of worldly wisdom. His acquired knowledge surely hasn't spared him the disappointment of his thwarted endeavors. His book pours out his pain & frustrations with the distortions and inequalities in life. The only missing lament is his daily struggle, much like the mythical Sisyphus pushing his rock up the hill, to achieve anything worthwhile. The aims of ambition are useless and his attempts are futile. Everything converges to ultimate termination in the dust of our earthly existence. Fatalistically pessimistic? Not at all. Q concludes that the remedy is increased reverence for God's awesomeness. Our respectful reliance on God is the consistent message onward from the book of Genesis before and after the fall. All we have and need comes from God's love for us.

The opening passage introduces us to the word '*vanity*.' This book closes with it as well. This word comes to us from the Latin '*vanitas*' which translates as '*emptiness, a lack of judgment, foolish pride or devoid of substance or content.*' The actual original Hebrew word in the Old Testament is '*habel*' or '*havel*.' This word conveys a sense of *futility to its emptiness*. Mix some of the vowels in this word, as Hebrew is inclined to do, and the result is another meaning that describes vapor or breath. What can be more insubstantial than that? This word only appears in this book, Job & Lamentations.

Modern sensibilities understand *vanity* in a different way. Most gravitate to the image of a dressing table or a fashionable trifle. An essential accessory for the vain-glorious movie star who basks in her illuminated reflection. Isn't the purpose of cosmetics to promote attractiveness? Isn't makeup a decoration to alter or enhance one's appearance? To put '*lipstick on a pig*' is the futile effort to make superficial changes to cosmetically disguise fundamental failings. A dictionary would offer more substance for the definition of *vanity*: "*excessive pride in one's appearance or accomplishments; conceit; the object of one's conceit; and worthlessness, valuelessness & futility.*" In John Bunyan's classic "Pilgrim's Progress" '*Vanity Fair*' is a stop along their way. This perpetual farmer's market offers all sorts of distracting pleasures to tempt the travelers from their metaphorical spiritual journey. How easy indeed is the seduction of *vanity*? Look! A squirrel!

Jane Austen offers her opinion on this matter in her novel of manners, "Pride & Prejudice." She distinguishes '*pride from vanity*.' They are entirely different concepts for her that "are not at all synonymous." "*Pride is what we think of ourselves; vanity is what we would have others think of us.*"

A wise man once said that "no one is as [smart] as one thinks one is." The blank can be filled with "pretty, clever, popular, rich, swift, strong, etc." You get the picture. Can you add any adjectives to this list? This is an irrefutable fact that cannot be denied. It is folly to think otherwise. The essence of *vanity* is to persist in such prideful self-assessment. Pride is one of the deadly sins while *vanity is mere foolishness*. Never let either keep you from your reverent and unquestioning reliance on God. Isn't this the message Q imparted to his assembly? Millennia later he still speaks to us.


