



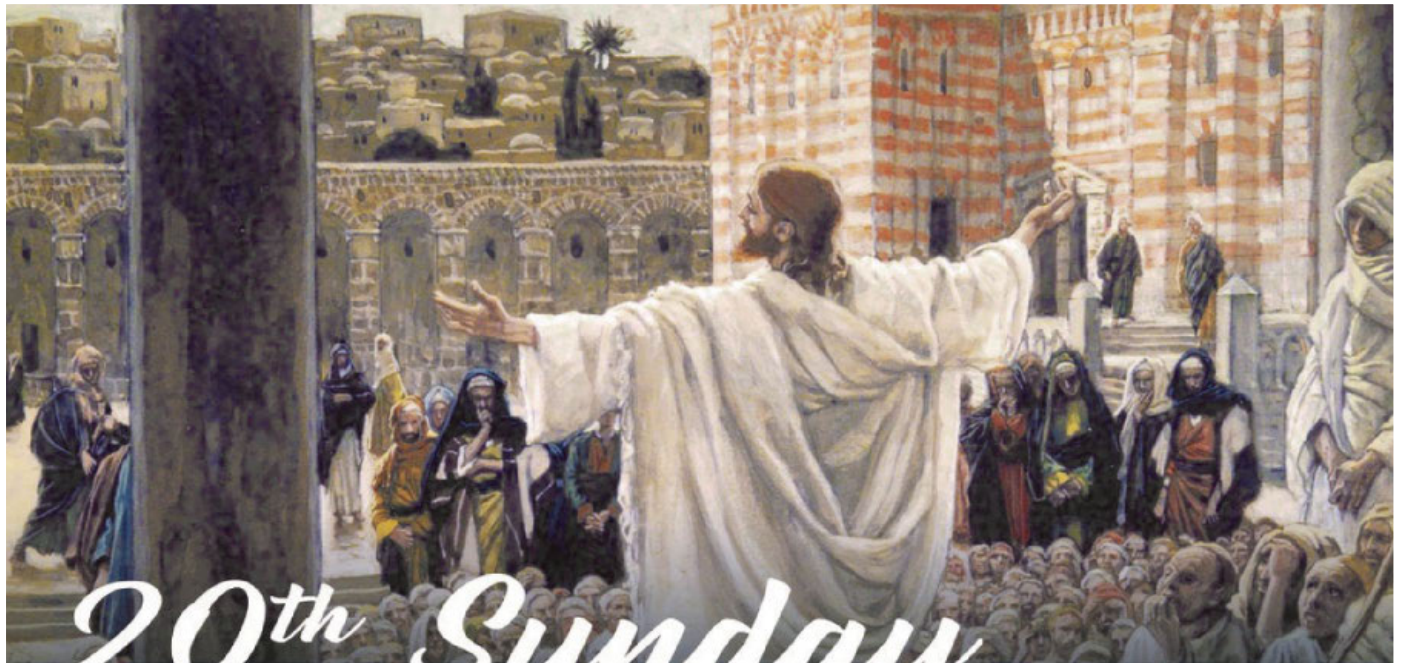

Faith Formation

LORD, COME TO MY AID!

In a world filled with chaos, division, and injustice, it's easy to wonder when evil will end or when healing will begin. Our personal lives can feel just as complicated, filled with moments of confusion, fear, and uncertainty. We've all faced times when life caught us off guard, and we weren't prepared for the challenges ahead. In those dark moments, hope can feel distant, and our faith may falter. We find ourselves going in circles, unsure of which way to turn. It can feel scary, lonely, and overwhelming—especially when we're forced to make difficult decisions that weigh heavily on our hearts.

As we cry out, "Lord, come to my aid," we may feel abandoned, wondering if God hears our prayers. But perhaps the help we seek has already been offered, we just didn't recognize it. I once heard someone say, "God never abandons us. If He doesn't answer, it may be because He knows you already have the strength to find the way." That may not be the answer we were hoping for, but it invites us to reflect: *What does God's aid look like for you?*

This reminds me of the story of the drowning man: A man trapped in a flood prayed for God to save him. He refused help from a neighbor in a truck, a boat, and a helicopter—waiting for divine intervention. After drowning, he asked God why he wasn't saved. God replied, "I sent you a truck, a boat, and a helicopter. What more could I do?"

God's help often arrives through everyday means. In times of crisis, we're given tools—wise counsel, spiritual guidance, and the support of others—to help us endure and grow. Faith calls us to recognize and respond to these gifts.

This weekend's Psalm (40:2–4, 18) offers a powerful image of rescue. The "pit of destruction" and "miry bog" symbolize despair, hardship, or spiritual dryness. Yet God, in His grace, lifts us up, sets our feet on solid ground, and gives us a new song of praise. The psalm reminds us that even in our poverty and need, we can find assurance in **God's attentive care and faithful provision**. He is our help and deliverer.

Life was never meant to be easy. But we are called to persevere, to trust that God will come to our aid, and to see life through the lens of faith. When we do, we begin to see how good God truly is—and how He rescues us, often in ways we least expect.

Religious Education for All Ages

PATRONAGE

Are you one of those fortunate ones to have your personal *patron*? You just might not have the awareness to realize that we all have that good fortune. This word is used in a variety of sub-contexts with the actual meaning varying ever-so-slightly. An artist or writer might have her wealthy or influential supporter. A social function, such as a gala fund-raiser or benefit concert might have its financial sponsor. In a generic sense, an individual, institution or social cause might rely on the wealth and influence of its *patron*. A business, such as a restaurant, depends upon the loyal consumption of its goods & services by its *patrons*. In the olden days a *patron* held the power to release a serf or slave from the chains of service. Are you aware that the US Customs & Immigration Services requires by law a *patron* to vouch for the support of an immigrant who chooses the legally prescribed path to citizenship? This requirement is intended “to reduce the likelihood of the sponsored petitioner from becoming reliant on public assistance.” We all can use a little help on our life’s journey.



Patron, as you might imagine, comes to us from a Latin word whose ultimate root is *pater*, which means father. A father would be truly derelict in his duties if he did not protect, support, defend or advocate on behalf of his children or those entrusted to his care. I suppose that the distiller of the Mexican tequila *Patrón* protects the image, reputation and taste among his competitors of this top shelf spirit. A *patron* saint in our faith is regarded as the heavenly protector and advocate of a nation, place, craft, activity, class, clan or person. Saints quite often are nominated *patron* of the place of their birth or where they performed their ministry. For example, St Rose of Lima is the *patron* saint of gardeners, florists, embroidery and people ridiculed for their piety. By the way, she is also the *patron* saint of Lima, Peru and Santa Rosa, the county seat of Sonoma California. Our Lady of Guadalupe has been the regional *patroness* of Mexico and Latin America by decree of local bishops since the 1700s. St Pope John Paul 2 formally named her *patroness* of the Americas at the turn of this century. In medieval Europe a city might prominently feature some relics of its (adopted) *patron* saint who may have lived and is interred elsewhere. Places settled by Spanish or Portuguese explorers were often named for the saint of the day when these visitors to the New World first landed. Veronica is the *patron* saint of photographers as her veil miraculously received the bloodied imprint of Jesus’ face during His way of the cross. According to our Catechism, one’s “*patron* saint, having already attained the beatific vision of heavenly reward, is able to intercede with God for one’s needs.” This is a different concept than the notion of one’s guardian angel. Your Baptismal name likely honors a saint. You are the namesake of that hallowed one. Have you ever pondered its influence in your life? Are you secretly inspired, if your name is Rose, to be a gardener or florist?

Over the past month we have celebrated the feast days of several saints who have special significance to *all* of Europe. This classification excludes the Apostle James the Great who is the *patron* of Spain. He is venerated during the pilgrimage of ‘The Way’ of Santiago de la Compostela. This journey, which truly funnels travelers from all of Europe, culminates in an extravagant celebration on his feast day, July 25, in Galicia, Spain. Nor does this include St Fermin who is revered in Pamplona, Spain on July 7 with the dangerously festive running of the bulls. Also excluded is San Rocco, AKA Roch, who is honored ~ August 16 in a few small villages in Italy, Glasgow and Istanbul. Their veneration is often an official public holiday and the excuse for a grand old party that often lasts weeks. Got to capture those tourist dollars, doncha know?.

To whom I refer are the *patron* saints of Europe, the entire continent. The summertime saints are St Benedict of Nursia (July 11), St Bridgid of Sweden (July 23) and St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (August 9). The others are Catherine of Sienna (29 April) and Sts Cyril & Methodius (14 February). The first was designated by Pope Paul 6 and the remaining five by St Pope JP 2. These hallowed ones bolstered the perseverance of the Church in Europe. They responded to God’s call in their life in a way that had enormous significance to the vitality of the Church during their time and at their place. Each of them witnessed the action of God’s grace in their life. That fact alone is inspiration enough for us, we who are all ‘saints-in-training.’

We all have the capacity and ability for holiness. Matt Kelly, renowned life coach & author, says “if we walk humbly with God, He will lead us by the hand to exactly who and what we need, to **those people, things and experiences** He has designed and intended for us. This alone will be the cause of our deep fulfillment and happiness.” Who is the *patron* of your life’s masterpiece? Michael Cap© 25

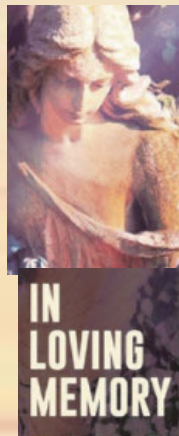


