From Our Pastor

PILOT PROGRAM HELPS PRIESTS ‘WALK’ AS DISCIPLES, SHEPHERDS, STEWARDS

Dear parishioners,

On June 22-27 I participated in the Pilot program “Walking together as Disciples, Shepherds and Stewards” organized by the archdiocese. I have been thinking about writing a summary of the program to share with you. Given that Chicago Catholic published a summary of it in its August 10, 2025 series. I opted to share it with you in this week’s bulletin, in case you didn’t have a chance to read it.

Nineteen priests from across the Archdiocese of Chicago gathered at the University of St. Mary of the Lake June 22-27 to participate in “Walking Together as Disciples, Shepherds and Stewards.”

“From all accounts, the week was a tremendous success” said Cardinal Cupich, who was present at both the opening and closing of the program. “This is very promising as we move forward in this new phase of Renew My Church, which aims at spiritual renewal.”

The formation program, which will be offered to all priests of the archdiocese going forward, had elements of a retreat as well as formation and professional development, according to Father Kenneth Simpson, a retired priest and consultant to Leading in a Renewed Church, and Father Michael Knotek, vicar for the pastoral and professional development of priests. The content of the program centered on the Archdiocese’s Priest Development Model, which focuses on the priests’ gifts and roles as disciples, shepherds and stewards.

As the name suggests, priests learned about leading in a model of synodality, or “walking together” with both clergy and laity, as well as serving as a pastor as the archdiocese moves past the initial phase of the Renew My Church process, the priests explained.

Simpson said the priests in the pilot group were a diverse group, of different ages and experiences and serving in different parts of the archdiocese. All of them appreciated the opportunity to spend time getting to know one another as brother priests, Knotek said, at no cost to them or to their parishes.

Father Larry Lisowski, pastor of Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph Parish, said having a full five days together allowed priests to build deeper relationships.

“The way that the week was crafted is a lot different than perhaps the priest convocation or Priest Day or a vicariate meeting,” he said. “You really spend some quality time listening to the stories of your brother priests, listening to the challenges that we share together in ministry ... and also kind of dreaming. Dreaming about how we can face some of these challenges in positive ways, the future of the church, and considering opportunities for us to reach out to God’s people. So often we can be in our parishes and feel like we’re all alone. It’s great to know that there’s a staff of people that care about us. They really want to listen to us and support us in what we do, and they’re trying to help us to be the good shepherds that we’re called to be.”

The program was developed by a team of priests and lay leaders, using insights gleaned from years of dialogue and assessments from priests, deacons, lay religious leaders and parishioners across the archdiocese, leaders said. The program is funded by the archdiocese’s Generation to Generation capital campaign, and there are plans to expand it to an additional 80 priests by June 2026, with the goal of having all priests participate over the next few years. “It was so inspiring and humbling to see the depth of my brother priests’ joy and engagement throughout the week, Knotek said. “Their vulnerability and openness to new ideas made it impactful for all. I am grateful for the cardinal’s leadership, our team’s preparations and, of course, the generosity of our benefactors. I’m looking forward to the journey ahead.”

On the last night of the program, lay leaders from participants’ parishes were invited for dinner and “meaningful conversation” with their priests about their pastoral leadership and ministry and initial plans for parish evangelization and renewal going forward.

“We were so grateful for this opportunity to meet,” said Dawn Mayer, pastoral associate and parish manager at Holy Family Parish in Inverness. “It was an insightful evening as we heard from our pastor on his experiences as a disciple, shepherd, and steward. To be in a room filled with other parish communities on the same journey was so hopeful as we all work to further the mission.”

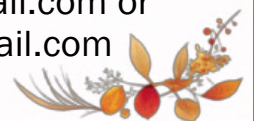

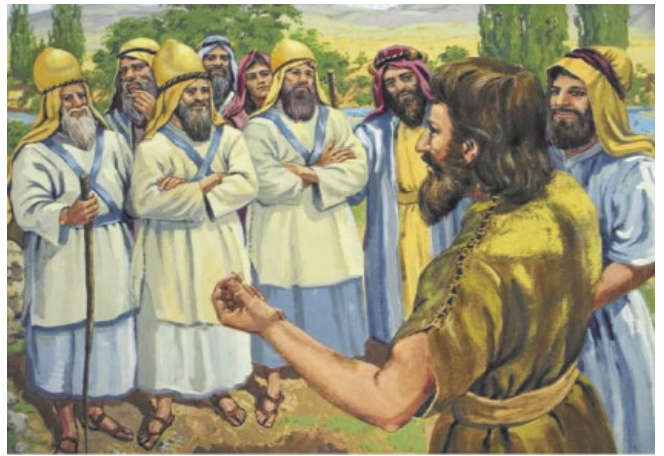

WHO IS THIS GUY?

Summer is bracketed by feasts that honor John the Baptist. Near the summer solstice in June we celebrate his nativity. His impending birth was honored by Mary's visit to her cousin, Elizabeth. We commemorate that call as the 2nd Joyful Mystery of the Rosary. The circumstances of John's birth are reminiscent of Hannah and her son, Samuel (1 Sam 1-2) who was to become one of the great OT prophets. John's story comes to its end later near the end of this month when we commemorate his passion. John had earned the antipathy of king Herod Antipas so his death was predictable. John is the only saint & martyr whose birth and death are remembered in the liturgical calendar.



But who was he? His historical identity as a real person is established by the Roman/Jewish historian Josephus who mentioned him frequently. The Eastern Orthodox know him as *John the Forerunner*. In the Baptist tradition, this *John is the Immerser*. Perfectly understandable as the Greek word, '*baptismos*' means to *immerse*. According to Luke's Gospel, John & Jesus are cousins. Great minds & kindred spirits think alike. This pair, JB & JC, pulled no punches in decrying the Pharisees' blatant hypocrisy. Despite outward appearances of piety, the Pharisees are described by both as a '*brood of vipers*.' JB condemned their dishonesty when they visited him, out of curiosity, at his place of work, the River Jordan, in Matthew (3:7) & Luke (3:7). JC later called them on their deceitful malice in Matthew 12: 34 & 23:33. Such rebuke earned both the undying enmity of these influential religious leaders. These cousins fought the law and the law won.

Jesus in Matthew's Gospel (Mt 11) describes John as a prophet "Elijah who is to come," a precursor. This is a direct reference to Malachi 3. The word *Malachi*, translated as 'messenger of God,' is assigned as a name to the minor prophet Malachi. His book is the last of the Old Testament canon. This prophecy is repeated in the message that the angel Gabriel delivered to John's dad, the priest Zechariah (Luke 1:17 onwards). After the birth of his son, Zechariah offered his own prophecy (Luke 1: 68 onward) that "*you child, (John) will be called the prophet of the most High for you will go before the face of the Lord to prepare His ways.*" Z's pronouncement forms the '*Benedictus*,' the prayer that anchors Lauds, the prayer session at dawn of the Liturgy of the Hours.

The Gospels of Mark & Matthew introduce John as the fulfillment of prophecy from the books of Isaiah & Exodus as "*the one (messenger) sent ahead, the voice crying out in the wilderness.*" John proclaims a cleansing baptism of forgiveness but knows "*another will come after me who will baptize not with water but with the Holy Spirit.*" JB embodied the changing emphasis from fiery retribution for sin to the good news of God's merciful love. Other than those allusions in the OT, John the Baptist felt no need to resort to quoting biblical precedents like the self-righteous Pharisees might muster.

The evangelist Luke notes that there was a firm moral stance to JB's preaching. JB knew his place as the herald of the change from the Old Testament. His whole life was in service to the message he proclaimed. The time is at hand to amend one's ways in preparation for Who is coming. Luke, in his "Acts of the Apostles," provides the perfect epitaph for a guy who came to do his job. JB did what was asked of him well. Luke notes that two of JB's disciples, Andrew and likely John, ultimately followed Jesus.

The evangelist/Apostle John describes JB (Jn 1:6-8) as "*a man sent from God who was not the light but came as witness to testify to the light so that everyone might believe.*" Later in this first chapter the priests ask the question: "*who is this guy?*" Their confused surprise is humorously obvious. They clearly do not know him. JB tries to help (Jn 1:26). To explain his actions, JB testifies, "*you do not recognize the one who is coming after me.*" JB surely knew his cousin, Jesus, but might not have initially recognized the adult Jesus as *the Chosen One*. JB was a witness to what he heard, the voice of God, at that moment. He witnessed the descent of the Holy Spirit at the Baptism of Jesus. "*This is My Beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased.*" The imprisoned JB on death's row later sent his emissaries to Jesus to ask "*Are You the One coming after?*" His question was not a waver in his faith. This was likely JB's '*final test*.' He died a true martyr never recanting his testimony.

"Who is *this* guy?" JB was constantly courageous in his faith. He recognized his calling and understood his mission. He is for us a source of inspiration on humility. His task was not about himself. He was not the main attraction, the central act, or the prominent focus. He stepped up to perform his assignment and then quickly slipped back into the shadows. Mission accomplished! His words on this matter define his situation. "*He must increase and I must decrease*" (Jn 3:30). Do we have the same awareness of our role? JB had the courage to speak out against what he knew was not right. Do you have such fortitude? Your own experience may reveal that one is often slammed for speaking the truth to an audience who chooses not to listen. Perhaps the veracity of what is said is too much for them and their narrative. In the end, God's truth and goodness always prevail.

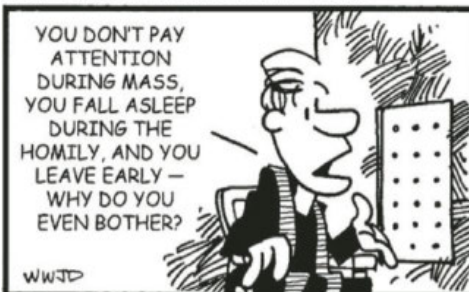

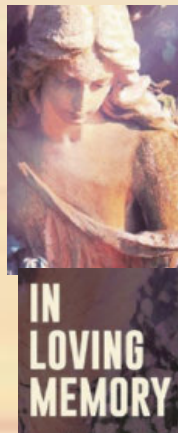
