From Our Pastor

Dear sisters & brothers,

Advent Begins with a Wake-Up Call. St. Paul tells us: “It is now the hour for you to awake from sleep.” Advent is not just about preparing for Christmas decorations or gifts—it is about waking up spiritually. The Church begins the liturgical year by shaking us from routine, reminding us that Christ is coming.

Isaiah offers a breathtaking prophecy: “They shall beat their swords into plowshares.”

- God’s future is one of peace, reconciliation, and justice.
- Advent is a season of hope because it points us toward this promised kingdom.
- We are invited to walk in the light of the Lord, to live as if that kingdom is already breaking into our world.

Jesus compares his coming to the days of Noah: people were eating, drinking, marrying—living ordinary lives—until the flood came.

- The point is not fear, but readiness.
- Christ’s coming will be sudden, and so we must live each day alert, faithful, and prepared.
- Advent is about cultivating watchfulness: not anxious waiting, but joyful expectation.

As we light the first candle of Advent, let us ask:

- Where do I need to wake up spiritually?
- Where can I bring peace instead of conflict?
- How can I live today as if Christ were coming tonight?

Advent is not just waiting—it is walking in the light. It is living with hope, choosing peace, and staying awake. As Isaiah says: “Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.”

So let us begin this Advent journey with open eyes, open hearts, and open hands—ready to welcome Christ who comes to us in mystery, in mercy, and in glory.

As you may or may not be aware, you can request a Mass offering at a particular Mass for one of your loved ones or friends.

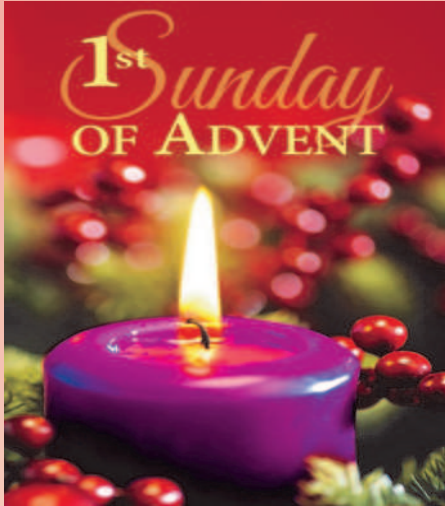
Please know, that if you would like to bring up the Offertory Gifts at that requested Mass, you can do so by advising one of the ushers before the Mass begins.

With hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel": O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

The busy holiday season is approaching and we all have much to do in a 24-hour day. We look forward to time with family and friends and creating new memories. To many of our neighbors it is a time of uncertainty for jobs, housing, food. We look around for ways to help. The parish food drive for the Catholic Charities Pantry in Park Forest is a direct path for you to help a neighbor. We serve any person residing in Cook County. We get help from Greater Chicago Food Depository and generous people like you.

Our new mobile food pantry is serving over 100 families in 5 hours every Thursday. They can come once a month and this is not meant to meet all their food needs, it is assistance, support. The cash, checks and food we collect go directly to use at the pantry, no other programs.

Religious Education for All Ages

a story we have heard before—how it all came to be

The Lectionary this Advent season sets the stage magnificently for the event that we all await. This cycle of the new Liturgical Year features the Gospel of Matthew. During this December we are treated to the heightened anticipation of *‘the greatest story ever told.’* The Gospel passage for the 1st Sunday of Advent has Jesus essentially prophesying about Himself. He urges those of us who await with anticipation His (second) Coming to be vigilant as the specific day is unknown. In Advent’s 2nd Sunday’s passage, we hear the prophecy of John the Baptist echoing the prophet Isaiah as “the voice of one in the wilderness to prepare a path” in our hearts. By the 3rd Sunday, an imprisoned JB sends emissaries to ask Jesus “Are You the one?” We have to wait until the 4th Sunday’s Gospel to finally begin Matt’s “Infancy Narrative.” This story is repeated for us on the anticipatory Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve.

There is quite the *pageantry* in this build-up wouldn’t you agree? The word ‘*pageant*’ comes to us from a Latin word that translates as “*page of a book.*” *Pageant* later evolved to mean a display of scenes. This presentation was quite often exhibited on a movable stage. We now understand ‘*pageant*’ to represent an elaborate and public dramatization that depicts a historical and traditional event. What we anticipate during Advent is, of course, our celebration of the Nativity of our Lord. The ‘infancy narratives’ in the early chapters of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke have an inherent *pageantry* about them. They are the perfect source for such dramatizations at Christmas. Luke’s Chapter 2 is the inspiration for the animated classic

“*A Charlie Brown Christmas.*” In contrast, Matt’s chronicle is the underpinning for last year’s movie “*The Best Christmas Pageant Ever.*” It was produced and directed by Dallas Jenkins who brought us the *pageantry* of Jesus’ life in “The Chosen” series. His Christmas story portrays an improbable but perhaps more realistic portrayal of the familiar holiday account. A single mom struggles to raise her brood of 6 kids. They have the sullied reputation as being the worst children in town. Considered potential ‘juvenile delinquents,’ they are likely on the express train to a life in the slammer. Attracted to the ‘treats & sweets’ of the



hospitality of Sunday School, these coarsely unrefined siblings hijack the preparations for the church’s Christmas *pageant*. To the reverent townsfolk it is appalling that these uneducated kids are so ignorant of the Gospel. Isn’t that the purpose of religious education? However irreverent they appear, these genuinely good kids bring an authenticity to their roles in Matt’s account of the birth of Jesus. Their piety cannot be denied.

Pope Benedict’s book, “*Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives,*” brings the relevance of JC’s infancy to our modern age as well. For PB the *pageantry* is caught up in contrasts. Consider the dramatic annunciations in Luke’s Gospel to Zechariah, Mary and lowly shepherds. Joseph, repeatedly described by Matt as a “just” man, receives his understated announcements from “*an angel of the Lord who appeared to him in a dream.*” Matt’s impressive genealogy through Joseph’s lineage reveals JC’s royal ancestry. Yet Jesus comes into this world in Luke’s account closer to the downtrodden “away in a manger.” Benedict illustrates what Bernard of Clairvaux noted that “*God in a certain sense made Himself dependent upon the unenforceable ‘yes’ of the virgin Mary.*” Christ chose to reveal Himself in the poverty of His humble birth in Bethlehem. The magnificence of the cosmic glory of Luke’s annunciation to common shepherds demonstrates God’s special love for the poor. Matt, on the other hand, reintroduces royalty in the adoring Magi and the murderously envious Herod. Benedict’s observations on the Christmas story are a new beginning in world history. God’s love and mercy toward us, His children, are His story of our salvation.

The 70-member Chorale, directed by Philip J. Bauman with piano accompanist Marilyn Bourgeois, will present a variety of contemporary works, traditional holiday favorites and sing-alongs suitable for all ages. Among the contemporary works on the program is an arrangement of "Ave Maria" by British composer Philip Stopford, along with an arrangement of the spiritual "Go, Tell It on the Mountain" by American Stacey V. Gibbs, and the more traditional "Nativity Carol" by English composer John Rutter.

Also included is "Christmas Joy," a three-part work by American composer Dan Forrest based on the English carol "On Christmas Night," the Polish carol "O, Come Rejoicing" and the hymn "Joy to the World." Two lesser-known but quite beautiful hymns are "Where the Light Begins," a musical setting by Susan LaBarr of a poem by American writer and artist Jan Richardson, and a new setting of the traditional English carol "What Child Is This" by American composer Gwyneth Walker.

As a regular part of the Chorale's holiday concerts, audience members will be invited to join in singing several traditional Christmas carols, closing the concert with "Silent Night."

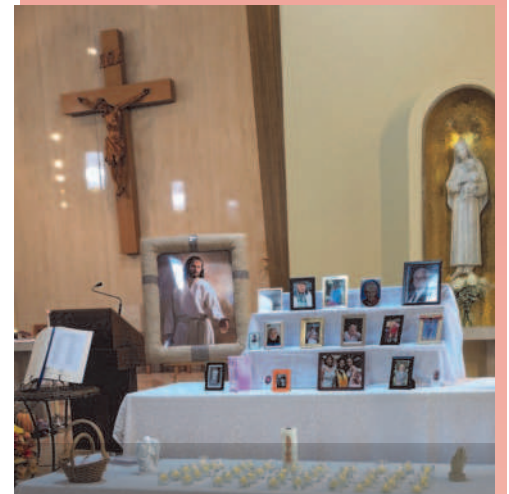
MARINE CORPS RESERVE
