Faith Formation

A SEASON OF FAITH AND PREPARATION

As we step once more into the holy season of Advent, we are invited to lift our eyes toward the horizon of faith. This faith is steady and enduring, for it rests in God's Word and His unfailing love. In these long, cold nights, when darkness seems to linger, we await the coming of Christ, the Light who shines into every corner of the world where there is pain, suffering, and despair. Advent calls us to pause, to examine our hearts, and to set aside what has not brought life, so that we may discover new ways of living with greater love, justice, and faith.

This journey of Advent is not one we make alone. It is a communal season, a time when we walk together as the People of God. We wait patiently, but we also wait actively—by preparing ourselves, by nourishing our heart, mind, body, and soul, and by rediscovering our relationship with God and with one another. Again and again, God reveals Himself to us, inviting us to grow deeper in faith and to prepare ourselves spiritually for the gift of His Son.

As we prepare our homes for Christmas—by welcoming guests, by buying and wrapping gifts, by decorating trees—we are asked a deeper question: *What gift will you bring to the Infant Jesus?* Beyond material offerings, Advent challenges us to prepare spiritual gifts: by practicing charity, by standing on the side of justice, by strengthening friendship and community, by loving our families, and by deepening our relationship with God. Christmas is not only one day; it is a way of life. Each day we are called to be better human beings, to give of ourselves, and to live faithfully.

Let us hold onto the spirit of Christmas with the wonder of children—by recalling the joy of waiting, by remembering the excitement of gifts under the tree, and by cherishing the warmth of welcoming loved ones into our homes. Advent gives us time to revisit these memories and to prepare our hearts to welcome the Newborn Savior with the same joy, laughter, and love.

This week, we also hear the voice of John the Baptist preaching in the desert:

“Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand! Prepare the way of the Lord.” (Matthew 3:1–3)

John reminds us to renew our Baptismal and Confirmation promises—by turning away from sin, by opening ourselves to grace, and by preparing the way for Jesus, who baptizes with the Holy Spirit and fire. The Spirit that filled Jesus at His baptism also fills His disciples—the Church—empowering us to live as witnesses of the new age.

The sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation form the foundation of Christian life, initiating us into a community of faith and mission. Alongside the Eucharist, they strengthen us to bear witness to Christ, even to the ends of the earth. Pope Francis reminds us:

“In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples. All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized.” (Evangeli Gaudium, 120)

This Advent, let us embrace our call to be missionary disciples—by sharing the joy of the Gospel, by bringing light into darkness, and by preparing the way of the Lord in our families, communities, and world.

In this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and strive to become better versions of ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming. We remember the journey of Mary and Joseph from Nazareth to Bethlehem, and we ask ourselves: *What has my journey toward Christmas been like so far?*

As we wait on the Lord, let us tune our voices in harmony, anticipating the miraculous celebration of His birth. May the Lord bless you in this holy season. May this Advent season bring you hope, faith, joy, peace, and love.

The 70-member Chorale, directed by Philip J. Bauman with piano accompanist Marilyn Bourgeois, will present a variety of contemporary works, traditional holiday favorites and sing-alongs suitable for all ages. Among the contemporary works on the program is an arrangement of "Ave Maria" by British composer Philip Stopford, along with an arrangement of the spiritual "Go, Tell It on the Mountain" by American Stacey V. Gibbs, and the more traditional "Nativity Carol" by English composer John Rutter.

Also included is "Christmas Joy," a three-part work by American composer Dan Forrest based on the English carol "On Christmas Night," the Polish carol "O, Come Rejoicing" and the hymn "Joy to the World." Two lesser-known but quite beautiful hymns are "Where the Light Begins," a musical setting by Susan LaBarr of a poem by American writer and artist Jan Richardson, and a new setting of the traditional English carol "What Child Is This" by American composer Gwyneth Walker.

As a regular part of the Chorale's holiday concerts, audience members will be invited to join in singing several traditional Christmas carols, closing the concert with "Silent Night."

PREPARE FOR AN OVERWHELMING IMMERSION IN A NEW WAY OF LIFE


Advent is a season of announcements to prepare us for a coming of something new and different. John the Baptist, in the opening of this passage from Matt's Gospel (Matt 3: 1-12) announces to all who will listen that *"the kingdom of God is at hand."* JB is the embodiment of what the prophet Isaiah foretold of *"the voice of one in the wilderness (calling us) to prepare the way for the Lord"* in our hearts. This part of Matt's Gospel is the tail end of the tale of JC's "Infancy Narrative." Matt's images and references in this narrative are infused with royalty and kingship. The 1st reading opens with Isaiah's prophesy that out of the line of (King) David will come a new king to restore the ancient values of a God-fearing people. These passages describe both what is to happen and how it is to unfold. This kingdom is nothing what earthly expectations predict.

JB was humbly direct about his role. *"I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."* JB's approach was straightforward. The form of his baptism, which in its original Greek means an *'immersion or complete overwhelmment,'* was more than a ritual and physical cleansing. It was a symbolic act of repentance as well. To 'repent' is to turn away from turning away from God. This *'turning away from God'* and all that we know to be right and proper is the essential definition of sin. Isn't a thorough scrubbing of our old habits a good way to ritualistically embark on a new life?

These passages in today's Lectionary announce more than a spiritual renewal. What Jesus expects for us, as he counseled Nicodemus (John 3), is to be 'born again.' We all know that Jesus eventually promises the coming of the Holy Spirit (John 14) to His Apostles. As we all know (Acts 2), the Holy Spirit descended upon them on the feast of Pentecost after Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Throughout the Old Testament, the presence of the (Holy) Spirit was a sign of an awareness of the presence of God's 'awesomeness.' This sense of awe is the Greek word that describes the reverent *'fear of the Lord.'* This presence was always a signal of empowerment. This gift of the Holy Spirit was their *'confirmation.'* Those *immersed* in the Spirit were imbued with a graceful courageousness to boldly share their faith. Doesn't this sound like the effects of the sacrament of *Confirmation* according to our catechism? Of course it does. This passage from Isaiah (11: 2-12) confirms the purpose of this pairing of Scripture. What Isaiah describes here are the *'Gifts of the Holy Spirit.'* This infusion of the Holy Spirit, a source of God's grace, always fuels transformative behavior. We cannot help but to be converted. A good measure of the effectiveness of such change is the appearance of the fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5: 22) blossoming within us.

'Baptism of the Holy Spirit' thus describes our initiation into the body of Christ in His Church. Paul explained this in 1 Cor 12: 13. Our formal incorporation into the Church initially occurs in the sacraments of Baptism & Confirmation. Sacraments are our channel to the boundless font of God's grace if we choose to partake.

JB's reference to 'fire' has a two-fold implication. The minor prophet Malachi talks of *'purifying with fire'* to refine gold from its impurities and dross. At the end of this day's Gospel, JB offers an agricultural metaphor. The good wheat is separated from the bad chaff, which is then destroyed by an unquenchable fire. This is the judgment and its consequence for unrepentant sin. Such are the sanctifying effects of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. How are you preparing for your transformation this Advent? Will you be purified by the fire of the Spirit's baptism?
