First Reading

Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7

Background on the Gospel Reading

The baptism of Jesus is attested to in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. The account that appears in Matthew is the only one to include the dialogue between Jesus and John, however. Another difference in Matthew's presentation of this event is the announcement made by the voice from heaven, which says, "This is my beloved son . . ." In Mark and Luke, this voice addresses itself to Jesus: "You are my beloved son . . ."

The baptisms that John performs prefigure Christian Baptism. John baptizes for repentance from sin. In accepting this baptism, Jesus unites himself with all sinners even though he is sinless. In Matthew's Gospel, John the Baptist distinguishes his practice of baptism from the Baptism that the Messiah brings: "I am baptizing you with water . . . He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

The baptism of Jesus is another manifestation of Christ, another epiphany. Christ's baptism inaugurates his mission. In an analogous way, our Baptism inaugurates our mission as Christians.

This Sunday marks a transition from the Christmas season to Ordinary Time. In a way, today's feast is the high point of the Christmas season. Before Jesus' birth, angels announced to Mary and to Joseph who Jesus would be. At his birth, the shepherds and the Magi recognize Jesus as the Messiah. At his baptism, Jesus accepts that he is God's son and inaugurates that mission.

IT WORKED BEFORE, WILL IT WORK AGAIN?

A remarkable feast day passed last week without much notice. Who attends Mass on Saturday that is not the vigil for Sunday? Last Saturday, January 3, marked the feast of the *Most Holy Name of Jesus* on the Church's Liturgical Calendar. What is the big deal you might ask?

'Jesus' is the Latin word for its Greek counterpart that compares to the name 'Joshua' in Hebrew. Its root means to 'rescue or deliver.' The letters 'IHS' are shorthand for the Greek name of Jesus. I am sure you recognize these letters



as a 'Christogram' that often appears as a visual symbol in Church art and vestments. This feast, while ancient in its devotion, has only recently settled into its place in early January. In Jewish tradition a son was to be presented to God & His mother purified in the Temple 40 days after His birth (Leviticus 12). On the feast of Candlemas we celebrate the *Presentation of the Lord*, formerly the 'Purification of Mary,' 40 days after Christmas on the first Sunday of February. Recall that Mary & Joe were instructed "to name Him 'Jesus' because He will save His people from their sins." These words that link Jesus with our salvation from sin appear only here in the NT. Joseph received his instructions from 'an angel of the Lord (who) appeared to him in a dream' (Mt 1:21). Joe's message included the explanation that this birth would fulfill Isaiah's prophecy that "a virgin will bear a son ... named 'Emmanuel' which means "God is with us." The angel Gabriel personally appeared to Mary with the same directive (Lk 1:31).

Jesus is often quoted in all 4 Gospels assuring His Apostles & disciples "that whatever you ask of the Father in my name will be given to you." Many of our prayers conclude with the words "through our Lord Jesus Christ." The evangelist Luke in his Acts of the Apostles, a history of the early Church after the Resurrection & Ascension of Jesus, provides several examples of the power of His Holy Name. Demons were driven out, the conversion of baptisms occurred, and numerous miracles were performed. People were receptive to the good news of His message. The numbers of those following His 'way' grew. By the end of the next 2 centuries nearly all Christians could recite the 'Jesus Prayer' as protection against evil. (***"Jesus, my Savior, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner."***) This prayer is more familiar these days only to the Eastern Orthodox.

Are you aware of the former prominence of each parish's own 'Holy Name Society?' Formally known as the 'Confraternity of the Most Holy Name' it originated after the Council of Lyons in 1274 emphasized the need for this special veneration. As the new Dominican order preached its importance, members of this confraternity to this day are dedicated '3rd Order' Dominicans. This Society is responsible for promoting reverence for Jesus' sacred name. Members are encouraged to whisper "*May He always be praised!*" whenever they hear the Lord's name blasphemed. Their standing assignment is to assist parish ministries by performing corporal & spiritual works of mercy.

A more elaborate litany to the Holy Name was formulated independently in the mid 1500s by 2 Franciscan friars, St Bernadino of Sienna & San Juan Capistrano. Their perseverance gained official approval of the devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus by papal decree. At roughly the same time the Counter-Reformation was heralded by the formation of the Jesuits, AKA the 'Society of Jesus.' Jesuits were the vanguard of the formal answer to Martin Luther's protests. This order adopted the Christogram modified with a cross as its emblem. It was at this moment that the feast of the Holy Name was instituted. It generally bounced around the Liturgical Calendar within the Octaves of Christmas or Epiphany for the next 450 years. A revision to the Roman Missal about 2 decades ago landed the celebration of this feast on 3 January. Such veneration is a more positive way to obey the 2nd Commandment to "*not take the Lord's name in vain.*"

The seat of our archdiocese is a cathedral called Holy Name. Our Arch, like its counterparts in older cities, faces the predicament of dwindling numbers: Clergy, congregations, churches, schools, ministries, this confraternity, attendance & resources are all in decline. The only rising statistic is the number of people departing. Can a revival of this group dedicated to the reverence of His Holy Name be the key to the evangelical challenge of the 21st century? Will their reinvigorated resources arrive to the rescue? Can we ask in His Holy Name to bring or return the next generation to Him?

As you may recall, over a year ago the St. John Neumann Meals-Plus Ministry (previously named the PADS ministry) took over from Catholic Charities in providing a dinner meal each Monday night at the legacy St Anne's Parish Hall in Hazel Crest. With incredible pride we are pleased to report that the Monday Night Meal (MNM) program has been an incredible success! At our peak, we serve 80 meals a week. All of this has been made possible by a team of faithful ministry volunteers and some extremely generous benefactors from the Parish and corporate community. One of our corporate sponsors, FUCHS Lubricants Company of Harvey, has provided a meal once a month for many years. This year,

our brothers and sisters-in-Christ from FUCHS began serving their meal in a sit-down format, and similarly, our Meals-Plus Ministry volunteers began serving the MNM in a sit-down style once every three months.



From an idea conceived by Deb Lynch and Sue Benigni, on December 15th, we served our latest quarterly Monday Night Meal and decided to make it a Christmas party.
