

*Isaiah 8:23-9:3*

The people in darkness have seen a great light.

#### Responsorial Psalm

Paul urges the community at Corinth to be united as people baptized in Christ's name.

#### Gospel Reading

*Matthew 4:12-23*

Jesus begins to preach in Galilee and calls his first disciples. (shorter form Matthew 4:12-17)


#### Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel describes the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke (called the Synoptic Gospels), Jesus' public ministry begins after his baptism by John the Baptist and after his retreat to the desert where he was tempted by the devil. When Jesus returns from the desert, he hears that John has been arrested.

The first part of today's Gospel places Jesus' ministry in the context of the writings of the prophet, Isaiah. Matthew wants to show that Jesus is the fulfillment of the prophecies given to the people of Israel, and he refers to Isaiah to do so. Isaiah says that the Messiah will begin his ministry in Galilee, the land of the Gentiles. When Jesus begins to preach in Galilee, Matthew points to his ministry as a fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy, proof that Jesus is the Messiah.

When Jesus called his first disciples, the Gospel tells us that the fishermen (Peter and Andrew, James and John) dropped everything to follow Jesus immediately. Yet this Gospel tells us little about the prior experience that the fishermen had of Jesus. Did they know him? Had they heard him preach? What kind of person must Jesus have been to invoke such a response? We can imagine that Jesus was a powerful presence to elicit a response as immediate and complete as these first disciples gave.

The Gospel concludes with a description of the ministry that Jesus begins in Galilee. Jesus inaugurates the Kingdom of God with his work. He teaches in the synagogue and preaches the kingdom. His ability to cure people's diseases and illness is a sign of the kingdom. In Jesus' ministry, we already begin to see the Kingdom of God among us.

## Religious Education for All Ages

### LET THE LIGHT SHINE

Earlier this week we were treated to a rare but not uncommon atmospheric phenomenon known as a ‘sundog.’ Atmospheric scientists call it a “parahelion,” which translates from its Greek roots as “alongside the sun.” Its halo is an optical trick that consists of a bright spot that flanks the sun. It results from the diffraction of sunlight by ice crystals. Extreme cold & blowing snow are the essential ingredients. Sundogs can be seen anywhere in the world during any season but are most conspicuous when the sun is near the horizon.



Francis of Assisi was not the first to praise God for such marvelous signs. His famous “*Canticle of the Sun*” gives praise & thanks to God for His Creation. “*Praise to you Lord...especially for Brother Sun who brings day and through him gives light. He is beautiful & radiant in his splendor. He bears your Likeness the best.*” King David’s Psalm 148 too praises the brightness of the *light* of the sun & shining stars. Do we realize what was God’s 1<sup>st</sup> command in the Bible? “*Then God said, ‘Let there be light.’ And there was light.*” (Gen 1:3) Creation by declaration. God spoke into the turmoil of primeval chaos and all goodness followed.

What exactly is this quality that we call *light* & why is it so significant? Think about it. The simple, literal answer is that *light* is the opposite of dark; so anything that casts illumination to dispel darkness is ‘*light*.’ Physicists describe the essential nature of *light* as ‘electromagnetic radiant energy in space that is perceived by the human eye.’ But as our Nicene Creed professes about God’s magnificent Creation, “we believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven & Earth, and all things *visible & invisible...*” We humans can perceive *light* within the visible spectrum but there are entirely invisible ranges of infrared and ultraviolet *light*. Things of nature—solids, liquids & gases—will emit radiation and heat when excited and transformed by chemical reactions. The embers from burning wood will glow and warm us with their combustion. Our sun is a massive, “nearly perfect sphere of hot plasma heated to incandescence by a nuclear fusion reaction in its core. This incandescence radiates energy from its surface mainly as visible *light* and infrared radiation.” Our sun is the ultimate source of energy for life on our earth. The *light* of the sun provides virtually all the energy for green plants to produce sugars which then release energy to the living things that digest them.

There is then the metaphysical (*meta=beyond*) aspect to *light*. Scripture is sprinkled with the illuminating appearances of the concept of ‘*light*.’ *Light* increases knowledge and dissipates ignorance. *Light* is closely associated with the presence & glory of God. The Israelites in the wilderness were guided by a pillar of fire by night, a visible representation of God’s protection. *Light* is a symbol of revelation and understanding. There should be no doubt of the illuminating power of God’s Word in guiding us through our life’s journey. Our responsorial psalm today declares, “*The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?*” Our Nicene Creed continues that we believe “*in our one Lord, Jesus Christ, begotten with the Father before all ages, God from God, light from light, true God from true God...*”

Recall that last Sunday’s Gospel reading presented John the Baptist’s testimony about God’s Word. “*What came to be through God was life. And this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*” This guy “*John was sent from God. He came...\*to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.*” A few verses beforehand (John 1:4-5), the **evangelist** describes Jesus as “*What came to be through Him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*”

This preface brings us to this week’s Lectionary. The prophet Isaiah prophesies that a great *light* will come to those living in darkness in the lands of the northern part of ancient Israel. This region of Galilee is JC’s home. The purpose of Matt quoting Isaiah is that the start of Jesus’s ministry in this area fulfills this prophecy. An equally appropriate addition to our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading from Paul’s letters is 2 Cor 4:6: “*For God, who said, ‘Let light shine out of darkness,’ has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.*” In John 8:12 Jesus states, “*I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.*” His *light* enables our *light* to shine more brilliantly. If we don’t shine, others are deprived of our *light*. 
