

Dear St. John Neumann Parish Family,

Last August, I shared news that the Archdiocese had received a more than 40-year-old allegation of sexual abuse of a minor against Father Ronald Kondziolka, who served as administrator at St. Joseph Parish in Homewood from July 2021 to June 2022. At that time, I directed Father Kondziolka to remain out of ministry while civil authorities and our Independent Review Board (IRB) completed the process of investigating the allegation. While he strenuously denied the allegation, he fully complied with my request and cooperated with the investigation.


After receiving the results of their thorough investigation, the IRB determined that there is not a reasonable cause to believe Father Kondziolka sexually abused the person making the accusation. They recommended that he be returned to ministry and that this file be closed. I have accepted their recommendations.

It is important to stress that the welfare of the children entrusted to our care is of paramount importance. For this reason, we take all allegations of sexual misconduct seriously. At the same time, we must restore the good name of anyone so accused when the allegations are found to be unsubstantiated. To that end, I publicly affirm that Father Kondziolka is a priest in good standing and express sincere appreciation for his many years of service to the People of God in the Archdiocese of Chicago. He deserves our respect and gratitude and I hope you will join me in thanking him for his long-standing dedication.

We encourage anyone who feels they have been sexually abused by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee to come forward. They will be received with dignity and compassion. Complete information about reporting sexual abuse can be found on the archdiocesan website at www.archchicago.org.

Please know that I appreciated your patience with this process. I ask that you pray for everyone involved as I continue to pray for you.

THE LESSON IN MEEKNESS

The central focus of this week's Lectionary, this 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time in Cycle A, is the lesson in Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians. "God chose the foolish to shame the wise... the weak to shame the strong...the lowly & despised—those who count for nothing—to reduce those who are something to nothing." The author of our OT reading, the prophet Zephaniah, uses the concept of 'humility' to describe them. The actual Hebrew word he uses for 'humble' conveys a sense of being poor, afflicted and meek. In Matt's Gospel



of the Sermon on the Mount, the Greek word the evangelist uses for 'meek' translates as a gentle strength. Many insist that 'meek' & 'humble' are synonymous if not interchangeable.

Meekness is the quality of being mild, humble, and gentle, and having our strength undeniably under control. It involves choosing to act with patience and humility rather than aggression or dominance. It reflects a gentle spirit even in challenging situations. Meekness, as portrayed in the Bible, involves a posture of humility, gentleness, and patient reliance on God. It is neither mere passivity nor timidity. Rather, it is the power of resolute and unquenchable inner strength. Zephaniah's word describes a person who willingly yields to God's authority. In the Psalms and other Wisdom literature, meekness is always associated with humility before God and His Word. For example, Psalm 37:11 states "*the meek will inherit the land and delight in abundant prosperity.*" Its implied meaning contrasts the secure future of those who humbly trust God with the fatuousness of the wicked who pridefully disregard Him. For example, in Numbers 12:3 Moses is characterized as "a very humble man, more so than any man on the face of the earth." Despite his leadership over Israel, Moses displays obedience and reliance on the Lord rather than self-assertion. His meekness illustrates how spiritual strength blossoms through humble submission to divine authority.

In Matt's world, his description of meekness illumines a quiet & humble disposition rooted in faith not fear. JC's promise of inheritance to the meek underscores that ultimate reward lies not in self-promotion but in steadfast trust in God. JC embodies meekness throughout His earthly ministry. He describes Himself for us to learn in MT 11:29 as "gentle and humble in heart." Far from weakness, His exemplary meekness reveals a strong divine love that stays obedient even in the face of suffering. Wasn't Jesus unafraid to be different? He was fearless in the face of controversy & confrontation. Meekness is quietly bold.

Paul identifies meekness with gentleness as a fruit of the Spirit in his letter to the Galatians (5:22). Relying on Jesus as the model, we are called to cultivate a Christ like disposition marked by patience and kindness. In Ephesians 4:22, Paul encourages us to "*be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.*" His emphasis rests on a lifestyle that respects others rather than asserting one's own needs first. In Colossians 3:12 Paul insists that we "*as the elect of God, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with hearts of compassion, kindness, humility...*"

Michael Casey, that humble Cistercian monk & teacher, is assertively blunt on this concept. "*Meekness requires great strength of character..... Meekness is the virtue by which we voluntarily relinquish our control in order to achieve a greater benefit....such as the personal growth of another.*" It takes a strongly temperate will to restrain our selfish and self-aggrandizing tendencies. We can do it if we deliberately



POPE LEO XIV PROCLAIMS FRANCISCAN JUBILEE YEAR

The special Jubilee Year of Saint Francis proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV will take place from **January 10, 2026 to January 10, 2027** to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the passing of St. Francis of Assisi.

LETTER OF THE HOLY FATHER LEO XIV TO THE MINISTERS GENERAL OF THE CONFERENCE OF THE FRANCISCAN FAMILY ON THE OCCASION OF THE OPENING OF THE EIGHTH CENTENARY OF THE DEATH OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

[Assisi, 10 January 2026]

To the Ministers General of the Conference of the Franciscan Family

“Our Sister Death”, exclaimed Saint Francis on 3 October 1226 in Porziuncola, as he went towards her as a man finally at peace. Eight centuries have passed since the death of the *Poverello* of Assisi, who wrote the word of Christ’s salvation indelibly in the hearts of the people of his time.

In commemorating the significant anniversary of the eighth centenary of his passing, I wish to join spiritually with the entire Franciscan Family and with all those who will take part in the commemorative events, hoping that the message of peace may find a profound echo in the Church and society today.

At the beginning of his evangelical life, he heard a call: “The Lord revealed to me that we should say this greeting: “May the Lord give you peace”[1]. With these essential words, he conveys to his friars and to every believer the inner wonder that the Gospel had brought into his life: peace is the sum of all God’s gifts, a gift that comes from above. What an illusion it would be to think that it can be built by human efforts alone! And yet it is an active gift, to be welcomed and lived every day[2].

It is the same greeting that, on the evening of Easter, the Risen Lord addresses to his disciples, afraid and locked in the Upper Room: “Peace be with you” [3]. It is not a formula of courtesy, but the certain proclamation of Christ’s victory over death. Like the voice of the Angels on Christmas night – “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those whom he loves” [4] – so the peace that the Seraphic Father proclaims is the peace that Christ himself made resound between heaven and earth.

In this age, marked by so many seemingly interminable wars, by internal and social divisions that create mistrust and fear, he continues to speak. Not because he offers technical solutions, but because his life points to the authentic source of peace.

The Franciscan vision of peace is not limited to the relations between human beings, but also embraces the whole of creation. Francis, who calls the sun “brother” and the moon “sister”, who recognizes in every creature a reflection of divine beauty, reminds us that peace must be extended to the entire family of Creation. This insight resonates with particular urgency in our time, when our common home is threatened and cries out under exploitation. Peace with God, peace among human beings and with creation are inseparable dimensions of a single call to universal reconciliation.

and misunderstanding,
give us the courage to build bridges
where the world raises up boundaries.
In this time afflicted by conflict and division,
intercede for us so that we may become peacemakers:
unarmed and disarming witnesses of the peace that comes from
Christ.
Amen*

With these sentiments, I express my fervent wishes for good, especially for all of you who follow the charism of the *Poverello* of Assisi and for those who will commemorate the anniversary of his *dies natalis* in various ways, while I cordially impart my desired Apostolic Blessing.
