





“NOTHING NEW UNDER THE SUN”

“A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrel of vinegar.” These words were first spoken by St Francis de Sales more than 400 years ago. They formed his approach to welcome back Catholics who had turned to the Protestantism of John Calvin in Geneva. Francis’ efforts aimed to return them with gentleness and respectful conversation. It is reported that he persuaded tens of thousands in this bastion of Protestant thought with his meek and sincere goodness. Isn’t our spiritual

journey a simple matter of aligning our life with Christ? At the end of his Gospel Matthew records the ‘Great Commission’ that Jesus gave His Apostles 2 thousand years ago. “Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.” This was and is the essence of evangelization. To become a disciple of Christ is to imitate His holiness. Francis’ special insight, presented in his *“Introduction to the Devout Life,”* noted that holiness could be achieved by ordinary people in ordinary life. The butcher, baker, candlestick maker and all regular guys can follow Christ’s way.

The Vatican Councils intended to “update” this assignment as the modern world became more secular and less inclined to be religious. Pope Paul 6 in the wake of the 2nd Vatican Council gave us instruction in his encyclical, *“On Evangelization in the Modern World.”* He explained that evangelization “brings the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeks to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself.” At its essence are the proclamation of salvation in Jesus Christ and the response of a person in faith. The Church’s mission remains forever to proclaim the “good news” of the Gospel. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) requires all of us as faithful disciples to respond to this call to witness, just like Matthew the evangelist, as testimony to this good news. What’s our 21st century takeaway?

On the 25th anniversary of the 2nd Vatican Council’s various decrees reiterating the Church’s Mission, St Pope John Paul 2 invited the Church to renew with “urgency its missionary activity.” His encyclical, *“The Mission of the Redeemer... the permanent validity of this mandate,”* focused this ‘new’ evangelization on 3 areas: (1) people who do not yet believe in Christ because they have not heard the Gospel; unaware ‘ignorance’ can only be excused once. (2) the faithful Christian community who will benefit from a rekindled faith; such ‘preaching to the choir’ ensures that no single lamb strays from the pastoral care of a good shepherd. (3) the scattered flock who have wandered away. These are those who “have lost a living sense of their faith; they no longer consider themselves members of the Church. They live a life far removed from their beliefs.” They turn away not in doctrinal defiance or difference but perhaps apathy and indifference. It is popular to claim to be spiritual but not religious. JP2 says this is misguided rationalization.

His successor, Pope Benedict 16, asked us to “propose anew” to “those who are absent from the Lord’s Table.” These are JP 2’s category 3. They are “those whose roots are deep in our faith but who have experienced a serious crisis of faith due to the seductions of secularization.” Then there are the disinvented. It is supreme folly—if not stupidity—to discourage our devoted friends whose talents & resources are needed in these parlous times. Why allow anyone to depart for a more friendly parish environment? Shouldn’t all parish communities be friendly? Fervent faithful have been turned away because they do not embody ‘modern sensibilities.’ Or perhaps they are judged to misunderstand the ‘modern’ interpretation of God’s message. For B 16, pastoral care should focus on encouraging “all who seek a profoundly personal experience of God.” The Church’s mission has not wavered but confronts this new cultural challenge, this pervasive “abandonment of faith.”

B 16 envisioned that the remedy might lie in V2's decree, "Light for all Nations," that proclaimed a "universal call to holiness." in the midst of the Protestant Reformation Francis de Sales anticipated V2's conclusion 400 years earlier. It is our 'vocation' to be holy.


JP 2's apostolic letter for the new millennium told us that such "holiness is not an end state but a task." St Josemaria Escriva, founder of the lay order 'Work of God,' emphasized that the response to this UCH is simply lay people living an everyday life doing ordinary work. "There is something holy, something divine, hidden in the most ordinary situations, and it is up to each of you to discover it." Sounds like St Therese of the Little Flower following her 'Little Way' don't you think? Our recessional hymn by Jim Harrington sings "Take the Love of God when you go, take the seed of His Word and make it grow. Go in peace to serve the world.... Take the love of God when you go."

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

FEAST DAY: FEBRUARY 11

On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous. This was the first of 18 visits, many of them with 20,000 people present. When Bernadette asked the Lady's identity, she replied, “I am the Immaculate Conception.” Just four years earlier, the pope had proclaimed it a dogma that Mary was conceived immaculate without original sin. The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart. Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also instructed Bernadette to tell the priests that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held.


On February 25, 1858, the Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. Bernadette began to dig, and after several attempts she was able to find the water to drink. The water continued to flow from where she had dug with her hands until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day—as it still does. There have been over 5,000 cures recorded but less than 100 of them have been declared miraculous by the Church. Most of these have taken place during the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.

Today we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. We may never travel to Lourdes and join in the processions, but we can know always that we have a Mother to help us and lead us to her Son, Jesus. And so we pray to her:

Grant us, O merciful God, protection in our weakness, that we, who keep the Memorial of the Immaculate Mother of God, may, with the help of her intercession, rise up from our iniquities.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever.
