GRIEF SHARE – JOURNEY FOR GRIEF SUPPORT

The Bereavement Ministry is offering **GriefShare** - a 13 week journey to accompany people in the grief process.

A **GriefShare** group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. (See grief-share.org for full details).

At each weekly meeting, you will view a **video** featuring respected counselors, pastors, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics, plus you'll hear relatable personal stories of grief.

Followed by a **small-group discussion** to allow people time to talk, share support, and personally apply what they learned on the video.

Topics include how to manage grief-related emotions such as loneliness, anxiety, sadness, anger, and regret; how to cope with the changes in your life and relationships; and how to recognize what's normal in grief and what to do if you feel stuck or hopeless.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. No matter how long it's been, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling.

If you have experienced the death of a family member, friend, or loved one, you are invited to attend.

Monday evenings, 6:30pm–8:30pm, March 9 – June 1

SCRUTINIZE SCRUPULOUSLY

Keanu Reeves in a bit of science-fiction-time-travel was fortunate to meet the ancient Greek philosopher, Socrates. Or at least his character ‘Ted’ met ‘SO-Crātes’ in the epic “Bill & Ted’s Excellent Adventure.” Socrates is quoted by his friend Plato in his “Apologia” (Defense) of Socrates that “*an unexamined life is not worth living.*” It was Socrates’ belief that a life without introspection & self-reflection lacked value. His influence remains. Is not our culture obsessed with finding ourselves by looking inward? How can we channel self- inquiry into a better life?



We are at the time of the ‘*scrutinies*’ in this season of Lent. We have found and begun to examine the fervor of the ‘*elect*,’ those *catechumens* responding to Jesus’s summons. Jesus chose them to become His followers. They consciously chose to boldly respond with the affirmative action of their conversion. Recall that the Latin word ‘*scrutinium*’ translates as the laborious search through cast-off waste in the hope of finding precious valuables. In the secular context of our 21st century *scrutiny* is a carefully close examination. It is often a critical inquiry to search for a hidden mistake or flaw. Such moments of care occur on the 3rd, 4th & 5th Sundays of Lent. The catechumens are publicly *scrutinized* in front of the entire congregation.

This rite of these *Scrutinies* is not just for these precious *elect*. For the rest of us faithful, Lent is our opportunity to *scrupulously scrutinize* our lives for improvement. It is a time to devote ourselves “*to self-searching & repentance. We too need to uncover & heal the weaknesses and sins in our hearts. Our goal is to strengthen what is good and upright within ourselves.*”

It is expected that our self-*scrutiny* in this way would be careful and exacting. Would you consider yourself a meticulous and conscientious person? Are you employed in an occupation that requires you to be very exacting and accurate in your work? Are you extremely careful to do the precisely right, proper, or correct thing in every last detail? Such attention might make you a *scrupulous* person. Does your caution carry over to your personal conduct? Do you often hesitate to act out of fear of offending someone or doing wrong? You may have a healthy dose of the *scruples*, which can be described as a moral misgiving or pang of conscience. For the Roman statesman & philosopher, Cicero, ‘*scrupus*’ was the ‘sharp stone’ that was his metaphor for the pricking of conscience that people with moral principles suffer. Such uneasiness and anxiety are no strangers to those who are *scrupulously* careful to follow the dictates of their conscience. How different is it really from the examination of conscience that precedes your confession in that Sacrament of Healing? But does such constant self-reflection make you uncomfortable and nervous?

The Jesuit tradition offers a simple Lenten discipline. The *Daily Examen* is a reflective prayer process developed by St Ignatius of Loyola. Its focus is to review the day to recognize God’s presence in our life. It encourages us to express our gratitude for the multitude of blessings in our life. Not only the good fortune in our life is a blessing. Trials & tribulations are God’s gift to us too. They are the challenges that test our mettle. Like the purifying fire that removes impurities from metal, such tests of our character refine and transform us. Such a daily practice enlivens the self-awareness that enables us to discern areas within ourselves for personal growth. We begin by acknowledging God’s presence in our life. We then gratefully review our day to note the moments of joy and despair; all are God’s blessed gifts to us. It is proper to review our feelings throughout the day to note how they relate to our experiences. It is important to prayerfully reflect on one significant moment whether joyful or challenging. And finally, we can set our intentions for tomorrow asking God for guidance and strength. Much like our catechumens.


This realization brings us to where we need to be. This personal insight helps us to know it is not about us! How profoundly humbling! After a lifetime of *scrutiny* St Augustine came to understand that God knows us better than we can ever know ourselves. Our focus is not knowing our self but knowing Him! His autobiographical “Confessions” are his testimony. ‘*Confess*’ means to disclose something damaging & inconvenient about oneself. In our Sacrament of Reconciliation we reveal our sins to a priest for absolution. On a deeper level, to ‘*confess*’ is to publicly acknowledge our faith. None of this can occur without an honest assessment, a *scrupulous scrutiny*, of oneself.

MEALS PLUS Hosts Luncheon Sunday, March 1



During 2025, the St. John Neumann MEALS-PLUS ministry served over two thousand dinner meals through its Monday Night Meal program at the SJN St. Ann campus. On Sunday, March 1, the MEALS PLUS team served the SJN parish a luncheon to 1) thank parishioners for their support during 2025; 2) report on past year activities; and 3) share plans for the new year. Following the 10:30 Mass, about 40 parishioners enjoyed sandwiches from Jimmy Johns, chips, fresh fruit and cookies, a meal similar to that served on Monday evenings. After Ron Schmitt offered a prayer, he gave a brief summary of the evolution from the original “PADS” team to the current “MEALS-PLUS” ministry and their expanded activities serving those in need in our community. Sue Benigni shared details about the Monday Night Meals program – a huge success in 2025 – and Peggy Childs shared opportunities that the ministry is currently exploring with Suburban Access in Homewood.

The MEALS-PLUS ministry team is comprised of about 50 volunteers. Combined, they support this ministry through active participation in a variety of ongoing projects and/or financial support, including:

- Providing a **dinner meal each Monday Night** at Sweeney Hall at St. Ann's in Hazel Crest
- Serving a **dinner monthly** to homeless residents temporarily housed by the BEDS-PLUS organization at the Aloha motel
- Making **sandwiches** for distribution to new clients of SSPADS and BEDS-PLUS
- Purchasing a **refrigerator** for the new SSPADS office in Homewood to keep food for clients
- Assembling **“laundry kits”** for BEDS-PLUS residents and for the Otto Veterans Square residents
- Assembling **Mother's Day** gift bags and **Christmas gifts** for the homeless families we serve
- Conducting **“Back-to-School”** drives for the needy children in this area, and collections for basic life necessities for the service men and women at the **Manteno Veteran's Home**
- Providing a delicious “Thanksgiving-type” meal and fellowship for residents of the **Manteno Veterans' Home** in January, teaming up with the East Hazel Crest American Legion Post
- Supporting **Suburban Access with funds to help** them to provide Thanksgiving turkeys to 1000 needy families
- Volunteering at the **Catholic Charities Mobile Food Pantry/Truck** in Park Forest


