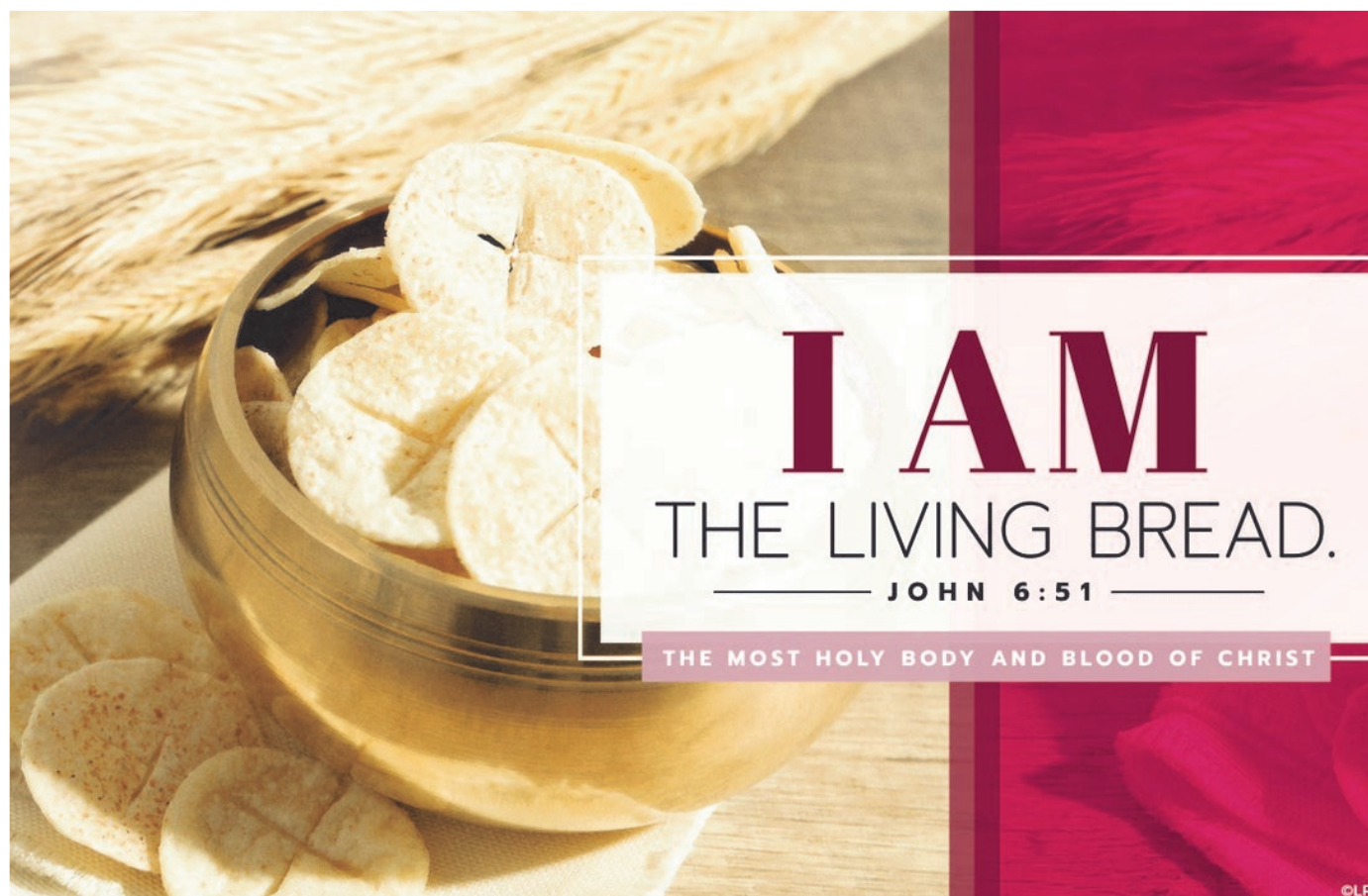

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

June 7, 2026

Background on the Gospel Reading

This Sunday we celebrate a second solemnity during this period of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called *Corpus Christi*, which is Latin for "Body of Christ." In the revised Lectionary the name for this day is expanded to reflect more completely our Eucharistic theology.

Today's Gospel is taken from the Gospel according to John. The reading is part of a discourse between Jesus and a crowd of Jews. The discourse comes shortly after the miracle of Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and fishes. In John's Gospel, miracles such as this are identified as "signs" through which people come to believe that Jesus is the Son of God. These signs are followed by dialogue, or discourse that interprets and explains the miracle. In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves is said to have occurred near Passover, thus linking it to the Exodus story and God's saving action toward the Israelites.

Having seen Jesus multiply the loaves and fishes, the crowd pursues him, perhaps seeking more food but also looking for another sign. Jesus tells the crowd that he is the bread of life. He explains that just as God gave the Israelites manna to sustain them in the desert, so now God has sent new manna that will give eternal life. It is in this context that Jesus repeats those words in today's Gospel and tells them again that he is the living bread that came down from heaven.

Jesus' words are not well understood by the crowd; they argue that Jesus is not from heaven but born of Mary and Joseph. The crowd also has trouble understanding how Jesus could give them his flesh to eat. Jesus tells them that when they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will remain forever connected to him. These are difficult words, but they are important because they seek to show us our intimate connection with Jesus.

This is the mystery that is at the heart of our Eucharistic theology. In the elements of bread and wine, Jesus' Body and Blood are truly present. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's Body in the world.

WHAT FOLLOWS

The Lectionary for this weekend's feast of Corpus Christi incorporates a wonderful but uncommon feature. *Following* the responsorial Psalm and the 2nd reading from St Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians is a peculiar form of music. Its proper name is 'Sequence,' which comes to us from the Latin word *sequentia* that translates as 'following.' Prior to the Council of Trent, which was the public response as Counter to the Protestant Reformation, most liturgical feasts had a *sequence*. The revisions to the Roman Missal for our Roman Rite of Mass after that council reduced the number to four. There is an Easter *sequence*, "*Victimae Paschali Laudes*," that is more likely to be familiar to us as an energetic hymn that proclaims "Christ our Lord is risen today, Alleluia." On Pentecost, just 2 weeks ago, "*veni sancte spiritus*" (*Come Holy Spirit*) was sung. Today's Sequence is "*Lauda Sion Salvatore*" (*Praise Zion Salvation*). The final prescribed Sequence, "*Dies Irae*" (*Day of Wrath*), was the woeful dirge chanted as the parting gesture in the funeral rite; this requiem sung in Latin with serious organ accompaniment would bring tears to all mourners in the funeral cortege. And probably the corpse of our dearly departed brother as well. In 1970 *following* the suppression of the Latin Mass, this *Dies Irae Sequence* was moved to the Liturgy of Hours before the season of Advent. The Liturgy of the Hours are the prayers said at various times of the day by ordained priests, deacons and other religious people.

In 1728 the hymn "*Stabat Mater*" was restored to this list for the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15. This is the incipit for the hymn we traditionally chant at the Stations of the Cross: "*at the Cross her station keeping, stood the mournful mother weeping.*" The current (3rd) edition of the Roman Missal recently adopted in 2010 decrees that "*Sequence*" is optional for all these feasts except Easter & Pentecost.

God's hand in every aspect of this feast has the imprint of Dominican St Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church. Tom pitched this solemnity to Pope Urban IV to focus solely on joy of the Eucharist as the precious Body & Blood of Christ. Tom allegedly suggested to the pontiff about 1264 to investigate the '*Miracle of Bolseno*.' This is a small town in central Italy close to the places where both Tom and the pope were living. Local tradition claims that at the consecration of the Eucharist blood appeared on the corporal, the square altar linen. The celebrant of the Mass was a Czech priest who supposedly doubted the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Tom persuaded the pope to investigate this miracle. Urban then established this feast throughout the entire church.

Today's *Sequence* illustrates their collaboration on this matter. Urban directed Tom to compose this chanted *sequence* specifically for this new feast. This hymn sings of the institution of the sacrament of the Eucharist. It clearly expresses our belief in the doctrine of Transubstantiation. We believe that the ordinary bread and wine are consecrated and transformed into the true body and blood of Christ. The 6th stanza testifies that "*this solemnity records the origin of the glorious Eucharist.*" Tom incorporated similar concepts and almost identical music into the hymn, *Pange lingua....* (*Speak my tongue of the Glorious Mystery of the Body & Blood of our Savior*). While he specifically wrote this prayer for the Divine Office/Liturgy of the Hours for this feast, it is also sung on Holy Thursday at the Mass of the Last Supper of the Lord commemorating the institution of the Eucharist. In remembrance of its origins, this song, so similar to today's *Sequence*, is chanted during Holy Thursday's procession from church to where the Blessed Sacrament resides until Good Friday. The final two stanzas of this hymn, separately known as "*Tantum Ergo*," are sung during Adoration & Benediction of the Eucharist as well.

When you're on a roll it is best to maintain your momentum. Tom also participated in the formation of the Dominican Missal. This Missal, unique to the Dominican religious order, preserves another *Sequence* that is permissible for the 3rd Mass at Christmas and the feasts of Epiphany and Candlemas.

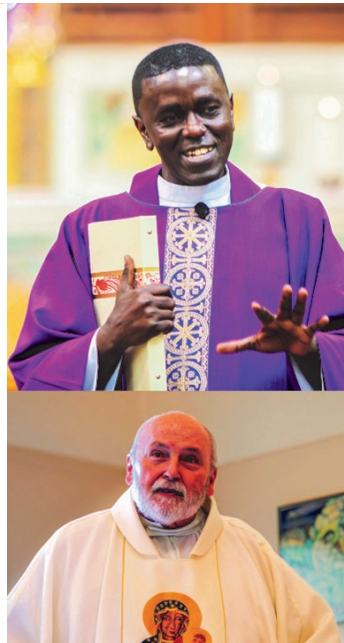

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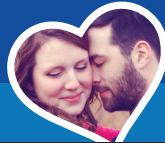
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
