

THE CATHOLIC FAITH. ON DEMAND.

The SJBD FORMED Team will present two new course offerings starting in September. Registration forms may be picked up and returned to the SJBD Parish Office lobby.

- 1. Lectio Salvation: New Life In Christ: At every Sunday Mass, Catholics confess that Jesus came down from heaven "for us men and for our salvation." But what does "salvation" mean? In this remarkable video series, Scripture scholar and theologian Dr. Michael Patrick Barber provides a thorough, deeply Catholic, and deeply biblical, answer. This video study program is both inspiring and engaging. These presentations are being offered at SJBD on Friday mornings, 9:00-10:30 am starting September 15, cost \$9 for course materials.
- 2. Eternal Rest: The Art of Dying Well and Grieving With Great Hope. We all have very real questions about death. What happens when we die? What does Scripture teach about death? How do we prepare for the life to come? Explore the mystery of death, dying, and everlasting life through Eternal Rest. Eternal Rest examines the origin of death, the afterlife, and the powerful reality around the sacrament that ushers us into eternal life. Eternal Rest presents the Catholic Church's teaching about death and God's response to it with wisdom and truth, gentleness and compassion, so we can think about and prepare for death in the light of Jesus Christ, the Author of life. We pray that through Eternal Rest, God may give you greater peace, solace, and perspective. Grieving With Great Hope is a series that is prayerful, practical, and personal. It has helped thousands of people who are grieving the loss of a loved one. The title comes from 1 Thessalonians 4:13, in which St. Paul tells the Thessalonians, "Let us not grieve as others who have no hope." And though faith can give us a confident expectation that this is not our home, it does not prevent grief and suffering in this life. Jesus said many times, "Take up your cross and follow me." This series teaches that grief is a natural reaction to loss, and mourning is our intentional response. Mourning is what we do with the pain we feel. This video series will introduce The Seven Intentions of Mourning, each having its own unique purpose in helping to heal our wounds when someone we love dies. These presentations are being offered at SJBD on Monday evenings, 7:00-8:30 pm, starting September 18. Cost \$18 for course materials.
