From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear SJBD parishioners,

The letter below was written by the Key Parish Leaders (KPLs) of St. John the Beloved Parish. These leaders were chosen by Fr. Rich Coerver to help him shepherd the All Things New process.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of SJBD,

It has been over a month since Fr. Coerver moved to St. Clement of Rome and Fr. Shaughnessy officially became our Pastor and Fr. Ruzicka, our Associate Pastor. As part of the All Things New strategic planning process, we were named our Key Parish Leaders (KPLs): Cullen Brokaw, Gary Dierks, Peggy Haberberger, Cathleen & Rich Horst, and Gary Pryzgoda. We believe we have been blessed by the work of the Holy Spirit as St. John the Beloved Disciple remained open as a parish. The KPL team has remained positive through this 2 ½ year process and has looked to the opportunities that are bestowed upon the St. John's community as a part of this new parish structure. Unfortunately, there had been a gap in communication as to the process leading up to the August 1st change. To alleviate that consternation, the St. John's KPL team wanted to provide some background of how we got to where we are today.

Keep in mind, the Archdiocese has not provided a guide or directions on how to do this. These are uncharted waters for both parishes, and for Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka, and the team in place at St. Joseph, several of whom now have roles at St. John. The Archdiocese said, "just go do it." Our goal is to show the Archdiocese how it

should be done.

March - May: In March, we received preliminary information from the Archdiocese that St. John's would become a Pastorate of St. Joe's. (Note that the term "Pastorate" was dropped around the time the formal announcements were made on Pentecost.) This meant that St. John would remain its own parish with its own identity and each parish would retain its own councils and organizations. Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka have fully supported this from the beginning. At that point, the KPL teams from both parishes including all three priests began meeting unofficially to 1) get to know the other parish's KPL team; 2) to understand each parish, and what is/can be offered to parishioners by the parish and 3) how we can help each other. Both parishes' KPL teams were excited about the new opportunities in front of us as Catholics in Imperial. We knew through these discussions that we would jell with St. Joe's and vice versa. Both teams agreed it was the best outcome for both parishes.

May – July: On Pentecost Sunday the announcement became official: Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka would also be appointed to SJBD. However, there was one kink in the chain that we did not expect and that was that Fr. Rich would be moving to St. Clement of Rome. To complicate the situation even more, Lisa Reilmann, our Parish Administrative Assistant, planned to retire. Both were effective August 1. It was even more critical that we get the teams together and develop a plan. The KPLs started meeting every two weeks. It was more crucial for St. John's to have a plan, so the KPL team created a spreadsheet that had a timeline of items that needed to be addressed immediately, 3 months out, 6 months out, shortterm goals and long-term goals. It was an incredibly detailed list. Conversations were had as to the best way of managing both parishes. After several meetings and brainstorming and more meetings, a plan was developed. We looked at the immediate needs first. By the time August 1 rolled around, there were communications between the parishes and their various organizations with our parish's organizations. The main items that were critical to address were the Eucharist (Mass times, religious emergencies, funerals, etc.); communications (bul-

letins, Constant Contact, phones) and the business side of running St. John's.

August: Some changes did take place out of necessity. Since the parish finances are a pressure point for some parishioners, we want to be clear that accounts have remained separate; the Finance Committee has stayed intact and will remain separate, there will be no commingling of funds. However, from a business standpoint, the processes need to be consistent with Archdiocesan mandates and work continues in that regard.

Mass Schedules: Prior to Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka, it was discussed that we do not have enough in attendance to justify having 3 masses on the weekend. With the possibility of people shopping parishes from other parts of Jefferson County, we did not want to eliminate any Masses with the potential of welcoming new parishioners. Therefore, Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka decided to just push back the start time of the Masses by a half hour, keeping all 3.

As for as the changes in the vestibule at the Church, these were discussed with the Worship Team. We want to make it a warm and inviting place to worship and to not only greet our current parishioners, but also welcome potential new parishioners, family, friends, and anyone else looking for a new home. Attendance must increase. It is IMPERATIVE that we invite any past parishioners, friends, and family members who have fallen away from the church and anyone else who may be interested in joining our parish family. While we remain open at this point, the hard work is not over. We cannot sit back and coast. It is truly vital to continue working to build our parish community.

As you can surmise, the KPL team has spent a lot of time and effort over the course of 2 ½ years attending meetings, focus groups, working through processes, etc., all for the betterment of St. John's. We have a wonderful opportunity to grow and continue to be a viable source for our community.

We know that the Holy Spirit is guiding us. We ask that everyone in our Parish be respectful of our brothers and sisters, be positive and pray that we listen to the Holy Spirit and follow his plan.

On behalf of Msgr. Mikesch and Fr. Ruzicka, I want to thank the KPLs for their tireless service to the SJBD parish community. As *All Things New* is now in the implementation phase, the leadership councils in the parish have assumed the role of lay parish leadership and the role of the KPLs has come to a conclusion. Please know that I asked the KPLs to write a letter to explain their parish involvement over the last two years under Fr. Coerver's leadership. And I thank them for that.

Moving forward now, Fr. Ruzicka and I are working with all the various councils at SJBD. Currently, we are reassessing the Mass schedules. In the letter above from the KPLs, they noted: "Prior to Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka, it was discussed that we do not have enough in attendance to justify having 3 masses on the weekend. With the possibility of people shopping parishes from other parts of Jefferson County, we did not want to eliminate any Masses with the potential of welcoming new parishioners. Therefore, Fr. Shaughnessy and Fr. Ruzicka decided to just push back the start time of the masses by a half hour, keeping all 3 masses." Please note that we are taking a second look at this. The capacity of the church easily holds the attendance at the 2 Sunday morning Masses. In the coming weeks, we will be communicating my thoughts on this as we move forward.

Football Boosters Underway

Our most important fundraiser annually is our SJBD Football Boosters. They are now available for you to take, purchase, and even



better, sell to others. The tickets are now available in the Parish Office and after the weekend Masses in the church lobby.

Cost is \$25/ticket—the same as last year. There will be 18 weeks of drawings and nine winners will split \$1,000 per week. In 2022 we sold 1,952 Boosters and are hoping for 2,500 this year. As we all work together and with the assistance of our football partners, we can do this. So far, 1,373 tickets have been sold for a total of \$34,325.


