From the Desk of Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

It's been about 7 weeks since I was officially named pastor of this parish, along with Fr. Ruzicka as associate pastor and Msgr. Mikesch as senior priest in residence. Have things gone perfectly? No, they haven't but I think that all of us are trying really hard. There is no playbook for how to do this. We are figuring it out as we go along.

There are sentiments amongst some of you in the parish that I feel are important for me to address in a bulletin letter. I do not know how wide-reaching these feelings are but I often operate by an adage that says, "Name it. Claim it. Tame it." So that's what I am choosing to do this week with this correspondence.

Collections should be noted in this week's bulletin. You're right. They should be. Why am I mentioning that? Because collections had not been reported in the St. John Parish bulletin on account of the fact that the Shared Accounting department at the Archdiocese has dropped the ball on the St. John account in the transition, after Fr. Rich and Lisa moved on. The accounting team for both St. John and St. Joseph is in the process of streamlining the reporting for St. John. Julie Hepp, the accountant for both St. John and St. Joseph, is in the process of taking over day-to-day management of accounting at St. John. Carol DuBuque, on-site at St. John, is coordinating daily with Julie. This has largely been a big failure of Shared Accounting at the Rigali Center. I apologize for this but it has been beyond my control.

You will see that collections have dropped. Some of you have suggested that's because folks at St. John don't trust the new team or the priests now in charge. I hope this is not true but if it is, I honestly don't know what to say. I have never been accused of being dishonest in my life. I guess you need to get to know me. In addition, some St. John parishioners noted that there may have been an intention on my part (to hide this information from St. John the Beloved). I'm not sure what motivation I would have for doing this? I can tell you that while this is complete madness, it needs to be addressed and publicly named, to make sure no one believes this could possibly be true.

With regard to both Finance Council and Parish Coun-

cil, it is important to remember that these councils are *consultative* bodies. They are not governing bodies. The councils serve so as to offer both advice and counsel to the pastor but in the end, the final decision-maker is the pastor. Some of you might find this surprising or not the norm but that's the way Canon Law works. As the pastor, I will always be someone who deeply and genuinely seeks the input of the People of God but it's important to understand the role of various parish councils.

To follow up, you don't know me very well yet, but I can assure you that everything at St. John the Beloved is being handled with the utmost integrity and the utmost professionalism. I have been told by many of you (and I understand) that there were some finance issues with a previous pastor and a previous administrative person in the office. But that was in the past. That is not "the now" of St. John the Beloved.

Again, I assure you. You have nothing to worry about. Some of you have also voiced that you feel like St. Joseph is staging a hostile corporate takeover of St. John the Beloved. I can understand how you may feel this way as St. Joseph is a large parish and St. John is very small. I apologize if this is the perception but we are doing our very best to *prevent* feelings like these. Fr. Ruzicka and I have been running back and forth sometimes as many as 4 times/day. Again, we are doing our best. But we can always improve, all of us.


In closing, negativity, gossip, and presumption of malintent against Fr. Ruzicka and me and the St. John/St. Joseph team will destroy the parish and that's the last thing anyone would want to do, I hope. I have been accused by some of being overly positive and not dwelling in reality. Know that I have always and will always lead positively and with a spirit of gratitude.

There is no other way that I am capable of leading. The picnic two weeks ago was awesome. Why don't we live in the joy of that wonderful weekend, as a template for the future of the St. John the Beloved parish community?


