From the Desk *of* Fr. Dan Shaughnessy, Pastor

Dear Parishioners:

I asked our Communications Director, Kathy Larson, to put together an explanation of how you can expect communications from the parish to work. We've learned thus far that the parishioners of St. John the Beloved Disciple Parish naturally have a set of expectations based on "how things have always been" and it is up to us to align those expectations with the best practices we at St. Joseph Parish have worked diligently to develop over the last several years. It is our responsibility to manage parishioner expectations at BOTH parishes within a manageable framework.

From Kathy:

Starting even before the August 1 implementation of this new parish structure, we were becoming acquainted with the ways SJBD was communicating. I'll address each method.

Bulletin: We have widely-publicized that submissions for the bulletin may be sent to bulletin@ sjiparish.org. We wish to receive submissions directly from the person who is in charge of the event or ministry. This serves two valuable purposes: it allows us direct access back to the person who can answer questions we may have, and it allows us to manage our efforts by sorting and filing the emails. If you don't use email, the information may be given to Carol DuBuque in the office during business hours. Because the office is not open on Fridays or Mondays, and because the bulletin must be submitted on Tuesdays, the deadline for bulletin submissions is Thursday at noon.

Calendar: The parish calendar is located on the website at https://saintjohnimperial.org/parish-calendar. Meetings and events are posted on the calendar, and will be in the bulletin if they are submitted. If you wish to schedule a meeting, please contact the office

so we can be sure that the meeting space is available.

Parish website and Facebook: Thanks are extended to Gary Dierks who has "carried the torch" on many of these communications efforts. We're transitioning responsibilities over to employees and will be working to better utilize these resources, in conjunction with other sources. Please note in particular that Facebook will never be used as a primary means of communicating with parishioners; the bulletin and website will be primary.


Constant Contact: This is a tool to reach parishioners primarily with information that hasn't been communicated elsewhere especially if it is emergent in nature. As such, the Pastor and staff are generally the ones authorized to initiate correspondence sent via CC.

One general comment: the St. Joseph staff is "toeing the line" on a nearly-hourly basis to understand how information is best shared. On the one hand, SJP has many programs and events that may be of interest to SJBD parishioners, but on the flip side, there are concerns that SJP is being heavy-handed. In good faith, SJP staff is working for the benefit of SJBD and we appreciate people's patience and understanding that there is no effort to suppress. At the same time, we must implement policies and practices that allow us to succeed with increased workloads.

As Kathy has said, this is an ongoing effort and I assure you that everyone is doing their best.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

October 1, 2023: 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life. Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They—like us—intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't them. They are us. And Jesus wants all of us working in his boat, no matter the rocking.


