

He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, the old order has passed away."


The one who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." Then he said, "Write these words down, for they are trustworthy and true."

STRATEGIC PASTORAL PLANNING PROCESS GOALS

- 1. <u>Unceasing Prayer.</u> Engage all individual Catholics to reflect upon the need for Jesus Christ in their daily lives and call upon the Holy Spirit to guide our actions to fully share the love of the Lord in every encounter.
- 2. <u>Unifying Vision.</u> Articulate and implement a vision for evangelization that empowers and expects every baptized Catholic to spread the Gospel message and ensures a Catholic presence in every square mile of the Archdiocese of St. Louis through missionary outreach, parish and school footprint, and dynamic leadership.
- 3. <u>Intentional Stewardship.</u> Define and develop a plan that will appropriately reallocate resources throughout the Archdiocese of St. Louis that will be supported by structures at the diocesan, parish, school, and agency levels to ensure long-term viability and vibrancy of the Catholic presence.







- Prepared for January 25 launch
















THE DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX

- 75-question survey instrument, available online & paper, in 18 languages
- Developed in 2014 with bishops, pastors, pastoral ministers, and thought leaders
- Opportunity for parishioners to reflect on:
 - 1. Individual spiritual growth
 - 2. Engagement with the parish



NEARLY 300,000 RESPONSES 40 DIOCESES | 1500+ PARISHES


Demographics

- 67% women and 33% men
- 79% between the ages of 36 and 75
- 64% have been members of their parish for more than 10 years
- 90% of respondents report going to Mass at least weekly

Beliefs, Effectiveness, and Drivers for Big Outcomes



Key Drivers

Questions that are statistically significant with respect to a parishioner's likelihood to recommend the parish, say the parish is helping them grow spiritually, and frequency with which they are sharing their faith

Questions related to parishioners' degree of belief in core teachings of the faith

Effectiveness of Parish Support

Questions related to how well the parish supports parishioners personally and spiritually

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Key Parish Leaders

- 1. Publicize and support the *All Things New* planning initiative
- 2. Inform, validate and/or refine the informational snapshot of their parish
- 3. Participate in consultation sessions within their local planning areas
- 4. Observe and summarize key discussion points at parish consultation sessions

Primary Points of Contact

- 1. Receive information and details related to *All Things New* including instructions, schedules, and communication to be shared.
- 2. Share relevant information with the pastor, parish staff, parish leadership (e.g. councils, key ministries) and key parish leaders
- 3. Provide requested information to the Archdiocese of St. Louis and Archdiocesan Pastoral Council with respect to parish facts or feedback summaries.


Add a new PPOC











- 1. How long does it take a parishioner to complete the DMI? Typically 10-15 minutes.
- 2. Do all parishes have to do the DMI? Yes. The survey will be open to all parishioners throughout the archdiocese and include all parishes.
- 3. Will each parish receive an individualized report? Yes, and access to an online platform to review and dig into the data deeper.
- 4. What's the average response rate?
 15-20% of Mass-going Catholics in your parish.



- 5. What is the cost to the parish?
 Only your effort and publicity to your people!
- 6. What if we did a survey recently?
 This will support the archdiocesan effort and can augment other feedback.
- 7. Can I change or add a Key Parish Leader or their contact information? Yes! This can be done in the CLI Portal on or after February 3, 2022.
- 8. Can we add questions to the survey?

 No, we don't want to extend the length and also want to make sure that we can provide helpful benchmarks.

- 9. Should we mail the survey out?

 No, the best way to promote is electronically and paper surveys are best used in conjunction with a ministry meeting, parish gathering.
- 10. There's a pandemic going on, is now really the best time?

 It's even more important to be engaging our people in a multitude of ways to keep them engaged in the faith and the parish.
- 11. Who has access to this information?

 The Archdiocese, Pastor, Primary Point of Contact, Key Parish Leaders, and CLI. CLI will not share your information with any party without expressed written permission.

13.ls the survey anonymous?

Yes – the DMI does not collect any personal information.

14. Why aren't there spaces to write comments on the DMI?

The purpose is to take a snapshot of the faith community.

15. What happens after the DMI is complete?

Pastors and Key Parish Leaders will attend a webinar to learn about how to interpret the results and provide feedback to the *All Things New* Core Team about their community.
